## RAMS AIM FOR THIRD-STRAIGHT WIN

The St. Louis Rams go for their third-consecutive victory and their fourth-straight at home as they host the NFC West-leading Arizona Cardinals on Thursday Night Football. St. Louis is hosting a Thursday Night game for a third-consecutive season. They defeated Arizona on Thursday Night Football in Week 5 of the 2012 campaign.

The Rams are coming off a pair of dominating performances in which they've out scored their opponents 76-0 over the last two weeks. St. Louis has won three of its last four games, and the Rams are +8 in turnover ratio during that time frame. Last week, Tavon Austin delivered a spark on special teams as he returned a punt 78 yards for a touchdown in the win over Washington.

## 2014 RAMS EXPECTED STARTERS

## **OFFENSE**

- **WR Kenny Britt** Caught two passes for 52 yards last week to give him 30 receptions for 542 yards and three touchdowns on the year. Signed with the Rams as a free agent this offseason after spending five seasons with Tennessee.
- **LT Greg Robinson** Second overall pick in 2014 NFL Draft made sixth career start at left tackle last week. Started at left guard Weeks 6-8 before moving outside. First-Team All-SEC and Second-Team All-American in final season with SEC Champion Auburn.
- **LG** Rodger Saffold Fifth-year pro started at left guard for 10th time this season and has three starts at right guard. Has started at four different positions in 57 career starts 36 at LT, 10 at LG, 7 at RG and 4 at RT.
- **C** Scott Wells Made 132nd career start in win over Washington. Former Pro Bowler started first 12 games 2013 season before suffering a leg injury in Week 13 at San Francisco.
- **RG** Davin Joseph Has started at right guard 10 times this season. Two-time Pro Bowler has 109 career starts, all at right guard. Ninth-year pro signed with St. Louis this summer after eight seasons in Tampa Bay.
- **RT** Joe Barksdale Recorded 28th career start in win over Redskins. Started 13 games at RT in 2013, his second season in St. Louis. Started two games at LT in 2012. Former third-round pick of Oakland was claimed off waivers in 2012.
- **TE Jared Cook** Leads team with 41 rec. and is second among Rams with 534 yards on the season. Led Rams with 51 rec. for 671 yards and five TD receptions last season.
- **TE** Lance Kendricks Fourth-year pro has 23 receptions for 197 yards and 4 TDs on the year. Caught a TD pass in three-consecutive weeks (6-8) earlier this season. Had 32 receptions for 248 yards and four TDs in 2013 while recording 13 starts.
- **WR Tavon Austin** Returned a punt 78 yards for a touchdown and had 46 rushing yards to go along with two catches last week. Has scored twice on rushes this season and has gained 190 yards on the ground (6.3 yards per carry) while catching 26 passes.
- **QB** Shaun Hill Passed for 213 yards and two touchdowns in win over Washington. Has started 32 career games, including five this season. Veteran has passed for 7,276 yards with 47 touchdowns and 26 interceptions in 13 NFL seasons.
- **RB** Tre Mason Has rushed for 100 yards in each of last two home games. Has four total touchdowns. Rookie third-round pick has gained 628 yards on 142 attempts on the season (4.4 average). Was a 2013 Heisman Trophy finalist for national runner-up Auburn.

## **KEY CONTRIBUTORS**

- **RB Benny Cunningham** Has rushed for 233 yards on 59 carries and has 33 receptions on the season. Set up a Rams TD with a 75-yard kickoff return in win over Seattle and caught 18-yard pass on a fake field goal. Gained 261 yards on 47 rushes (5.6 average) as a rookie.
- **TE Cory Harkey** Bruising tight end/fullback scored his first touchdown of the season on a four-yard catch vs. Oakland. Leads the way in Rams running game and helped team gain 172 yards on the ground in win over Oakland.
- **WR Stedman Bailey** Caught two passes for 47 yards in win over Washington. Had first 100-yard game of career in Week 13 victory over Raiders. Has 20 receptions for 275 yards on the season.
- **RB** Zac Stacy Has rushed for 284 yards on 72 carries this season. Also has 15 catches. Finished second among all NFL rookies with 973 yards last season, the third-highest total for a rookie in team history.

## **DEFENSE**

- **LDE** Chris Long Has played in two games since returning from 10-game absence. Recorded first sack of the season in win over Oakland. Seventh-year veteran is longest-tenured Ram. Has 51.5 career sacks.
- **LDT** Aaron Donald Leads all NFL rookies in sacks with 7.0 after recording one his fourth-straight game last week. Has 21 QB pressures & 10 QB hits to go along with 16 tackles for loss. Second of team's two 2014 first-round picks. Outland Trophy winner and unanimous First-Team All-American as college senior.
- **RDT Michael Brockers** Helped limit Washington to just 27 rushing yards. Posted a season-high eight tackles in win over Oakland. Has started all 13 games and has 44 tackles on the season.
- **RDE** Robert Quinn Leads Rams with 10.5 sacks this season after recording 1.5 last week. Has 27 QB pressures. Named to the Pro Bowl and First-Team All-Pro after setting a new Rams record with 19.0 sacks last season.
- **LLB** Alec Ogletree Made seven tackles last week to give him 134 on the season. Has two forced fumbles and two interceptions on the year. Led Rams with 155 tackles in 2013, most by a rookie in team history.
- **MLB** James Laurinaitis Recorded 1.5 sacks and six tackles last week. Tied for team lead with 134 stop on the season, most among Rams. Has 3.5 sacks and eight QB pressures. Has recorded 100 tackles in all six of his NFL seasons.
- **RLB Jo-Lonn Dunbar** Has 49 total tackles while starting 10 games this season. Recorded 54 tackles in 12 games in 2013.
- **LCB E.J. Gaines** Only NFL rookie cornerback to start all of their team's games this season. Recorded second interception in win over Raiders. Leads Rams with 13 pass breakups. Sixth-round pick recorded five interceptions and was First-Team All-SEC as a senior at Missouri in 2013
- **RCB** Janoris Jenkins Returned an interception 99 yards for a touchdown in Week 12 to give him 5 INT/TDs on his career, tied for most in Rams history. Missed Weeks 9-10 due to knee injury. Led team with 18 pass breakups in 2013.
- **S5 T.J. McDonald** Caught first interception of the season last week. Third among Rams with 104 tackles on the season. Tallied a career-high 17 tackles vs. Philadelphia. Blocked a punt and field goal in win over Tampa. In 2013, posted 56 tackles, one sack, one interception and three passes defensed as a rookie.
- **FS** Rodney McLeod Tallied second interception of the season in win over Washington. Recovered a fumble and recorded two tackles vs. Raiders. Has started 29 straight games. Finished third among Rams defenders with 87 tackles in 2013.

### **KEY CONTRIBUTORS**

- **S** Mark Barron Third-year pro joined Rams prior to Week 9 via trade. Former seventh-overall selection by Tampa Bay has played in six games with St. Louis and has 17 tackles and 2.0 sacks.
- **DE** Eugene Sims Notched third sack of the season last week. Has 40 tackles and 20 QB pressures on the season. Had a sack in Week 9 win at San Francisco and recovered a fumble.

## A DEFENSE ON THE RISE

Last week, St. Louis became the first NF team in five years to post shutouts in back to back games. You have to go back to 1945 to find the last time in franchise history it happened.

The dominant performance has lifted the Rams in league rankings. St. Louis is now 11th in total yards this season (344.9 per game), 10th in run defense (104.8), 9th in third down defense (37.8) and 14th in points per game. With 23 takeaways, including seven over the last two weeks, St. Louis is tied for sixth in the NFL.

The Rams have been even more impressive

over the last eight weeks. They're 16.9 points per game is fourth best in the NFL over that time frame. They're fifth in third down defense (34.3 percent), and no team has recorded more sacks than St. Louis over the last eight weeks (34).


The pass rush surge has the Rams tied for seventh in the NFL in sacks after posting just one in their first five games. The run defense has complemented the pass defense as well. St. Louis has allowed 28 or fewer rushing yards in three of their last five games, including 27 last week in Washington and just 28 in the team's first matchup with Arizona.

## **RUSHING ROBERT**

Prior to the Rams' Week 7 win over Seattle, DE Robert Quinn used the analogy that it only takes a snowflake to start an avalanche, referring to his hopes that the Rams would get their pass rush going one sack at a time.

Quinn recorded his first sack of the season that week, and he added five in the three weeks that followed.

Last week, he posted 1.5 sacks to give him 10.5 on the year. He had 3.0 sacks in the team's win over Oakland two weeks ago.



Last Sunday was Quinn's 11th multi-sack game of his career. He has five games with 3.0 sacks, and since the start of the 2013 season, his four games with 3.0 sacks or more are the most in the NFL over that time period.

Quinn has developed a knack for getting the ball out of the opponents' hands. He forced a fumble last week and has three in the last two weeks. Since the start of last season, he's forced 12 fumbles, which gives him the most forced fumbles in the NFL over the last two seasons.

Quinn has developed into one of the NFL's top defenders. Along with his 10.5 sacks, coaches have credited the 2012 first-round pick with 27 QB pressures and 23 QB hits through 13 games. He's also tallied 14 tackles for loss.

Quinn is building off his breakout season of 2013 that saw him post one of the best seasons by a Rams defender in team history. Quinn's 19.0 sacks were second best in the NFL a year ago, just a half sack off of league leader Robert Mathis (19.5). Quinn also finished second to Mathis in forced fumbles, as Quinn had seven to Mathis' eight.

His 19.0 sacks set a new franchise record, topping Kevin Carter's 17.0 in 1999. Quinn had at least one sack in 11 of 16 games this season, and he had five multi-sack games, including three contests in which he recorded 3.0 sacks.




## **LUCKY NUMBER 13**

DT Aaron Donald is making a strong ca for NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

Last week, Donald recorded his seventh sack of the season and he leads all NFL rookies in the category. He's had a sack in each of the team's last four games.

Donald also has a team-high 16 tackles for loss on the season and coaches have credited him with 21 QB pressures and 10 QB hits.

His 7.0 sacks ranks fourth amongst all NFL defensive tackles.



with the 13th pick in May's draft. As a senior in 2013, Donald received a host of honors. In addition to being named First-Team All-American and First-Team All-ACC, Donald was the Chuck Bednarik Award and Bronco Nagurski Awards, both of which honor the national defensive player of the year in college football.

Donald also won the Outland Trophy, which goes to college football's top interior lineman, and the Lombardi Award, which recognizes the country's top player among college defensive linemen and linebackers.

According to StatsPass.com, Donald is tied for third in the the NFL in with nine "stuffs," which is classified as tackles for loss on run plays, in addition to leading all NFL rookies in sacks.

## **SACK ATTACK**

The Rams boast one of the NFL's top pass rushes, and their ability to get to the quarterback has been a key reason they've won three of their last four games.

Last week, St. Louis recorded seven sacks of Washington guarterbacks. That performance came on the heels of a six-sack afternoon against Oakland. The pressure has helped the Rams collect seven turnovers the last two weeks as well.

Since Jeff Fisher took over in 2012, the Rams have recorded 140 sacks as a team. That's the second most in the NFL over DE Eugene Sims that time period, trailing Buffalo by just one sack.



## ONE HILL OF A GUY

Since rejoining the starting lineup four weeks ago, Rams QB Shaun Hill has posted a 3-1 record and guided the team to 76 points in the last two weeks.

In the team's win over Washington last week, Hill completed 16-of-22 passes for 213 yards and two touchdowns with no interceptions. Two weeks ago against Oakland, he tossed two scoring strikes and rushed for another score while leading the Rams on seven scoring drives, including each of their first six possessions. The Rams have committed zero turnovers the last two weeks.

This week against Arizona, Hill is scheduled to make his 32nd start of his NFL career. He entered the league as an undrafted rookie free agent with the Minnesota Vikings in 2002 and made stops in San Francisco and Detroit before signing with the Rams as a free agent last offseason.

Hill originally signed to back up Sam Bradford, but when the Rams' starting signal caller suffered a season-ending knee injury during the preseason, Hill moved to the top of the depth chart. In the Rams' season opener, Hill suffered a guad strain that sidelined him, and in his absence, Austin Davis performed well enough to retain the job.

Prior to Week 11, Rams Head Coach Jeff Fisher decided to return to his crafty veteran, and the moved paid off with a win over the Broncos.

Hill's career numbers include 7,276 passing yards with a 62.0 completion percentage. He's thrown 47 touchdown passes with 26 interceptions.

## WAR RAM EAGLE

Greg Robinson, the second overall pick in May's draft, has settled into his role as the team's starting left tackle.

Last week, the Rams rushed for 131 yards as a team. Robinson played a big part in the team's success on the ground and he didn't allow a sack in the 24-0 victory. According to StatsPass.com, Robinson has not given up a sack in the last two weeks.

Robinson started at left guard in Weeks 6-8, but following a season-ending injury to Jake Long, the Auburn product moved outside and inherited the posi-



tion at which he was drafted to secure for the long term.

Robinson made his first NFL start in Week 6 against San Francisco and coaches gave him positive reviews after lining up against 49ers Pro Bowl DT Justin Smith throughout the evening. The Rams averaged nearly four yards per carry in Robinson's first start.

Last fall, Auburn literally ran its way to an SEC championship and appearance in the national title game. As a team, the Tigers averaged an NCAAbest 328.3 yards per game on the ground.

Robinson and Auburn/Rams teammate Tre Mason were at the heart of that attack. In 14 games last season, coaches credited Robinson with 130 "knockdown" blocks, an average of more than nine per game as Auburn sparred with some of the best defenses in the country. Robinson was named First-Team All-SEC and was a Second-Team All-American by the Associated Press.



### BIG CATCH BRITT

The Rams didn't make a ton of moves in veteran free agency this spring, but did add one player who's provided some big plays at the wide receiver position.

Kenny Britt leads the Rams with 490 receiving yards this season. In the team's win over Denver in Week 11, he enjoyed his best game as a Ram as he caught four passes for 128 yards, including a 63-yard touchdown that put St. Louis up 10-0 in the first quarter.

The Denver game marked Britt's eighth 100yard game of his career and first as a Ram. Twice this season, Britt has provided the Rams lone touchdown in Rams victories.



Britt has caught 30 passes for 542 yards and three touchdowns this season. He's tied for second among Rams in receptions in addition to leading the team in receiving yardage.

For his career, Britt has averaged 15.9 yards per reception. He's at 17.7 this season as seven of his 27 catches have gone for 25 or more yards.

Britt's sixth NFL season is his first in St. Louis. He spent his first five professional campaigns with the Tennessee Titans, where he played three seasons under Rams Head Coach Jeff Fisher.

In addition to what he's brought on the field, Britt's veteran presence has been a welcomed one to the young receiver group. His experience is evident as his career totals are significantly higher than the other three members of the team's receiving group.

## WAR RAM EAGLE

RB Tre Mason appears to be getting better as his rookie season moves along.

Mason made his fifth-consecutive start last week and rushed for 66 yards to give him 628 on the season. Despite not playing the first four games, Mason ranks second among all NFL rookies in rushing vards this season.

Mason has been at his best at home this season. Two weeks ago, he scored three touchdowns, including an 89-vard run that is the second-longest in team history. The win over Oakland marked

Mason's second 100-yard game of his career, and the Rams are 2-0 when he reaches the century mark. One of his scores vs. the Raiders came on a 35-yard reception.

Mason gained 113 yards on 29 carries in the team's win over Denver in Week 11. Making the performance more impressive is the fact that Denver enter the game as the NFL's top-ranked run defense.

Mason was a third-round pick last May. As a junior at Auburn, he was the SEC's leading rusher and finished fifth in the nation with 1.816 rushing yards. Mason was the SEC Offensive Player of the Year, was named First-Team All-SEC and was a finalist for the Heisman Trophy.

## TAVON AWESOME

Whether it's throwing it to him, handing it to him, or forcing the opponent to punt it to him, the Rams find ways to get the ball in the hands of Tavon Austin.

Last week, Austin returned a punt 78 yards for a touchdown in the team's victory at Washington. He had 143 total punt return yards, most by an NFL player in a game this season. In addition to his touchdown return, Austin also had returns of 37 and 28 yards.

Austin rushed for 46 yards on five carries last week. In the two games prior to Washington, he scored rushing touchdowns in both of them.

On the season, Austin's 11.1 punt return average is fifth best in the NFL. On offense, he's rushed 30 times for 190 yards and two scores and caught 26 passes for 200 yards.

Austin finished his first NFL campaign with 40 catches in 13 games and scored six total touchdowns - four receiving, one rushing and one via punt return.

Last year, Austin became the first player in NFL history with a 95-yard punt return for touchdown, 80-yard touchdown reception and 65-yard rushing score in the same season.

## A GOOD START

The Rams have been among the NFL's best out of the gates this season.

They've scored on their first possession of the game in each of their last three home games, all victories.

In the team's win over Oakland two weeks ago, the defense forced a punt following the opening kickoff, and the Rams drove 59 yards for a touchdown, marking the fifth time this season that St. Louis has reached the end zone on its first offensive possession.



In more than half of their games this Offensive Coordinator Brian Schottenheimer season (6), the Rams have scored on their first offensive possession. They're tied for the NFL lead with five touchdowns on their first drives of the first quarter.

The Rams' 38 points on opening drives are tied for third most in the NFL this season.




## WHAT'S COOK-IN

After Rams TE Jared Cook absorbed a big hit early in Sunday's win at Washington, it appeared St. Louis might have to play the majority of the game without their leading receiver.

Fortunately for Cook and the Rams, he was able to bounce back in a big way. After he was medically cleared, Cook caught two touchdown passes in the team's 24-0 win over the Redskins.

With 41 receptions on the season, Cook leads the Rams in the category. His 534 receiving yards rank second to Kenny Britt, trailing him by just eight yards for the team high.

In Week 3, Cook caught seven passes for 75 yards, which tied his highest single-game receptions total since joining the Rams. He led the Rams with 74 yards in the team's Week 7 win over Seattle.

In his first year in St. Louis, Cook set a new record for most receiving yards in a season by a Rams tight end. Cook led the Rams in both receptions (51) and receiving yards (671) in 2013. Teammate Lance Kendricks set the previous mark for St. Louis tight ends last year with 519 yards. Cook bested that number and then topped the all-time franchise record held by Mike Barber (657 in 1983).

In his Rams debut last year, Cook caught seven passes for 141 yards and two touchdowns in the team's Week 1 win. His 141 yards are the most by a tight end in a single game in franchise history. Cook broke a record previously held by Pete Holohan, who had 126 yards on Dec. 11, 1988.



## 'THE MOUNTAINEER'

Rams WR Stedman Bailey has steadily improved throughout his second NFL season, and his play has sparked the St. Louis offense. He has 22 receptions for 322 yards and a touchdown on the year.

He had his best performance of his two-year career in Week 12 in San Diego. Then he topped it a week later in the team's win over Oakland.

A week after setting a career high with 89 yards against the Chargers, Bailey tallied 100 yards versus the Raiders to set a new career mark. All five of his catches came in the first WR Stedman Bailey quarter.



Throughout his career, Bailey has been a key special teams contributor. One of his catches against San Diego came on a fake punt. He gained 19 yards and kept a crucial drive alive, one that he capped with a seven-yard touchdown catch.

Earlier this season, he was part of another trick special teams play that helped St. Louis to a victory. Prior to the Rams' Week 7 win over Seattle, Bailey had never fielded a punt in a football game at any level - high school, college or the NFL.

In the second guarter of the team's Week 7 win, Rams PR Tavon Austin pretended to track a punt down the left sideline while the Rams coverage team raced towards Austin in attempt to set up a return.

In actuality, Seattle had punted the ball to the St. Louis right. Bailey fielded the punt over his shoulder, turned and raced 90 yards for a touchdown. The play was the longest punt return in the NFL this season and is tied for the third longest in Rams history.

## BEST IN CLASS



For teams in need of impact pass rushers, the 2011 NFL Draft was certainly the place to find one.

In the top 16 picks, there were seven "front seven" players selected. Six of those players have at least 30 sacks, including Robert Quinn.

With the 14th pick, the Rams were fortunate to snag Quinn, who boasts 45.0 career sacks. Quinn came off the board after Von Miller (48.0 sacks), J.J. Watt (51) and Aldon Smith (44), and each player has made a name for himself.

Quinn has certainly stood out among

his peers. He's ninth in the NFL in the category this year and he led the NFC with 19.0 sacks in 2013. Since coming into the NFL in 2011, Quinn is sixth in sacks. Since the start of the 2012 season, only Watt has more sacks than Quinn.

## MAN IN THE MIDDLE

If you want to find Rams MLB James Laurinaitis on the football field, one can often simply follow the ball because the fifth-year pro seems to always be around it.

Laurinaitis posted six tackles last week to give him 134 on the season. He's now reached the 100-tackle mark in each of his six NFL campaigns.

He also had 1.5 sacks in the team's win over Washington to give him 3.5 this season, and he broke up a pass. As the defensive signal caller, he's literally been in the middle of the team's success in posting consecutive shutouts on defense.

Laurinaitis has been durable throughout his career. He's started 93 straight games, the third-longest active streak among NFL linebackers. Because of his ability to play the run and pass, he rarely leaves the field.

Since 2009, only three linebackers - DeAndre Levy, Paul Posluszny and Sean Lee - have more interceptions than Laurinaitis' nine. Also since 2009, the year the Rams made Laurinaitis a second-round pick, he's the only player in the NFL with 15 or more sacks and nine or more interceptions.

Laurinaitis now has 867 career tackles, and he's closing in on Hall of Famer Merlin Olsen, the franchise's all-time leading tackler.

## LONG ON TALENT

Rams DE Chris Long made a triumphant return to the lineup two weeks ago and has made his presence felt in the team's back-to-back shutout victories.

Last week, he had a tackle for loss and helped limit Washington to just 27 rushing yards. Coaches credited Long with six tackles, including two for loss, as well as two QB pressures, a sack and a fumble recovery in the team's 52-0 win over Oakland. It was Long's first game back after missing 10 weeks due to an ankle injury.



Long, a seven-year veteran, is the longest tenured Ram and is a leader both on and

off the field. His sack vs. the Raiders gave him 51.5 for his career.

When he missed Week 2 of this season due to an injury that landed him on "Reserve-Injured, Designated to Return,' he'd played in 97-consecutive games. While he recovered from his recent injury, Long was a constant in the locker room and on the sideline encouraging his teammates.

Long finished the 2013 season with 8.5 sacks, 39 QB pressures and 20 QB hits. Coaches credited him with seven tackles for loss on the year as well.

In a Week 10 win over the Colts, Long scored his first career touchdown when he recovered an Andrew Luck fumble and returned it 45 yards. The fumble was forced by Robert Quinn, who forced the loose ball Long recovered against the Raiders two weeks ago.

## RETURN TO SENDER

Rams CB Janoris Jenkins has a knack for finding the end zone. In fact, no defender in football has found it more since Jenkins entered the NFL.

Three weeks ago, Jenkins intercepted a Philip Rivers pass and returned it 99 yards for a touchdown. It was the fifth time Jenkins has returned a pick for a score during his career, which ties him for the most such plays in Rams history.



Jenkins has 51 tackles this season and also saved a touchdown in San CB Janoris Jenkins Diego by forcing a Keenan Allen fumble.

Ed Meador (1959-70) and LeRoy Irvin (1980-89) each had five career interception returns for touchdowns. In just three seasons, Jenkins has already equaled Irvin and Meador in interceptions returned for touchdowns. He has seven total interceptions for his career.

As a rookie, Jenkins recovered a fumble in the end zone in an overtime win over San Francisco. That gives Jenkins six total defensive touchdowns during his two plus seasons in the NFL, which is the most defensive scores by any player during that time frame.

In 2012, Jenkins turned in one of the best seasons by a rookie corner in NFL history. With three interceptions returned for touchdowns in 2012, Jenkins tied the NFL rookie record in the category. He shares the mark with Hall of Famers Ronnie Lott and Lem Barney.

## **BULLDOG 'BACKER**

As a rookie, Alec Ogletree led the Rams in tackles and provided St. Louis with a playmaking presence as he led the team with 155 tackles.

"Tree" has filled up the stat sheet in 2014 as well. He posted seven tackles against Washington to give him 134 on the season, tied with James Laurinaitis for most among Rams.

Ogletree also has two interceptions this season. He has nine career forced fumbles, which is second only to Robert Quinn for the most among all NFL defenders since the start of last season.



Ogletree stepped into the Rams' starting LB Alec Ogletree lineup from the get go as a rookie and he's started all 29 games of his professional career. In addition to leading the Rams in tackles, he had six forced fumbles as a rookie, third most in the NFL.

## **McSAFETIES**

Rams Head Coach Jeff Fisher has recently lauded the play of his starting safeties, and he's done so for good reason.

In last week's win over Washington, both Rodney McLeod and T.J. McDonald recorded interceptions to stop drives deep in Rams territory. The pick was McLeod's second and McDonald's first of the season.

McLeod and McDonald have become quite a pair. They've started all 13 games this season and neither leaves the field.

Through 13 games, McDonald is third among Rams with 104 tackles, marking the first time in his career he's reached the century mark. He's been on the field for every Rams defensive snap this season and has a sack and six passes defensed on the year.

McDonald blocked both a punt and a field goal in the team's win in Tampa Bay in Week 2. As a team, the Rams hadn't blocked a punt and field goal in the same game since December of 1979. His Week 2 pair were the first blocks of McDonald's career.

McDonald is a former All-American who was drafted in the third round in 2013. McLeod took the longer road to NFL success. He was an undrafted free agent in 2012 and led the Rams in special teams tackles as a rookie. He made his way to the starting lineup last season and has started 29 consecutive games. McLeod has 77 tackles and six passes defensed as well as two forced fumbles this season.



## **POSITIVE GAINES**

CB E.J. Gaines might very well turn out to be one of the steals of the 2014 Draft.

The Rams kept Gaines in his home state when they selected him in the sixth round. Gaines started each of his first 13 NFL games. He's the only rookie cornerback in the NFL to start all of his team's games this season.

In the team's last home game, Gaines recorded his second interception of the season and broke up two passes. He leads the team with 13 pass breakups and he's been on the field for 97 percent of the Rams' defensive snaps this season.

In Week 5, while defending fellow Mizzou Tiger Jeremy Maclin on a deep ball, Gaines came away with his first career interception. He also recovered a fumble earlier in that game.

While he's spent most of his time playing on the perimeter this season, an injury forced Gaines to the nickel position the last three weeks, where he's turned in three strong performances.

Gaines has 82 total tackles on the season. He was a First-Team All-SEC performer at Missouri in 2013 after intercepting five passes, second most in the conference. He previously earned First-Team All-Big XII honors as a sophomore before Mizzou moved conferences.

## WILL THE THRILL

DE William Hayes has provided St. Louis with a "super sub" throughout his three seasons with the team. When his good friend Chris Long suffered an ankle injury that landed him on Reserve - Injured (Designated to Return) earlier this year, Hayes became a super starter.

Hayes started nine games this season in the absence of Long. The last two weeks, Long got the starting nod in his return, but Hayes still made significant contributions in the St. Louis victory.

He's recorded a sack in each of the last two weeks to give him 4.0 on the year. In the Rams' win over Oakland, he forced a fumble and was credited with two tackles for loss and three quarterback pressures in addition to his sack...

Hayes leads the team with 35 quarterback pressures on the year. In the team's Week 9 win over San Francisco, Hayes recorded 2.0 sacks. It was his fourth career multi-sack game.

In 43 games with the Rams, Hayes has 16.0 sacks and 62 pressures.

After posting a career high 7.0 sacks in 2012, Hayes was a free agent but chose to stay put in St. Louis. He began his career with the Tennessee Titans and joined Head Coach Jeff Fisher in St. Louis in 2012 shortly after Fisher took the Rams job.

## **RED LIGHT IN THE RED ZONE**

In three of the last four weeks, the Rams haven't been able to show their merit as one of the NFL's top red zone defenses. That's because in wins over Denver, Oakland and Washington, each of the three teams failed to reach the St. Louis 20 yard line on offense.

However, in Week 12, the Chargers made two trips to the St. Louis defensive red zone. They were forced to settle for a field goal on their first and CB Janoris Jenkins intercepted Philip Rivers and returned the ball 99 yards for a touchdown on the second.

St. Louis had two key stops deep in their defensive end of the field in their Week 9 victory that proved crucial in the team's win over San Francisco, including a goal line stand in the final minutes that saw Laurinaitis recover a Colin Kaepernick fumble to preserve the victory.

On the season, opponents have scored touchdowns on 46.7 percent of their trips inside the Rams' defensive red zone. That number is the second best in the NFC and fifth in the NFL.




## **PUSH 'EM BACK**

The Rams have been among the NFL's best at creating negative plays on defense this season.

St. Louis has tallied 92 total negative plays, which is tied for seventh most in the NFL. The Rams have stopped defending ball carriers for a loss on 52 run plays, which is tied for the fifth most in that category in the league this season.

In addition to their 35 sacks, the Rams have tackled pass catchers for loss on nine plays to give them 44 total negative pass plays on defense.

Last week, St. Louis sacked Washington quarterbacks seven times while limited the Redskins to just 27 rushing yards as a team. Arizona had 28 total yards on the ground when St. Louis visited University of Phoenix Stadium earlier this season.

The Rams are led by rookie DT Aaron Donald, who has 16 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks this season. Pro Bowl DE Robert Quinn has 14 tackles for loss to go along with his 10.5 sacks this season.

## TALES OF THE TURNOVER

The formula for winning in the NFI can often boil down to one simple stat: turnover ratio.

Last week in Washington, the Rams didn't commit a turnover on offense. It was the fourth time St. Louis has accomplished that feat this season, and the Rams are 4-0 when they do

Defensively, the Rams have been among the NFL's best at taking the ball away, particularly in recent weeks. They've forced 11 turnovers in their last four games, which is nearly half of their season total of 23.

The Rams are +4 in turnover margin this season, which is tied for 10th in the NFL. They're +7 over the last two weeks and +8 over the last four.

With 23 total takeaways this season, St. Louis is tied for sixth in the category. They've recorded 12 interceptions, led by CB Trumaine Johnson's three, and have recovered 11 opponent fumbles.

## **BROCKERS BRINGING**

DT Michael Brockers continues to hold down the middle of the Rams defense.

Last week, the Rams allowed Washington to gain just 27 yards on the ground, and Brocker's physical presence in the middle of the line always plays a factor in the team's run defense. When the Rams faced the Cardinals in Week 10, Arizona rushed for just 28 yards against St. Louis, and San Francisco was held to the same total in Week 9.

Brockers has 44 tackles in 13 games on the year. In 2013, he led all Rams defen- DT Michael Brockers sive linemen with 75 tackles.



Brockers is one of four Rams defensive linemen who joined the team as a first-round draft pick. He was an All-Rookie selection by the Pro Football Writers of America in 2012.

In 42 career games, Brockers has 11.5 sacks, which ranks among the best in comparison with the defensive linemen drafted in the first round in 2012.

## HARKEY PITCHES A GEM

Rams TE Cory Harkey is a jack of al trades for the Rams offense. He can regularly be found in the St. Louis backfield as a fullback or on the line of scrimmage as a tight end.

Last week, Harkey caught a pass on a fake PAT that gave the Rams a twopoint conversion. A week earlier against Oakland, he scored his first touchdown of the season on a four-yard pass from QB Shaun Hill. It was his third score of his career.

Nicknamed "Harkules" by his teammates as a nod to his toughness, Harkey is one of the Rams' emotional leaders. Offensive Coordinator Brian



Schottenheimer recently called Harkey one of his favorite players he's ever coached.

Harkey's performance as a blocker is key to the Rams' ability to run the ball. He showed incredible toughness in Week 2 at Tampa Bay as well. After absorbing and crushing hit from Bucs S Dashon Goldson, Harkey returned to the game just moments later and was a key part of the game winning drive. After the game, it was revealed that Harkey suffered a sprained MCL.

Harkey, who joined the Rams as an undrafted rookie free agent in 2012, is the son of former Major League pitcher Mike Harkey. His father is the pitching coach of the Arizona Diamondbacks. When the younger Harkey scored against the Saints in Week 15 of last season, he celebrated by simulating a full pitcher's windup before spiking the ball into the turf. The celebration was a nod to his father, the former Cub and Dodger right hander.

## **SIR LANCE (SCORES) A LOT**

With touchdown catches in three-consecutive weeks from Weeks 6-8, TE Lance Kendricks is tied for the team lead with four scores this season.

Kendricks' one-yard score against Kansas City in Week 8 was his 12th career touchdown catch. He's tied for fifth in franchise history among tight ends in the category.

Kendricks caught a four-yard touchdown pass rom Austin Davis with 5:36 remaining in the fourth quarter in the team's Week 7 win over Seattle. The touchdown allowed the Rams to answer after Russell

Wilson and company had pulled to within two points at 21-19. Kendricks pushed the St. Louis lead back to nine. 28-19.

The third-year tight end also scored in Week 6 when he caught a 22-yard pass from Davis. Kendricks now has 12 career touchdowns, including four this season. He's totalled 23 catches for 197 yards to go along with his four scores in 2014.

Throughout his four seasons in St. Louis, Kendricks has been a reliable target. He finished the 2012 season with 42 receptions for 519 yards and four touchdowns. His 519 receiving yards were at the time the most by a Rams tight end since the team moved to St. Louis in 1995. Teammate Jared Cook surpassed those totals in 2013.

### ON GUARD!

G Rodger Saffold has been a key cog for the Rams up front, and his versatility has been a welcomed asset. He started the first four games of the season at left guard. When rookie Greg Robinson entered the lineup in Week 6, Saffold moved to right guard.

When LT Jake Long went down with a season-ending injury in Week 8, Robinson kicked out to left tackle and Saffold moved back to left guard where his ability to pass protect and push the pile in the run game have been key to the team's success.



When the Rams drafted Saffold in the second round in 2010, he immediately became the team's left tackle and started his first 35 games there. Last season, he began the season at right tackle before moving inside. He's now entrenched at the guard position, no matter what side it is. Of his 57 career starts, 36 have come at left tackle, 10 at left guard, four at right tackle and seven at right guard.

Last week, the Rams scored four rushing touchdowns and gained 131 yards on the ground as a team. That came a week after posting a seasonbest 172 in the team's win over Oakland. Saffold's physical play is key to the Rams' success on the ground.

## BENNY'S SPECIAL EFFORT

RB Benny Cunningham has been a jack of all trades for the Rams this season.

On the season, Cunningham has 233 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. He's caught 33 passes - second most among Rams - for 253 yards and handles kick return duties.

In the team's win over Seattle in Week 7, Cunningham seemingly did it all. In the first quarter, he returned a kickoff 75 yards to give the Rams the ball at the Seattle 31 yard line. Six plays later, St. Louis scored its first touchdown of the day on a Tre Mason six-yard run.

Later in the game, Cunningham caught a shovel pass from Austin Davis and plowed his way forward for a five-yard touchdown. It marked the third consecutive week that Cunningham has found the end zone.

He saved the best for last. With St. Louis clinging to a two-point lead with 2:55 remaining, Cunningham slipped out of the backfield from his personal protector position in a punt formation. He caught a short pass from P Johnny Hekker and turned it upfield for an 18-yard gain. The first down allowed the Rams to run out the clock and preserve the victory.

On the season, Cunningham ranks fifth in the NFL in kickoff return average.

### **GREG THE LEG**

Rams K Greg "The Leg" Zuerlein is now 18-of-24 on field goals this season after hitting one last week.

In the team's Week 11 win over Denver, Zuerlein was a perfect 5-of-5 on field goals, his first five field goal game of his career. Two of those kicks came from beyond 50 yards as Zuerlein scored 16 of the team's 22 points. He was named NFL Special Teams Player of the Week for the effort, his third such honor of his career.

In the team's Week 9 win at San Francisco, Zuerlein connected on a pair of field goals - one from 37 yards and another from 39 in the team's win. His 39-yarder came in the fourth quarter and proved to be the difference in the 13-10 St. Louis victory.

The game winner against the 49ers marked the fifth time in three seasons that Zuerlein has made a fourth quarter/overtime kick to tie or give the Rams a lead.

With three field goals from 50 yards or longer this season, Zuerlein has 11 career makes from long distance. That places him third on the team's all-time list. He's made five of the six longest kicks in team history.

The third-year pro is also the most accurate kicker in team history when it comes to field goals as he's made 82.5 percent of his kicks (66-of-80).


Last season, Zuerlein was perfect the last seven weeks and finished 26-of-28 on field goals. As a rookie, Zuerlein made seven field goals from 50 yards or more. In a win over San Francisco, he broke the franchise record for 50+ yard field goals in a season. He also kicked the longest field goal by a rookie in league history (60 yds.) and became the first kicker in league history to make a 50-plus and 60-plus yard field goal in the same game.



## **HE'S A WINNER**

Rams Head Coach Jeff Fisher has won 162 regular season games during his 18-plus seasons as an NFL head coach.

Fisher is among the winningest head coaches of his era. Among active head coaches, Fisher is tied for second in career wins, trailing only Bill Belichick. Tom Coughlin, who's New York Giants visit St. Louis next week, also has 162 victories.

## JOHNNY ON THE SPOT

Last week, the Rams rewarded P Johnny Hekker with a new six-year contract that will keep him with the team through the 2020 season.

Hekker earned the contract by becoming one of the NFL's most dangerous special teams weapons, be it with his foot or his arm.

In 45 career games that Hekker, has recorded a net average of 45.0 yards or more on 11 different occasions. He's 5th in the NFL this season in net average (41.5).

Hekker is a former high school quarterback, And the Rams put his passing skills to use on a regular occasion. Last week, he took a snap on a PAT, stood up and tossed a strike to TE Cory Harkey for a two-point conversion.

Three weeks ago in San Diego, with the Rams down 10 in the fourth quarter, the former high school quarterback was called upon to throw on a fake from the Rams' 26 yard line. He executed to perfection and St. Louis was able to drive for a touchdown to close the gap to three points. Hekker also completed a pass on a fake punt against Seattle in a Week 7 win this season.

In three NFL seasons, Hekker is 5-of-6 passing on fakes, including a touch-down pass on a fake field goal as a rookie in 2012.

Hekker earned both Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors in 2013 after he recorded the highest single-season net average (44.2) in NFL history. His 46.3 gross average was 10th in the league and was the fourth best single-season total in Rams history.

## A SPECIAL GROUP

The Rams have benefited from one of the top special teams units in the NFL this season.

Through 13 games, St. Louis ranks 3rd in the NFL in punt return average as a team (13.2). Individually, Benny Cunningham ranks fifth in the league in kickoff return average at 28.5 yards per return and Tavon Austin is fifth in punt return average (11.1)

When the Rams aren't returning punts, they're still benefitting from the prowess of their special teams units. Opponents are yielding a net punting average of just 35.0 yards per punt this season, the lowest total in the NFL.

St. Louis has returned two punts for touchdowns this season, a 78-yard return by Austin last week and a 90-yard score by Stedman Bailey in Week 7.

The Rams' kicking game has been aided by the play of Chase Reynolds, a "four-core" player who leads the team with 16 special teams tackles on the season.

The St. Louis Rams fell to the Minnesota Vikings, 34-6, in their 43rd all-time meeting. Minnesota got on the board first on the game's opening drive on a 52-yard field goal by Blair Walsh. The Rams' defense held the Vikings scoreless through the remainder of the first quarter. Meanwhile, OB Shaun Hill completed 6 of his first 7 passes during the first quarter, including a 23-yarder to WR Brian Quick on the Rams' first offensive drive. The Rams ended that drive with a punt and had an opportunity to score points on their second drive of the day, but K Greg Zuerlein's 50-yard field goal attempt sailed left. Atop the second guarter, Walsh converted his second field goal of the day from 46 yards out. giving the Vikings a 6-0 lead over the Rams. Both teams exchanged punts for the remainder of the guarter. With 1:13 remaining in the half. Hill's pass that was intended for TE Jared Cook was intercepted at the St. Louis 19-yard line. The Vikings took advantage of the short field and found the end zone on an 8-vard pass from QB Matt Cassel to WR Greg Jennings. The four-play drive of 35 yards extended their lead to 13 points at the close of the half. Austin Davis started in place of Hill at quarterback for the second half due to an injury that Hill suffered earlier in the game. On his first NFL snap of his career. Davis completed a 10-vard pass to Cook and four plays later, he connected with Cook again for a 26-yard completion. The drive ended in a 56-yard field goal by Zuerlein. The kick tied his own record for fourth longest in team history. He previously kicked a 56-varder at Chicago during his rookie season (9/23/12). Both teams were forced to punt in the subsequent two drives. After which, the Vikings scored on a 1-play drive in which WR Cordarrelle Patterson lined up in the backfield and ran the ball 67 yards for the score. The Vikings found the end zone again with 6:35 left in the game on a 7-yard pass to TE Kyle Rudolph, which capped a 9-play drive of 70 yards. The Rams' subsequent drive ended on an interception that was returned 81 yards for a touchdown by S Harrison Smith, giving the Vikings the 34-3 lead. With 1:36 remaining, Zuerlein converted a 46-yard field goal, for the final score of the game. Amidst the loss, Quick caught a team-leading seven passes for 99 yards, setting a personal best in receptions and receiving yards. In his NFL debut, Davis completed 16 of 23 passes for 192 yards.

For the first time since 2001, the St. Louis Rams won their road opener, defeating the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, 19-17. QB Austin Davis made his first career start and completed 22 passes for 235 yards and a 99.1 guarterback rating. Davis led the Rams to their first touchdown of the season following Tampa Bay's 7-0 score in the game's opening drive. The Rams' game-tying drive featured 41 rushing yards, including an 18-yard run by WR Tayon Austin and a 2-yard scoring rush from second-year back Zac Stacy. In another game of firsts, S Rodney McLeod snagged the team's first interception of the year at the St. Louis 9-yard line. At 4:04 p.m. (CT) the game was suspended due to lighting. Following the 51-minute delay, the Rams found themselves up 10-7 with 0:39 seconds left in the half as a result of a blocked punt by S T.J. McDonald and a 36-yard field goal on the part of K Greg Zuerlein. Tampa Bay responded atop the third quarter with McCown's second rushing touchdown that stemmed from a lost fumble by Stacy, giving the Bucs a 14-10 lead. A 35-yard field goal by Zuerlein reeled the Rams closer within 1. On the first play of the fourth quarter, McDonald blocked his second kick, a 24-yard field goal try, which was returned by LB Ray Ray Armstrong 20 yards. The play translated into points, as Zuerlein made his third field goal on a 46-yard kick. The teams exchanged the lead for the fourth time of the game after a 36-yard field goal that put the Bucs back up. 17-16. Starting with 5:08 on the clock, Davis led the Rams to a game-winning drive, completing 4-of-6 passes - including a 27-yard grab by WR Austin Pettis - for 64 yards, setting up Zuerlein's 38-yard field goal. Left with 0:38, Tampa Bay opened their final series with a 19-yard completion and spiked the ball with 0:20 to stop the clock. On the final play, McCown completed a 29-yard pass to Bucs WR Mike Evans. Evans was injured on the play, and Tampa Bay had no timeouts remaining, which resulted in a 10-second runoff. There was only eight seconds on the clock at the time of the injury and left the Rams with the 19-17 win and 14-8 advantage in the series. For the second consecutive game, WR Brian Quick led the team in receptions with seven, while WR Kenny Britt recorded his first reception as a Ram. Defensively, CB E.J. Gaines recorded his first NFL sack, splitting a takedown of McCown with DE Eugene Sims. Meanwhile, DE William Hayes notched his first start as a Ram, starting in place of the injured Chris Long. With the win, Rams Head Coach Jeff Fisher has 157 regular season wins, leaving him one shy of tying Tom Coughlin of the New York Giants for second-most among active head coaches.

For the first time in 2014, the St. Louis Rams generated scoring drives on their opening two possessions. Meanwhile, the defense forced two turnovers and a Dallas punt on their first three series. The result was a 21-0 lead, the Rams' largest of the season. On the Rams' first play from scrimmage, Zac Stacy set the tone with a 12-yard run. Two plays later, undrafted rookie Trey Watts registered his first NFL carry. Watts finished the game with 24 yards, helping the Rams tab their secondconsecutive game of 100 or more rushing yards. QB Austin Davis completed 6-of-7 passes for 40 yards in that opening drive. His seventh throw resulted in his first NFL touchdown pass, a 1-yard completion to TE Lance Kendricks. The catch was also Kendricks' first touchdown of the season and ninth of his career. On third-and-4 in Dallas' ensuing drive, LB Alec Ogletree forced his first fumble of the season, which was recovered by S Cody Davis - his first career fumble recovery and returned one yard to the St. Louis 35-yard line. The Rams' second scoring drive took 10 fewer plays than their first and concluded with a 51-yard touchdown pass to WR Brian Quick, his first of the season, and was the Rams' longest offensive play of the season. Armed with a 14-0 lead, the defense got in on the action as CB Janoris Jenkins intercepted a Tony Romo pass intended for WR Dez Bryant and returned it 25 yards for his fifth career touchdown. His last interception returned for a touchdown occurred on Dec. 23, 2012. Since entering the league in 2012, Jenkins has the most defensive touchdowns in the NFL - four of which came during his rookie season. An accumulation of penalties and a lost fumble by the Rams helped Dallas score a touchdown and a 29-yard field goal following Jenkins' score. By the close of the quarter, the Rams' lead diminished to 11 points with a halftime score of 21-10. Upon returning to the field, Dallas reached the end zone on a four-play drive of 83 yards, which was highlighted by a 68-yard catch by Bryant. Dallas nailed a 40-yard field goal on their ensuing possession, bringing them within one point of the Rams. The Rams responded with a field goal of their own, a 28-yarder from K Greg Zuerlein, and extended their lead, 24-20. Dallas pushed ahead for the first time of the game on the next series. A 33-yard defensive pass interference by Jenkins put Dallas on the St. Louis 20-yard line and two plays later, Terrance Williams scored on a 12-yard grab. On the Rams' first play from scrimmage following the Dallas touchdown, Davis' pass intended for Stacy was intercepted and returned 25 yards for a touchdown. Behind by 10 points, the Rams put together an 11-play, 80-yard drive that ended in a 4-yard touchdown catch by WR Austin Pettis with 2:36 left in regulation. The defense forced a Dallas punt, giving the Rams offense 1:58 to attempt a score. Following an incomplete pass and two short tosses for 12 yards, Davis threw his second interception of the day, giving Dallas the 34-31 victory.

Despite amassing a season-high 466 total yards on offense, the Rams came up short against the Philadelphia Eagles, losing 34-28. The Eagles jumped to a 13-0 lead in the first guarter following a blocked Johnny Hekker punt, the first surrendered in his three-year career, on the first drive of the game and two field goals in Philadelphia's subsequent possessions. On the Eagles' first drive of the second quarter, LB Alec Ogletree forced his eighth career fumble and first of the season, which was recovered by rookie CB E.J. Gaines on the Philadelphia 19-vard line. Gaines showed up again on the next defensive series, intercepting Nick Foles with 10:02 remaining in the half. The play marked his first career interception and led to the Rams' first touchdown on the day, an 8-yard pass from QB Austin Davis to WR Brian Quick. Philadelphia responded at the end of the quarter with an 11-play. 80-yard scoring drive that ended in a 9-yard touchdown pass to WR Riley Cooper. On the Rams' first play of the new half, Davis was sacked at the St. Louis 5-yard line and fumbled the ball, which was recovered by Eagles DL Cedric Thornton in the end zone. With 2:15 remaining in the third quarter, the Eagles extended their lead to 34-7 following a 24-yard touchdown pass. Starting with the ball on their own 21 with 2:10 left in the third, the Rams scored 21 unanswered points. Davis completed 3-of-3 passes and added a 12-yard scramble to set up RB Benny Cunningham's 14-yard touchdown run at the end of the third quarter. A Foles fumble on the ensuing drive was recovered by DT Michael Brockers at the St. Louis 38 and led to the Davis' second touchdown pass - a 30-yarder to WR Kenny Britt, his first touchdown as a Ram. Two drives later, Davis connected with Quick for another touchdown with 4:41 left in regulation. The defense held the Eagles scoreless and forced a punt, which was downed at the St. Louis 7-yard line. On the first play from scrimmage. Davis hit Quick for a 43-yard gain. A series of three incomplete passes ended the drive and sealed the win for the Eagles.

After getting off to a fast start against their division rivals, the Rams' saw a first-guarter lead dwindle into a 31-17 loss. The offense orchestrated an 11-play, 80-yard touchdown drive off the opening kickoff while donning 1999 throwback ierseys in honor of the 15th Anniversary of St. Louis' Super Bowl XXXIV win. On the third play of the drive. QB Austin Davis connected with TE Jared Cook on a 39-yard pass play. WR Tayon Austin added two carries for 10 yards to help push the Rams to the San Francisco 49. Rookie RB Tre Mason saw action in his first NFL game while his former college teammate and Rams first-round draft pick Greg Robinson made his first career start. Mason's first career catch came on first-and-10 and went for 12 yards. Four plays later, fellow running back Benny Cunningham scored on a 1-yard rush. The touchdown was his second in as many games. Also making his first NFL start was DT Aaron Donald - the Rams' second pick of the first round. Donald led the defensive line in tackles, alongside DE Euguene Sims, with seven. On the team's second defensive series, S Rodney McLeod forced his first fumble of the season. The ball was recovered by LB James Laurinaitis at the St. Louis 17 and he returned it 17 yards to the San Francisco 45-yard line. The forced fumble was the third of McLeod's career and was respectively Laurinaitis' sixth recovery. Mason opened the ensuing drive with a 24-vard rush - the longest of the game - which was followed by a 22-vard touchdown catch by TE Lance Kendricks three plays later. Through the first quarter, Davis completed 7-of-8 passes for 103 yards in what was his fourth NFL start. The Niners got on the board on a 54-yard field goal with 7:07 remaining in the half. The score was the start of a 24-0 run by San Francisco. Before closing out the first half, 49ers QB Colin Kaepernick capped a 5-play scoring drive with an 80-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Lloyd with 0:27 remaining. Kaepernick later completed 11- and 32-vard touchdown passes to WRs Anguan Boldin and Michael Crabtree, respectively. Punts were exchanged for the majority of the fourth quarter until Greg Zuerlein converted a 38-yard field goal with 2:28 on the clock. The Rams attempted an onside kick, which was recovered by San Francisco at the St. Louis 48-yard line. The defense forced a three-and-out and the offense began their subsequent drive on their own 9 with 1:05 remaining. Cunningham ran six yards and on the next play, Davis' pass that was intended for WR Kenny Britt was intercepted and returned 20 yards for a touchdown, resulting in the game's final score.

Armed with a two-point lead, the Rams were 2:55 away from toppling the defending Super Bowl champion Seattle Seahawks. The Rams were faced with fourth-and-3 from their own 18 and rather than punting, Johnny Hekker threw his fifth NFL pass for an 18-yard gain to RB Benny Cunningham. Rookie RB Tre Mason closed the game with three runs for 18 yards, sealing the Rams' 28-26 victory. In just his second NFL game, Mason generated 85 yards on the ground. After the Seahawks opened the game with a 24-yard field goal on their first possession. Cunningham returned the ensuing kickoff 75 yards to the Seattle 31. The return is tied for the fifth longest in franchise history, and was the longest since Danny Amendola's return of 84 yards on Dec. 10, 2010 vs. 49ers. Cunningham's return also set up Mason's first NFL touchdown – a 6-yard rush up the middle - six plays later. Cunningham found the end zone himself atop the second quarter on a 5-yard shovel pass from QB Austin Davis. Cunningham went on to lead the team in receiving yards for the first time in his career with 46. The Rams extended their 14-3 lead midway through the second quarter with another big play on special teams. With 7:24 left in the half, Seattle punted from their own 49. The Rams dialed up a unique play for the punt and mislead the Seahawks to the left sideline where it appeared as though WR/PR Tayon Austin was fielding the punt. Meanwhile, WR Stedman Bailey caught the ball on the opposite side of the field and ran 90 yards for the six points. What was Bailey's first ever punt return, tied Dick Bass' 1961 return vs. Green Bay for third-longest in team history. Seattle's punt was a result of two sacks over the span of three plays by DT Aaron Donald and DE Eugene Sims. Pro Bowl DE Robert Quinn recorded his first sack of the season in Seattle's subsequent drive. Against Seattle, Quinn has recorded at least one sack in 6-of-7 games for a total of 8. Seattle began to chop at the Rams' 18-point lead starting at the tail of the second guarter on a 35-yard field goal with 10 seconds remaining. By the midway point, the Rams owned the 21-6 lead and marked the second time this season the Rams scored 21 points in the first half. The team also limited the Seahawks to 31 yards on the ground, while Davis was perfect throwing, completing each of his 9 passes for a 122.7 passer rating. Seahawks QB Russell Wilson inched Seattle closer, 21-19, on a 19-yard touchdown run in the third quarter, followed by a 19-yard pass to TE Cooper Helfet on their ensuing drive at the beginning of the fourth quarter. St. Louis responded with an 8-play, 80-yard drive that concluded with Davis' second touchdown of the day - a 4-yard pass to TE Lance Kendricks. Wilson mimicked an 8-play, 80-yard drive of his own and found WR Doug Baldwin in the end zone on a 9-yard pass play with 3:22 left in regulation. Despite Wilson's 101 second-half rushing yards and Seattle's spark of scores, the Rams maintained possession of the ball for the remainder of the game and claimed their first win over the Seahawks since 2012.

In their first game of a three-game road tour, the St. Louis Rams lost to the Kansas City Chiefs in a contest known as the "Missouri Governor's Cup." The game marked the Rams' first regular season meeting at Arrowhead since 2002 and with the 34-7 win, the Chiefs now hold the 7-4 advantage in the all-time series. The Rams came up with their lone touchdown on the first drive following opening kickoff, RB Benny Cunningham. who entered the game leading the National Football League in kickoff return average at 36.1 ypg, put the Rams at their own 35 following a 41-yard return, which setup the eventual touchdown. The score marked the fifth time this season that the Rams scored in the first quarter. The drive lasted three minutes and four seconds, spanned six plays and was highlighted by a 43-yard catch by WR Kenny Britt and 1-yard touchdown reception by TE Lance Kendricks. Kendricks - a fourth-year pro who leads the team in TD receptions with four - has now recorded a touchdown in three consecutive games. With 2:37 on the clock, DE Robert Quinn forced his first fumble of the season (9th career), however Kansas City maintained possession as the ball bounced out of bounds on CB E.J. Gaines' attemped recovery. The score was evened at 7 following a 1-vard touchdown run by RB Jamaal Charles (Cairo Santos extra point) nearly three minutes into the second quarter. On first-and-10 in the Chiefs' ensuing possession. DE William Haves recovered a fumble caused by mishandled handoff between QB Alex Smith and Charles at the KC 14-vard line and returned it six yards. A 14-vard Chiefs sack on third down led to a 38-yard field goal try by K Greg Zuerlein. The kick was wide right. In the subsequent series, Kanas City put together a 10-play field goal drive. In the closing plays of that drive, Quinn recorded back-to-back sacks to put Kansas City on the St. Louis 35-yard line. Quinn last accomplished the feat on Dec. 28, 2013 against the Seattle Seahawks. Santos' 53-vard kick sent the Rams into the locker room at halftime trailing by three. Upon returning to the field. Knile Davis returned the opening kickoff of the second half 99 yards to put the Chiefs up 17-7. Kanas City compiled another field-goal drive in the third guarter. The series was extended by Rams penalties and ended in a 28-yard field goal by Santos. On the second play of the fourth quarter, Charles found the end zone on a 36-yard rush, marking the Chiefs' longest play of the day. Davis later scored on a rushing touchdown with 6:32 to give the Chiefs the 27-point lead and subsequent victory.

The St. Louis Rams held on to defeat the San Francisco 49ers, 13-10, in their first trip to Levi's Stadium, marking their second win in division play. Both teams got on the board with field goals in the first quarter, beginning with San Francisco on their opening possession. The Rams' first offensive possession of the second quarter was ended following an interception by 49ers S Antoine Bethea. The interception but the 49ers at the St. Louis 35 and resulted in a 27-yard touchdown pass to Anguan Boldin. After the score, the Rams defense went on to produce three sacks - two from DE Robert Quinn. On Quinn's later secondquarter sack, he stripped 49ers QB Colin Kaepernick of the football, which was recovered by Eugene Sims and lead to a 21-yard touchdown reception by WR Kenny Britt to tie the game at 10. The touchdown was Britt's second as a Ram, and Austin Davis' 11th as the starting quarterback. Davis has thrown at least one touchdown pass in each of the last six games. By halftime, the Rams had accumulated six sacks - the most first half sacks in franchise history since the sack became an official statistic in 1982. After a scoreless third quarter, Rams K Greg Zuerlein converted a 39-yard field goal. The kick capped a four-play drive of eight yards that began at the San Francisco 29 after Andy Lee's punt from deep in the end zone went off the side of his foot and traveled 23 yards. The 49ers started their final offensive series of the game with 3:11 remaining on their own 12-yard line. Back-to-back Rams penalties coupled with a 20-yard catch by Boldin put San Francisco at the two. Two plays later, the Rams found themselves clinging to a 3-point lead with the 49ers stationed at the 1. On third down with nine seconds remaining, Kaepernick attempted a quarterback sneak and fumbled before crossing the goal line. The ball was recovered by LB James Laurinaitis in the end zone, giving the Rams their second win in three weeks. The victory came on the heels of a standout defensive effort that was highlighted with eight sacks from six different players. The sack total was the team's largest since their 9-sack day vs. Arizona on Oct. 4, 2012 and their largest on the road since 2000.

In their third division matchup of the season against the Arizona Cardinals, who own the NFL's best record, the St. Louis Rams surrendered a 14-10 lead that extended deep into the fourth quarter. The course of the game changed drastically over the final seven minutes of play as the result of three turnovers coupled with a 48-yard touchdown pass by Arizona. On the Cardinals' first drive of the fourth quarter, newcomer S Mark Barron recorded his first sack as a Ram. On the play, Cardinals QB Carson Palmer was injured and did not return to the game, Barron's sack forced a 53-yard field goal try that was unsuccessful and kept the Rams in front by four points. The Cardinals regained possession after a Rams punt and second-string QB Drew Stanton engineered a four-play, 89-yard scoring drive that concluded in the 48-yard touchdown reception to John Brown. What was a one-possession game, slipped away from the Rams as their ensuing three possessions ended in back-to-back interceptions - the later returned for a touchdown by Cardinals CB Patrick Peterson – and a sack fumble that was returned for another touchdown. The loss was Head Coach Jeff Fisher's second to the Cardinals since becoming the Rams' head coach. In the first half in which the Rams scored all of their points, QB Austin Davis completed 8-of-10 passes for 110 yards and generated a 145.8 passer rating, the highest first half rating amongst Rams guarterbacks since 2007. A stout rushing effort by RB Tre Mason, WR Tayon Austin, and RB Benny Cunningham gave the Rams their first touchdown on their third offensive possession. Austin produced 26 yards (16-rec, 10-ru) on the drive, while Mason added 27 rushing yards. Cunningham saw action on the final play and punched into the end zone on first down from the Arizona 3-vard line. Arizona followed up with their own 3-yard rushing touchdown on the first drive of the second guarter to even the score at 7. Two drives later. Arizona added a 43-yard field goal to go up 10-7. The Rams regained the lead on a 59-yard touchdown pass from Davis to TE Jared Cook. Not only was it the longest play of the game, but it was the longest reception of the season and Cook's longest during his career in St. Louis. Defensively, the Rams limited the Cardinals' rushing attack to 23 yards, a 1.3-yard average, marking the lowest rushing total and average by a Rams opponent in 2014. Additionally, the defense recorded two additional sacks to Barron's as DE Robert Quinn and S T.J. McDonald each tacked on one a piece. Quinn's sack marked his fourth consecutive game with at least one sack, giving him 6.0 on the season, while McDonald's was his first of the season, and second of his career. McDonald also split the team lead in tackles with 12 (nine solo) with LB Alec Ogletree who also recorded a 44-vard interception return, 2 passes defensed, and one forced fumble.

Turnover-free play on offense coupled with a season-high five field goals and a defensive effort that held the NFL's thirdranked total offense to seven points led to the Rams' 22-7 victory over the reigning AFC champion Denver Broncos. Shaun Hill was named the starting quarterback, his first start since the team's Week 1 contest against the Minnesota Vikings. In his second game at the helm of the offense. Hill completed 20-of-29 passes for 220 yards and a 102.7 passer rating. On the third play from scrimmage, he found WR Kenny Britt on 33-yard completion, which resulted in K Greg Zuerlein's first field goal of the day. With 1:18 remaining in the first quarter, the Rams reached the end zone on a one-play scoring drive where Britt hauled in a 63-yard pass from Hill. Britt recorded two additional receptions in the half and accumulated 128 receiving yards, marking the highest first half total since Danny Amendola amassed 133 yards on Sept. 16, 2012 vs. the Washington Redskins. In addition to Britt, rookie RB Tre Mason and piled up a season-high 113 rushing yards against the NFL's top-ranked run defense that previously limited opponents to 67.0 yards per game. Britt and Mason's combined performance marked the first time that the Rams had a 100-yard rusher and receiver in the same game since 2012. After St. Louis converted their second field goal of the day, Denver responded with a five-play scoring drive of 80 yards that was capped on a 42-vard pass from QB Peyton Manning to Emmanuel Sanders. The Rams defense did not allow another touchdown, ending Manning's streak of 15 games with multiple scoring throws. Additionally, the Rams defense held Denver to 28 yards on the ground, the lowest total produced by a Rams opponent, and also recorded a pair of sacks. Zuerlein added three points in the third quarter on a 22-yard kick to push the Rams ahead, 16-7, with 1:48 on the clock. Two fourth-quarter interceptions - one each by LB Alec Ogletree and CB Trumaine Johnson - led to Zuerlein's fourth and fifth field goals, of 55 and 53 yards, respectively, and ultimately sealed the game for St. Louis, His final two field goals marked the first time that he converted two field goals of 50 or more yards since his rookie season in 2012. Additionally, his five field goals made were a career high for the third-year kicker. The Rams to extended their all-time series lead against the Broncos, 8-5, and gave Head Coach Jeff Fisher his 160th regular season win as a head coach. Fisher is now one win away from tying Tom Coughlin of the New York Giants for the second-most regular season wins amonast active head coaches.

In their 11th all-time meeting with the San Diego Chargers, the Rams were faced with two 10-point deficits in the second half alone. On the heels of WR Tayon Austin's first touchdown of the season, the Rams were able to overcome the first. However, a goal-line interception in the final minute of the game allowed the Chargers to escape with the 27-24 victory. While St. Louis played from behind in the third and fourth quarters, the visiting Rams took a 10-3 lead thanks to CB Janoris Jenkins' 99-yard interception that was returned for a touchdown. The return is tied for the longest in franchise history and marked Jenkins' second pick-6 of the season and his sixth defensive touchdown since entering the league in 2012. The Chargers began to swipe at the Rams lead and converted a 48-vard field goal in the closing seconds of the first half. San Diego took a 20-10 lead after scoring back-to-back touchdowns in the third quarter. On their first offensive possession of the second half, Chargers RB Ryan Matthews ran up the middle for a 32-yard touchdown. On the ensuing possession, QB Shaun Hill was sacked by Chargers DT Corey Liuget and fumbled on the play. Chargers LB Andrew Gachkar scooped the loose ball and returned it 13 yards. The Rams rebounded and scored on a 6-yard rush by Austin less than two minutes later. Midway through the fourth quarter, the Rams found themselves down by 10 points for a second time and trailed the Chargers 27-17 following a 29-yard touchdown pass by Chargers QB Philip Rivers. With 8:04 left to play, the Rams orchestrated an 80-yard scoring drive that put St. Louis within three points of tying the Chargers at 27 points. The drive was extended with three third-down conversions and a 19-yard completion on a fake punt from P Johnny Hekker to WR Stedman Bailey on fourth-and-4 from the Rams 26-yard line. Hekker's pass was his second of the season and the fifth of his three-year career. Bailey, who finished the game with a team-leading 89 yards, capped the six-minute drive with a 7-yard touchdown. After the defense forced a three-and-out, the Rams started their final drive on the San Diego 40 with 1:27 remaining in regulation. Hill pushed the Rams to the San Diego 6 on a 27-yard pass to WR Kenny Britt who rolled out of bounds on the diving catch. Hill targeted Britt two plays later on second-and-4 but was intercepted by Chargers S Marcus Gilchrist, resulting in the game's final score.

The St. Louis Rams improved to 5-7 on the season and recorded their first shutout in eight years after defeating the visiting Oakland Raiders, 52-0. In what was the team's second-largest margin of victory in franchise history, the Rams forced five turnovers, generated six sacks and scored on their first six offensive possessions. The Rams' first nine plays on offense went through the air, as Shaun Hill completed eight of nine passes for 125 yards, including a 35-yard touchdown to RB Tre Mason. On the 11th play, Hill pushed the Rams to a 14-0 lead on a 2-yard rush into the end zone. Hill's rushing touchdown was his first as a Ram and fourth of his career. The Rams' subsequent two drives also ended with rushing touchdowns -an 18-yard rush from WR Tayon Austin and an 89-yarder from Mason, respectively. Rookie CB E.J. Gaines ended the Raiders ensuing drive with an interception on Oakland's 23-yard line, positioning the Rams for their fifth touchdown of the half. CB Trumaine Johnson also picked off Raiders QB Derek Carr, setting up the Rams 38-yard field goal and subsequent 38-0 halftime lead. By the end of the first half, the Rams had both a 100-yard rusher and receiver in Mason and Bailey, respectively. Bailey caught five passes for 100 yards in the first frame of play. He is the first Ram to reach the century mark in the first guarter since Isaac Bruce recorded 103 yards in 2000 against the Minnesota Vikings during postseason play. Mason matched his single-game career high in rushing yards of 113 yards - previously set on Week 11 vs. the Denver Broncos - on six first half carries. Although the Rams were scoreless in the third quarter, DE Chris Long, who was playing in his first game since suffering an injury in Week 1, recorded his first sack of the season. DE William Haves also forced a fumble in the third guarter, which was recovered and returned eight yards by S Rodney McLeod. On the final drive of the quarter, the Rams regained possession on their own 44-yard line following a failed fourth-down attempt by the Raiders. Their drive extended into the fourth quarter and Mason capped the subsequent five-play drive with an 8-yard rushing touchdown, his third score of the day. With the 5:38 remaining in regulation. CB Trumaine Johnson intercepted Carr and returned it 43 yards for the Rams' final touchdown of the game. In the midst of the shutout, DE Robert Quinn recorded a season-high three sacks and forced two fumbles. Quinn is currently tied for the NFL lead in forced fumbles with four. Additionally, the game marked Head Coach Jeff Fisher's 161st regular season win as a head coach. He is now tied with New York Giants Head Coach Tom Coughlin for the second-most regular season wins amongst active NFL coaches.

Upon routing the Washington Redskins, 24-0, the St. Louis Rams became the first NFL team to record backto-back shutout victories since 2009. As a franchise, it was the first time the team accomplished the feat since 1945. After a scoreless first quarter, the Rams began their first scoring drive on their own 42-yard line following a 33-yard punt by Washington. Five plays into the drive. QB Shaun Hill completed a 35-yard touchdown pass to TE Jared Cook. Cook's second touchdown of the game came on the Rams' second offensive series of the third quarter. The Rams were stationed on the Washington 35 following a fourth-down stop by LB Darren Bates on a fake punt. A 36-yard catch by WR Stedman Bailey on third-and-12 set up Cook's ensuing 1-yard touchdown grab and marked Cook's first multi-touchdown game since Week 1 of 2013. After Cook's touchdown, the Rams faked the extra point as P Johnny Hekker completed a pass to TE Cory Harkey in the end zone. Since Jeff Fisher was named head coach of the team in 2012, the Rams have converted nine two-point conversions, one shy of the league-leading Chicago Bears who have notched 10 during that span. Thirteen minutes into the third quarter, the Rams defense forced their fifth punt of the game and WR/PR Tavon Austin returned it 78 yards for a touchdown and a 24-0 Rams lead. The return was the second-longest of Austin's career. He finished the game with 203 total yards (46 rushing, 14 receiving, 143 returning), a season-high amongst all Rams players. With 5:25 remaining in regulation, S.T.J. McDonald intercepted Redskins QB Colt McCov at the St. Louis 2-yard line, preserving the shutout. In similar fashion, S Rodney McLeod ended a potential scoring drive, picking off McCoy at the St. Louis 16-yard line on the opening drive of the game. McLeod has three interceptions on the year. As an offense, the Redskins did not run a single play in the red zone. The Rams defense totaled seven sacks for a loss of 53 yards and allowed a season-low 27 rushing yards. DE Robert Quinn forced his fifth fumble of the season to lead the National Football League and also posted his 11th multi-sack game of his career. The Rams are 8-2-1 when Quinn records multiple sacks in a single game. Offensively, St. Louis played turnover-free football for their second consecutive game and QB Shaun Hill completed 16-of-22 passes for 213 yards, two touchdowns, and a 133.3 passer rating. En route to scoring 48 points offensively since Week 13 vs. the Oakland Raiders, Hill connected with three different receivers for completions of 30+ yards in the win over Washington: WR Kenny Britt (41 yards), Bailey (36 yards), and Cook (35 yards, TD).

Robert Quinn had gone so long without a sack it looked like he'd forgotten how to do "The Bernie" — his trademark sack dance — after he finally got one midway through the second quarter Sunday.

"It was a full-action Bernie," Quinn insisted after the Rams hung on for a 28-26 victory over Seattle at the Edward Jones Dome.

Perhaps, but it wasn't as smooth as usual. Looked a little rusty.

"It's taken a while," Quinn said. "Once Aaron (Donald) started it off, we just kind of went from there. But me personally, to get (Russell Wilson) down for the first one of the year, it's a great feeling. We've still got a few more games to go, so hopefully, it won't be the last one."

Given that Sunday was Robert Quinn bobblehead day, and his picture was on tickets for the contest, it was only fitting he broke the dry spell.

"On bobblehead day," Quinn said, smiling. "I think they should've done that the first game of the season, so I wouldn't have to wait so long to get my first one."

After only one sack in their first five games, sacks came in bunches for the Rams in the second quarter. Donald, the rookie defensive tackle, dropped Wilson for a 5-yard loss with 9½ minutes remaining before halftime.

Two plays later, defensive end Eugene Sims dropped Wilson for a 9-yard loss to force a Seattle punt — a punt that was returned 90 yards for a touchdown by Stedman Bailey on a trick play.

On Seattle's next possession, Quinn broke through for his 7-yard sack. He's had at least one sack in his past five games against the Seahawks.

"We got three of those 'S-words' today, which was good," coach Jeff Fisher said. "Those were hard to find there for a while."

But that was all the Rams would get against Wilson, even though he absorbed several hits by the pass rush and was flushed out of the pocket on numerous occasions.

"This guy (Wilson) is hard to bring down," Fisher said. "And Russell, all by himself, made this quite a game."

En route to becoming the first player in NFL history with 300 yards passing and 100 yards rushing in the same game (according to Elias Sports), Wilson was almost unstoppable in the second half.

He accounted for 264 yards of offense and three TDs in the third and fourth quarters.

At about the same time that Broncos quarterback Peyton Manning addressed Denver reporters wearing a fancy suit after a stunning 22-7 loss, Rams counterpart Shaun Hill walked into his news conference wearing a plaid flannel shirt and blue jeans.

Now, that's what you call low-key.

"This is about as fancy as I get," Hill shrugged.

Then again, what do you expect from a humble Kansas native and avid fisherman who has his permanent residence in the Lake of the Ozarks?

OK, deduct a couple of points if you must for wardrobe. But other than that, Hill was pretty close to flawless as the Rams (4-6) toppled the defending Super Bowl runners-up Sunday at the Edward Jones Dome.

A thigh injury in the season opener against Minnesota all but derailed Hill's season. But eight games later, he finally got another chance to play, and he made the most of the opportunity.

Granted, Manning threw for nearly 400 yards Sunday, but it took him 54 passes — two of which were intercepted — to get his 389 yards. Hill threw only 29 times but completed 20 for 220 yards, a touchdown, and a passer rating of 102.7 — to Manning's 75.3 rating.

In his 13-year career, it was the first time Hill had gone head-to-head with Manning in a starting role. His father, who passed away in January 2011, wasn't there to see it. But Hill's 9-month-old son Theodore, who is named after Hill's father, was in the Dome.

"Coincidentally, this is the first win I've had since the last game he was alive — my father," Hill said. "A lot of emotions went into this one for sure."

Young Theodore, or Theo as Hill calls him, obviously won't recall what happened Sunday. But it is, after all, preserved on video.

"This is the first game he's been to that I've started and finished," Hill said. "That was kind of important, too, for me when I was coming into the season."

He wanted Theo to have some pictures, some video, of himself playing NFL football after Theo was born. At 34, Hill doesn't know how much time he has left in the league, and after the injury ended his day after two quarters against Minnesota, it looked like that might be all the 2014 football for Hill.

"It was important for me to come back and be able (to play) some during his life," Hill said.

But coach Jeff Fisher decided to switch from struggling Austin Davis to Hill last week, so now Theo watched one of the most memorable Rams games since the team moved to St. Louis in 1995 and certainly one of their biggest upsets. OK, Theo won't remember it unless he's some kind of baby genius, but he can watch the film in a few years.

"Not only did Shaun find Kenny (Britt) and make big plays to Kenny, but he extended some drives," Fisher said. "Time of possession is so important, and to find the back and find the check-down (is important). And then the guys — we didn't have any drops per se."

The Rams had a time-of-possession advantage of nearly 12 minutes: 35:50 to Denver's 24:10. They ran 65 plays, their highest total in five games. And although they weren't great on third-down conversions (six of 17), it was their best conversion rate since the 28-26 upset over Seattle on Oct. 19.



"Shaun played a hell of a game," defensive end William Hayes said. "He showed he had guts. He hit a couple of passes where he knew he was gonna take hits, and still delivered the ball."

Hill's best delivery came late in the first quarter, when he threw a deep strike to Britt for a 63-yard touchdown. It was the longest completion of the season for the Rams, and Britt's longest reception since the 2011 season with Tennessee.

It was a post pattern to Britt, a pass that he had dropped during the practice week.

"I told him, 'It's Friday and you drop a pass, that's OK. But if you do it on Sunday I'm going to kick your tail," Hill said. "Obviously, I was just joking."

Offensive coordinator Brian Schottenheimer said during his weekly Thursday media session that he thought the Rams would have some chances for deep shots in the passing game. And so it was. Britt was the recipient of 33-yard and 21-yard completions, and the 63-yarder — all in the first half.

One reason the Broncos are first in the NFL in rushing defense is that their safeties frequently play close to the line of scrimmage. On the long TD play, the Rams used Tavon Austin as a decoy, and when a Denver safety came charging up to the line of scrimmage to defend Austin on the 63-yard TD play, Broncos cornerback Bradley Roby had no help after Britt got behind him.

Britt's 128 yards came on just four receptions. It was the first 100-yard receiving game for a Ram this season.

"Hey, it looked like Shaun's been hitting the weight room in his off time, to tell you the truth," Britt said, laughing. "It really showed in practice. Every deep ball was on the money."

Hill has been called a lot of things over his career: Gritty, industrious, smart. Cannon-armed has never been part of the description.

"Compared to most guys in the NFL, it's nowhere close to strong," Hill said. "So it's just kind of funny to hear that."

Britt's TD gave the Rams a 10-0 lead with 1 minute, 10 seconds to go in the opening quarter. It was the only touchdown of the day for the Rams, who went zero for three in the red zone. But they got five field goals by Greg Zuerlein — a single-game career high — and that was enough to hold off Manning and the Broncos.

Rookie running back Tre Mason's first 100-yard day (29 for 113) in the NFL helped the Rams stay balanced and control the clock.

And when things got a little chaotic, Hill's steady hand helped calm down the huddle.

"He keeps his composure," Britt said. "When we got caught up in the moment, he came into the huddle and said, 'Hey guys, Relax. Calm down."

And that apparently is what happened. Undoubtedly, both Theodore Hills would approve.

Kenny Britt hasn't set the world on fire, but he is providing a spark for the Rams' wide receiver corps.

With 25 catches for 440 yards, Britt is on pace for 40 catches and 700 yards this season. Last week he became the first Rams receiver to top 100 yards in a game with four catches for 128. And his 63-yard touchdown catch from quarterback Shaun Hill on a post-pattern Sunday against Denver marked the Rams' longest reception of the season.

OK, none of those numbers are going to make Megatron, aka Calvin Johnson, jealous. (Although Britt's per-catch average of 17.6 yards might catch his eye.) But considering where Britt's career was at, and where he started in St. Louis, it qualifies as a career revival.

"You can see the potential," coach Jeff Fisher said. "Numbers aren't (great) — he doesn't necessarily have 75 catches right now. But you see he has the potential to make those big plays in a game. I'm sure he'll finish up strong."

After a frustrating 2013 season in Tennessee, where he was basically benched over the second half of the season, Britt signed a one-year "prove-it" deal with the Rams last offseason. It was for a modest \$1.4 million, but included incentives that could double the value of the contract.

Because of his falling out with the Titans — just 11 catches for 96 yards in '13 — and his history of off-field issues, there were no promises made in St. Louis.

"Not at all," Britt said. "My mindset was coming in like a rookie, learning the system, being a great teammate, and working from the bottom up. They didn't give me any special treatment, like, 'Hey, you're gonna start. You're gonna be with the 1s and 2s.'

"When I came here, I was the last receiver on the bench. I had to get to know the playbook. I had to get to know the quarterbacks."

And that's how things went during the OTAs in June and the first week or so of training camp. But when the team released its first depth chart of the season in early August, Britt was listed as a starter. The Rams had decided to go big at wide receiver with Britt (6-3, 223) and Brian Quick (6-3, 218) as the starters lining up outside.

But the Rams lost that element to a degree when Quick was lost for the season with a shoulder injury in the Oct. 26 Kansas City game. Britt has scored two of his three touchdowns since then, and judging by what happened against Denver, he and Hill have a good chemistry.

"He's a veteran guy; a guy that I'd play with any day," Britt said of Hill.

Britt feels the same way about the rest of the Rams. In fact, after the team's 13-10 road upset of San Francisco on Nov. 9, unsolicited, Britt talked about how much he enjoys playing with the team and how much he'd like to return in 2015 and beyond.

He has since reiterated why he wants to come back.

"One is Jeff Fisher," Britt said. "I had a great experience with him when he was with the Titans, and he's doing a great job as we see with the St. Louis Rams."

The other main reason for wanting to return, Britt said, is the team chemistry in the meeting room, the locker room, and on the field.

"I've been in the NFL for going on six years, and this is the first time I've been in a locker room like this, where everybody's all committed — all the guys," he said. "I'm telling you, I've never been in a locker room like this — ever — in my career."



Britt says players on both sides of the ball come to work every day trying to get better, and push each other to do so. He said there is no selfishness of "somebody waiting for somebody to mess up to get ahead."

As of now, there are have been no known communications between the Rams and Britt's agent. It could be that the Rams want to see how their younger wide receivers develop over the rest of the season, and also see how Britt himself performs in the season's final six games.

Of course, with Quick expected to be sidelined until the start of training camp following his shoulder surgery and with Austin Pettis no longer on the team, it might make sense to get Britt under contract again if the price is right.

Even if there were negotiations going on at this time, Britt isn't sure he'd want to hear about them at this point.

"Right now, I just want to focus on this year," he said. "This is my sixth year and I've never been in the playoffs."

The postseason is still mathematically possible for the Rams in 2014, but they'd probably have to run the table to get there. Even so, Britt sees possibilities for the future.

"Hopefully I can stay here after this season and be in this locker room," he said. "It's hard to put a team together like this in the locker room, with this chemistry.

"These guys like to work and like coming to work. The coaching staff as well. You don't have coaches that I'd say were uptight — that you don't want to be around. Everybody can be their self and everybody can go on the field and be their self."



TITLE: Barksdale a bedrock for Rams' O-Line

Little more than a year after the Oakland Raiders used a third-round draft pick on offensive tackle Joe Barksdale, they released him.

It was Sept. 26, 2012, just one of a handful of days over the past couple of years now permanently etched in Barksdale's mind. The next was Sept. 27, 2012, a day later when the St. Louis Rams claimed him off waivers.

Barksdale arrived in St. Louis with enough raw talent to develop into the bedrock of an often in flux offensive line that he is today but without any of the self-belief necessary to get there.

"When I got here, I was a recently cut former draft pick with no confidence, not many technical skills," Barksdale said. "But I believe I'm here for a reason and I'm so happy to be here. I do believe that everything did happen for a reason, when it was supposed to and how it was supposed to."

What's happened in the nearly two years since Barksdale arrived in St. Louis is more than anyone knows. It's easy to look at the resume he's compiled and see a young player simply emerging as a solid right tackle providing durability to a line in desperate need of it.

But the road from there to here hasn't been as easy as it might seem.

When the Rams claimed Barksdale in 2012, they were simply searching for help on the offensive line after some injuries had struck. That's been a familiar refrain in recent seasons.

Offensive line coach Paul Boudreau saw the 6-foot-5, 326-pound Barksdale as his next great reclamation project, if only he could get Barksdale to have the same belief.

For as much work as Barksdale needed on footwork, hand placement and understanding of angles, he needed regular reminders he could get there.

"His thing is more confidence in everything," Boudreau said. "Joe is his own worst critic. He's his own worst enemy. I tell him I will do all the worrying for you and you get out there and you play."

That confidence came quickly for Barksdale, who said he genuinely started buying into Boudreau's belief when he started at left tackle against Green Bay on Oct. 21, 2012. He started again the following week in London against New England and graded out well in both games.

After starting those two games and appearing in four more, Barksdale returned in 2013 primed to be the primary swing tackle behind Rodger Saffold and Jake Long. He spent part of his offseason working with Hall of Fame Rams offensive tackle Jackie Slater; something he repeated this summer, and came back ready for whatever role was needed.

As it turned out, projected right tackle Saffold suffered an injury early in the preseason and again in Week 2 of the regular season. Before Barksdale was to start the next week against Dallas, tragedy struck.

Charles Fobbs, who Barksdale calls a mentor, second father, brother and coach since he was 13 years old, died in a car accident before the Rams played the Cowboys.

Barksdale was devastated by the loss and attended the funeral back home in Michigan in search of some peace of mind. When he returned to St. Louis, he found solace on the football field, in his teammates and from his coaches.

Boudreau, in particular, knew what Barksdale was going through. His father had passed away not long before Fobbs, and Boudreau was still reeling from his own loss. Boudreau offered daily encouragement and reminded Barksdale that the best way to get through a tough time is simply to do it.



"I said you have a job to do and when you're at work, it might be the best thing for you, it might be the best therapy for you," Boudreau said. "He kind of knew it was somebody walking his shoes. It's going to always hurt and I said the anniversary of that will be the same thing for you and when you go back to Michigan you'll see his family and it will be a tough time for you, but I think in his case, he's grown up more than anything since he's been a Ram."

With each practice and game, Barksdale grew as a player as he dedicated himself to improving. By the time the season was through, Barksdale had started 13 games and played in all 16. For what it's worth, Pro Football Focus graded him as the team's second most productive lineman.

Amidst the revolving doors at other positions on the line, Barksdale remains steadfast on the right side. Boudreau points out Barksdale is no longer dwelling on mistakes. Barksdale has even set big goals for himself, starting with winning a Super Bowl, making the Pro Bowl and eventually the Hall of Fame.

In this training camp, Barksdale has been the one constant on the offensive line, playing with the starters at the same position every day.

"Joe's done a great job," coach Jeff Fisher said. "Joe's stepped in and played. He's played both sides for us, settled in on the right side. He's reliable, dependable, everything you want at right tackle. It was great timing for us, great timing for Joe, when he was let go and we had an opportunity to bring him in and he's done a great job."

After the season, Barksdale is scheduled to become an unrestricted free agent. More important, he's also in the midst of planning a wedding. He says he spends much more time thinking of the latter than the former when he's not practicing his newest hobby, the electric guitar.

Given his druthers, Barksdale would like to stay in St. Louis.

"Definitely," Barksdale said. "They gave me a second chance."



TITLE: Jeff Fisher's mettle lifts St. Louis to big win over Seahawks

The climax was playing out like another Edward Jones Dome nightmare, the home team on the verge of surrendering what was left of a once-healthy advantage and suffering another disheartening defeat.

Like everyone in the stadium Sunday, not to mention millions of television viewers, St. Louis Rams coach Jeff Fisher could see the way this one was heading, what with his win-starved team clinging to a two-point lead and about to punt the ball back to the Seattle Seahawks and their red-hot quarterback, Russell Wilson, from deep in its own territory with just under three minutes remaining.

It was the perfect time for a stunning plot twist -- and who better to provide one than The 'Stache?

In January of 2000, Fisher brought us The Music City Miracle, giving his Tennessee Titans an unfathomable playoff victory over the Buffalo Bills.

Last May, Fisher electrified the Rams' unsuspecting draft room -- and made an historic move no one saw coming -- when he selected Michael Sam, who was bidding to become the NFL's first openly gay player.

At Sunday's pivotal moment, as is his custom, Fisher kept even his closest confidantes in the dark. When he sent in the fake-punt call on fourth-and-3 from the Rams' 18, only a dozen others were in on the audacious ploy: special teams coach John Fassel and the 11 men in the huddle.

Music City Miracle, meet the St. Louis Surprise.

Punter Johnny Hekker took the snap, waited for Benny Cunningham to flash open on the left and delivered a short pass that the running back caught and turned into an 18-yard gain. The Rams (2-4) would get another first down and kill the clock -- though not until sweating out a Tre Mason fumble and ensuing scrum -- to close out a 28-26 victory over the defending Super Bowl champs.

It's not too much of a stretch to say that the Rams, who've struggled in the wake of quarterback Sam Bradford's second torn ACL in less than a year, may have salvaged their season by upsetting the Seahawks (3-3). Having blown leads of 21 (to the Dallas Cowboys) and 14 (to the San Francisco 49ers) in their previous two home games, the notion of squandering a 21-3 edge to Seattle was one that Fisher couldn't stomach.

In fact, before the Rams ran their first-down play from their own 11 on that final possession, Fisher approached Fassel and told him to "make sure (Hekker's) ready" because a fake punt might be in the works on fourth down.

"They had such momentum," Fisher explained on his drive home from the Dome, his voice a mixture of relief and excitement. "And look -- Russell Wilson's really good. We had them down, and he took it over. So no, we wanted no part of him at the end."

Wilson, in the wake of a wild week that featured the stunning trade of playmaker Percy Harvin to the New York Jets and a broken foot suffered by fullback Derrick Coleman in pregame warmups, was superlative in the second half, finishing with 313 passing yards and 106 rushing yards on seven carries. Game manager? Yeah, right.

St. Louis, riding with a pair of former third-stringers in the backfield -- quarterback Austin Davis (18 of 21, 152 yards, two touchdowns, no interceptions) and Mason (18 carries, 85 yards, one TD) -- needed a full-squad effort to prevail.

And, amazingly, the fake punt wasn't even St. Louis' most impressive special-teams stunt. That came midway through the second quarter when the Seahawks, trailing 14-3, punted from their own 49 -- and the Rams countered with a well-rehearsed ensemble performance that turned deception into an art form.

With Jon Ryan's high punt sailing toward the right (from the Rams' perspective) sideline, return man Tavon Austin and nine other Rams drifted to the left to set up a phantom runback. As Austin pretended to



wait for a ball that was headed to the opposite hash mark, the Seahawks dutifully followed, buying the ruse even as he fell backward for effect, presumably gunning for that Oscar nomination.

Meanwhile, Rams receiver Stedman Bailey tracked the ball, made a nice over-the-shoulder catch and, still largely undetected, turned and raced down the right sideline for a 90-yard score.

"What you have to understand is that they're so good on special teams, and that's what allowed us to run that play," Fisher said. "Their punter is money -- we knew if they were between the 45-yard lines he'd hit it end over end with great hang time, and put it on the numbers. We needed the kind of kick that would (theoretically) force a fair catch, and we knew he'd give it to us, and that's why it worked.

"We scripted that play in practice and ran it over and over, and it pretty much played out that way. Tavon did a little too much -- the falling over backwards, I don't know where he gets that -- but Sted made a sweet catch, and then we got him some help and pulled it off."

Facing the prospect of having to defend Wilson on a potential game-winning drive, the Rams needed just a little bit of help -- and Fisher gave it to them, in the form of the Hekker to Cunningham completion that might have kept their playoff dreams flickering.

"Hey," Fisher said, "whatever it takes."

For this team, at this moment, it's a legitimate mantra -- and there's nothing fake about it.



TITLE: Sack highlights Long's return

On a highlight-reel day for the Rams, the play that generated one of the loudest fan reactions came with 8½ minutes left in the third quarter.

That's when defensive end Chris Long, playing in his first game since the season opener, dropped Oakland quarterback Derek Carr for a 7-yard sack. The crowd at the Edward Jones Dome went wild in appreciation.

"It was a relief," Long said. "I just felt the love, you know, from these fans that have supported me so much. And supported us. We've got great fans here and I appreciate them greatly."

Long also had a fumble recovery in the Rams' 52-0 victory Sunday, completing a long recovery process from surgery that re-attached two torn tendons in his foot. The Rams activated Long from the injured reserve/designated for return list on Saturday.

"The outpouring of support through probably the longest, 10, 11 weeks of my life has got me through in a lot of ways," Long said. "So it was great. I just want to help the team win. And it validates being back out there to be able to make a play."

Fisher said Long was a little sore at halftime, playing more than most observers anticipated.

"I was expecting to play as much as they needed me," Long said.

That little shimmy by free safety Rodney McLeod after his second-quarter interception was no impromptu celebration. "It's just a little dance that me and T.J. (McDonald) put together right before the game," he said.

Apparently, it's part of the weekly pregame ritual for the Rams' McSafeties. It's all about being prepared for success. "If we make plays, this is what we're gonna do today," McLeod explained. "It's just something that we've got going on."

McLeod told McDonald before Sunday's 19-17 victory over Tampa Bay that he was going to get an interception. Hard to explain but he just had that feeling.

"I thought if we got good pressure on (Josh) McCown, he'd most likely to throw one up," McLeod said. McCown, the Tampa Bay quarterback, did just that early in the second quarter of a 7-7 game. The Bucs were knocking on the door with a first-and-goal from the St. Louis 9.

But linebacker Jo-Lonn Dunbar flushed McCown out of the pocket on a blitz, and then linebacker James Laurinaitis came bearing down on McCown. Instead of taking the sack, or throwing the ball away, McCown threw it up for grabs in the general direction of wide receiver Vincent Jackson.

There was just one problem with that decision: Jackson was being double-covered, with cornerback Janoris Jenkins behind him and McLeod in front.

"He did a crossing route," McLeod said. "Basically I just read the quarterback. He made a bad decision and James got good pressure on him."

It wasn't an easy interception. The ball was thrown low and away, and McLeod lunged to keep it off the ground. "Gotta give credit to the hands, the gloves. Fresh gloves," McLeod said, laughing.

McLeod wears a new set of gloves each week on game day.

"That was a big point (in the game)," McDonald said of his teammate's play. "They were close to scoring, we don't give up any points. We give the ball back to our offense, get a lot of juice, a little momentum going."

It marked the first interception, and only takeaway, for the Rams this season. Without McLeod's INT, the third of his three-year NFL career, the outcome might've been different. Even if Tampa had to settle for a field goal, that might have been enough in what turned out to be a two-point game.

McLeod joined the Rams in 2012, the first year of the Jeff Fisher-Les Snead regime, as an undrafted rookie out of Virginia. He led the Rams in special teams tackles that year (16), then took advantage of preseason injuries to Darian Stewart to earn a job at safety in 2013. He started all 16 games, recording 87 tackles and two interceptions.

Even so, the general consensus this past offseason was that the Rams needed to upgrade the position, find a free safety with more range.

Granted, it's just two games into the season, but McLeod is proving doubters wrong. He has shown improved range and has taken quickly to defensive coordinator Greg Williams' system.

"I think it just comes with experience, and the coaching we get from OTAs to training camp with Gregg coming in, and Chuck (Cecil), and all those guys just getting us right," McLeod said.

Cecil is the Rams' secondary coach.

Even before the start of the regular season, Williams has been impressed with McLeod.



"Rodney has just been one of the most pleasant surprises for me — his instincts on playing the free safety position," Williams told the Post-Dispatch in a late-August interview.

"Chuck Cecil did a good job talking to me about him when I first got here. Chuck was very high on him and wanted me to make sure that I was patient with the evaluation process on him. I think Rodney does a phenomenal job on picking up the nuances of how we want our safeties to play."

Williams continued: "The free safety and the middle linebacker have to be a direct extension of the play-caller and what we do. He's sharp intellectually. He's sharp in big-picture understanding of the game."

An added bonus is that McLeod has become a more aggressive tackler this season than he showed previously, whether it be in coverage or in run support.

"I just think it's the mentality that Gregg instilled in us from Day 1," McLeod. "You know the mentality that he has."

Yeah, if you're coming in this neighborhood, you're going to have to pay a toll.

"There's been nothing but good stuff going on from Day 1 in this system," McLeod said.

It's a system not too different from the scheme run in 2012, when Williams was serving his one-year "Bountygate" suspension and his son Blake was de facto defensive coordinator.

Now in their second season starting together, McLeod and strong safety McDonald are developing a good rapport on the field.

They complement each other well, with McLeod usually playing deep in coverage, and McDonald frequently playing near the line of scrimmage, or blitzing, or covering tight ends.

"With T.J., what I don't have, he has," McLeod said. "We just work well together. It just works out." Fisher likes the way things are working out so far.

"Both the safeties have played very well the last two weeks," Fisher said. "Now, we missed some tackles, but everybody's going to miss tackles. ... But I think considering where we were last year, they've come a long, long way. I'm happy for them."

Through the spring and into summer's training camp, there probably wasn't a more consistently impressive wide receiver on the St. Louis Rams roster than Stedman Bailey.

"Obviously, I think even going back to training camp and spring, he had just a tremendous, tremendous practices, week-in-and-week-out, day-in-and-day-out." offensive coordinator Brian Schottenheimer said.

But every time Bailey made a one-handed catch in traffic or elevated above a taller defensive back to make another circus catch, instead of looking forward to what could come, the general reaction was 'Too bad he's suspended for the first four games.'

Subtracting Bailey from the mix right as the season began wasn't as big of a loss as it might have seemed when the suspension was announced in May because Brian Quick emerged as the team's most reliable receiving threat with fellow big wideout Kenny Britt operating on the other side. In fact, the Rams' passing attack was much better than expected and even ranked in the top 10 in the league at times during the first six weeks.

After the NFL altered some of its drug policy in September, Bailey's suspension was reduced to time already served, which amounted to two games. That certainly didn't figure to be as debilitating as a four-game (and it would have been five weeks because of a bye week in there) absence would have been.

However, by the time Bailey returned, a starting job that he could have competed for in the summer was now occupied by Quick.

"Definitely that set me back some," Bailey said. "I can't do anything but blame myself on that one. But it just feels good to be finally back in the groove now and on the same page with my quarterback trying to make plays."

The Rams lost Quick to a season-ending shoulder injury in their Oct. 26 loss to Kansas City. After that injury became clear, Rams coach Jeff Fisher pointed to Bailey as part of a group expected to help replace Quick's production. To that point, he'd had just four catches for 53 yards. And his resurgence didn't come quickly thereafter, either.

Bailey provided only four catches for 34 yards in the three weeks immediately following the Kansas City game. It was clear that Bailey wasn't yet comfortable in his return and he and then quarterback Austin Davis weren't exactly clicking.

"I think being a young player especially when you miss two weeks or whatever it was, there's a little bit of a learning curve getting back," Schottenheimer said. "Then there's a transition at quarterback, but again he's playing really, really well right now."

That transition at quarterback has apparently been a big part of helping Bailey get on track. In Hill's first start back against Denver, he and Britt hooked up repeatedly for Britt's best day as a Ram. With teams then more aware of Britt, it has opened more opportunities for Bailey over the past two weeks.

Bailey has taken advantage of those opportunities, setting a career high in receiving yards two weeks ago against San Diego with seven catches for 89 yards and a touchdown. He bettered that performance in an encore against Oakland last week in which he posted five catches for 100 yards.

"I've had lots of targets thrown my way and I've been able to capitalize on most of them and develop some good chemistry with Shaun," Bailey said. "He trusts me right now and I feel like I'm getting in a pretty good groove."

The key for Bailey now is to keep doing it consistently. He flashed similar promise near the end of last season but took those first 10 games before he offered more than special teams value this season. If Bailey can finish the season strong, Quick recovers and Britt returns, the Rams can finally feel pretty good about their receiving corps moving forward.

There's a lot of questions there, though, and only Bailey has the ability to supply his answer before the season is over.

"I think he's real comfortable now, coming back," Schottenheimer said. "Dialed in on the system. Doesn't surprise us, the



catches that he makes, he makes those all the time out here. Got terrific body control, really good feet and those catches for him are kind of ... they're just easy for him to make. Add him to the mix of the guys that we've got and try to spread people around and move the ball to different people."

At the end of pregame warmups, before the Rams go into the locker room one last time before kickoff, the team huddles up en masse on the field.

One player — usually it's James Laurinaitis or Chris Long — addresses the team inside the tight circle. It's an ultimate sign of respect, and pardon the schmaltz, a place of honor for the guy in the middle.

Well, guess who was in there before Sunday's 52-0 pummeling of Oakland at the Edward Jones Dome?

It was Cory Harkey, the team's unsung fullback/tight end.

"Harkey was juiced up, man," Laurinaitis said. "I mean, Harkey was about to just hurt somebody out there (during pregame). You could just tell. I don't know if he took that special energy drink, or what."

Laurinaitis was talking to a young fan on the field Sunday at the end of pregame, turned around, and saw that the squad had gathered for the huddle.

"I knew Harkey was gonna take it over because, like I said, he had that look in his eye like he was gonna run through a wall or something," Laurinaitis said.

Harkey's message?

"I have no idea what he said," Laurinaitis said. "He was just screaming, which is usually what I do. So there's no rhyme or reason. Harkey's always one of our most fired up guys before games."

If any Rams player could run through a wall, it would be Harkey. Remember the old "Saturday Night Live" skit about Bill Brasky, the unseen businessman capable of superhuman feats according to his admiring associates? Well, Harkey would be a PG-rated version of Brasky.

Last week, while Harkey was being interviewed by the Post-Dispatch, a teammate maybe 10 feet away in the locker room, shouted out in admiration: "You can't break steel! You can't break steel!"

As in Harkey is made of steel.

Offensive line coach Paul Boudreau has said Harkey frequently beats the coaches to Rams Park in the morning to get his weight-lifting in. And as everyone in the game of football knows, coaches are early risers.

Brian Schottenheimer speaks glowingly of Harkey.

"One of my favorites of all time," the Rams' offensive coordinator said. "You probably have a handful of guys that, as you look over 17 years of coaching, I think Cory Harkey's in the top two or three for sure.

"You just love his passion. You love his energy. You love the fact that it's not about getting him the ball; he doesn't want the ball. He just wants to go hit people. But what a wonderful young man. I told his father a couple weeks ago, if my son grows up to be like Cory Harkey, then I'll be extremely pleased."

Harkey's father, Mike, is the pitching coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks and a former major-league pitcher.

Things reached high point for the Harkey admiration society in the Rams' 19-17 victory over Tampa Bay in Game 2 this season. Late in the third quarter, Buccaneers safety Dashon Goldson delivered a brutal blow to Harkey's knee. The slow-motion replay was excruciating to watch, with Harkey's knee bending in an unnatural direction.

The initial read by Rams' medical officials was a potentially torn ACL. But he returned to the field a few moments later and finished out the game.

"I was not stunned to see him out there," Schottenheimer said. "If you remember two years ago in the preseason, same



type of thing happened. He got kinda hit in the leg. So nothing that Cory Harkey does amazes us."

But it amazed some teammates, to that point that Harkey got the nickname "Harkcules."

"It's just something that kinda stuck with the guys," Harkey said.

Of course, it was a variation of Hercules from Greek mythology. The son of Zeus was a pretty strong fellow, and so is Harkey.

"They guys know I like to get in the weight room and get after it with Rock (Gullickson)," Harkey said, referring to the Rams' strength coach. "I like to get in here real early and work out, and get my lifts in.

"I like being able to stay strong throughout the season, especially it being such a long season. A lot of wear and tear on you body."

Harkey has experienced plenty of wear and tear. He has been wearing a bulky knee brace since the Tampa game. Lately, he has been dealing with a thigh injury as well.

"It's been rough," he said. "I've obviously been dealing with a lot of stuff. I'm just thankful that I've been able to play through it. Obviously, there's some stuff that I'm just physically not able to do."

For one, he has been less of a factor in the passing game after working hard in the offseason and preseason to improve his pass catching and route running. He has had to finesse the knee injury, which turned out to be a strained MCL, for most of the season.

He did catch a couple of passes against Oakland, giving him six receptions this season. One of those grabs went for a 4-yard touchdown in the second quarter. And yes, he did do some blocking — his specialty — including a key block that helped spring Tre Mason on his 89-yard TD run.

"I saw my man 'Big Hark,' he came through the hole with me," Mason said. "And when both of us go through the hole, that's a pretty big hole."

OK, maybe not quite the stuff of legend. But certainly fitting for a man called Harkules. Even Schottenheimer thinks it's a fitting nickname.

"I think so, yeah," Schottenheimer said. "I certainly would see him that way."



TITLE: Ogletree is back up to speed

With six games to go, it's neck-and-neck once again for the team tackling title between linebackers James Laurinaitis and Alec Ogletree.

"Right now?" Ogletree said after Thursday's practice.

Yes, 10 games into 2014, Ogletree and Laurinaitis have 103 tackles apiece entering Sunday's contest at San Diego. "It's definitely good to have a guy like that to compete against," Ogletree said. "I definitely think he's one of the top line-backers in the league. We're just trying to be a great duo out there on the field."

After leading the Rams in tackles in each of his first four seasons in the league, Laurinaitis was edged out by Ogletree last season when Ogletree finished with 155 as a rookie to the 144 stops posted by Laurinaitis.

But it's not like either player is rushing to the Rams' PR staff after each game to check on their tackling totals.

"Tell you what, I try do whatever I can do to help the team win," Laurinaitis said. "And he'll say the same thing. At the end of the day, I don't care how many tackles — you can give me two in a game — if we get the 'W,' that's all I care about."

Right. Like Laurinaitis ever had just two tackles in a game.

In any event, for much of September and October, it didn't look like Ogletree would be competing for much of anything. He wasn't playing terribly, but he wasn't displaying the flash he did for about the final two-thirds of his rookie campaign in 2013.

On several occasions earlier this season, Ogletree lost contain on the edge, leading to some big runs on the perimeter. And at times he struggled in coverage, leading to some easy completions by the opposition. At his best, Ogletree is a runand-hit linebacker, and there were a couple of plays where there wasn't enough "run" to make the hit — that is, he didn't look as fast as usual.

But these past few games, particularly vs. Arizona and Denver, the light switch has come on in a big way.

Against Denver, he had 12 tackles, an interception and a pass breakup. The interception came on the first play of the fourth quarter when he stepped in front of a pass intended for Broncos tight end Jacob Tamme over the middle. It set up the fourth of five Greg Zuerlein field goals in the Rams' 22-7 victory.

Ogletree also snuffed out Denver's last chance for any kind of comeback with 2 ½ minutes left to play when he batted down a Peyton Manning pass on fourth-and-1 from the St. Louis 41.

A week earlier, in the 31-14 loss at Arizona, Ogletree also had 12 tackles and an interception, which he returned 44 yards. His day also included a forced fumble, two pass breakups and a quarterback hit.

"For whatever reason, he's triggering faster, and he's made the plays that have come to him," Laurinaitis said. "He made a great play in Arizona for that 'pick.' Last week, he does what he's coached to do on a seam route — makes a great catch.

"He's just flashing. For whatever reason, he's playing faster. And I like to see that out of him, because when he plays fast he can be a destructive force."

Lately, the Rams have had players "flashing" at every level of their defense — D-line, linebackers and in the secondary. And that's one reason why the unit has played so well lately. Adding Ogletree to that group recently has helped take the defense to a new level.

"Alec's playing at a really high level the last few weeks," coach Jeff Fisher said Monday. "He's making a lot of plays. I think he's got a much better feel for what he's doing.



"It took him a while to get in good shape. And we're using him a lot more behind the ball, as opposed to just lining up on the line of scrimmage and the tight end."

In the third week of November, Fisher also slipped in a line about Ogletree showing up to training camp out of shape. It's as if Fisher wanted it out there, on the record — a little nudge in Ogletree's direction not to let it happen again.

Because once the regular season arrives, and you're basically practicing only three days a week, it's hard to play yourself into shape.

When asked if he was on the sportswriters' diet during the five-week break between the conclusion of OTAs in June and the start of training camp in late July, Ogletree laughed and said: "No. I just ate a little more than what I should. But for the most part right now I feel pretty healthy and feel pretty much in shape."

Ogletree added, that he "wasn't super overweight or anything" when he reported to camp. But pro football players are like finely-tuned machines: being just a little off can make a difference.

"You definitely have to try to keep yourself in shape in the offseason," Ogletree said. "And going into this (next) year, I'll definitely do more of that. ... I should've done a better job of coming back at the right weight and stuff like that."

Meanwhile, Manning must have left St. Louis glad about one thing: Ogletree doesn't play in the same division. Because during a 2013 preseason game — the key third preseason game when the Broncos were taking their high-tempo offense out for a spin — Ogletree prevented what looked like a sure TD by knocking a Manning pass away in the end zone.

And he made a quick-reaction interception over the middle in that game in Denver, a play that had Manning shaking his head as he walked off the field.

"It's definitely exciting picking off one of the greatest players in the league," Ogletree said.

It's only three games, but it's safe to say that Rams rookie defensive tackle Aaron Donald has made a favorable first impression.

Selected with the 13th overall pick in May, the 6-foot-1, 285-pounder from the University of Pittsburgh ranks second among the team's defensive linemen with 16 overall tackles. He also has a sack and three tackles for loss.

"I've been able to make a few plays, which is good, but my focus is still working every day to try and get better," Donald said following practice earlier this week. "The game at this level is faster, much faster, and the guys you're playing against are a lot better. The offensive linemen are a lot more athletic and can move a lot better.

"The big thing for me, I think, is working to become more consistent."

Fellow defensive tackle Kendall Langford, in his seventh season, has been impressed by Donald.

"We knew he was a guy who'd won numerous awards in college; we knew he was a football player," Langford said. "His first step, his quickness off the ball, is unbelievable, and he's also strong. He's just a good football player.

"And he's stepped right in. For a lot of guys making the step from college, there's an adjustment period. But Aaron came in and just kept it going."

Donald said that being accepted right away by the defensive line made him feel comfortable — and responsible.

"When I go out there, I have to show up. I want to make plays," the 23-year-old said. "I'm learning a lot from the guys around me and I want those guys to know that they can count on me and trust me to go out and do my job."

Center Scott Wells didn't finish the final week of Rams practices in June, then missed a good portion of training camp. It was thought that he had some kind of virus, and lost some weight.

Turns out it was much worse than that, and could have been fatal had it not been treated in time.

"I had a bacterial infection from a tick bite," Wells told the Post-Dispatch. "It's called ehrlichia. It's similar to Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever. I was in intensive care for four days that last week" of offseason practices.

Wells said it started with flu symptoms, then the illness escalated quickly.

"At first, it seemed like a head cold," Wells said. "Congestion. I had an ear that was stopped up, but it wasn't infected. I would have night sweats, chills, body aches — all the same things consistent with the flu. But it wasn't flu season."

He was being treated for the symptoms, basically as if it were some sort of virus or flu. But when Wells' urine was brown — dark brown — he knew something was wrong.

He was admitted to a hospital for tests on the Wednesday afternoon of the last week of practices in June.

"Wednesday night I was put in ICU," Wells said. "From the way (doctors) explained it to me, it attacks your bone marrow and starts to shut down your immune system so you can't fight it off. Then your organs start to shut down trying to fight it off.

"So it went from what seemed to be just a cold virus, flu-like symptoms, to really sick really fast."

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the fatality rate for ehrlichia is 1.8 percent — or nearly one in 50.

Even before the blood test results came back, he was given antibiotics to treat ehrlichia. On the second day of receiving antibiotics, Wells said his temperature reached 104.5 degrees

"Then it came down pretty fast," he said. "I was on antibiotics for another 10 days. The antibiotics made everything taste funny. So I didn't have an appetite, lost a whole bunch of weight in the hospital."

Wells dropped 20 pounds during the four days he was in the hospital.

People often think of tick bites occurring in the outdoors.

Not necessarily so.

We spray our yard, and our pets weren't at home," Wells said. "They were back in Tennessee (which is where Wells is from). I mean, you can get a tick anywhere. You can get a tick in a grocery store. And the one that causes this is a small tick. They said it's like a freckle when they bite you. Half the people that get it don't even recognize it. They never find it."

Once training camp started, the Rams took a cautious approach to working Wells back into the practice routine and into preseason action because he had lost all that weight just a month before the start of camp.

"It took some time to gain the weight back," Wells said. "I was in great shape when I got sick, and the doctor said that's what helped me get through it. But I'm healthy now. I'm fine now. There's no residual long-term effects from it. Everything is normal."

Because of the severity and the unusual nature of the illness, Rams coach Jeff Fisher didn't want to reveal the information, basically leaving that up to Wells.



Now that he has been back in the lineup for the first three games of the regular season, Wells had no problem speaking of his ordeal.

"To me it's important to educate the public on this, because everybody knows (tick bites) exist," Wells said. "But until you're hit with it, you don't really understand how significant it is.

"It changed my whole perspective. If any of my kids, anybody I know, gets flu symptoms and it's not flu season, check it out. Because you'd rather know early than late."

For Wells, it was another setback — a potentially life-threatening setback — since signing a free-agent contract with the team before the 2012 season.

Wells, who had been durable during his time in Green Bay, suffered a fractured fibula last Dec. 1, missing the final four games of the season.

In 2012, a broken foot in the season opener sidelined Wells for nine games.

This summer's tick-borne illness resulted in Wells sitting out the exhibition opener, although he did play in Game 2 (against Green Bay) and Game 3 (Cleveland) of the preseason.



TITLE: Tre Mason gives Rams just what they need

Let there be no lingering doubt: Tre Mason is the St. Louis Rams' starting running back and primary ball carrier.

If that wasn't already evident before the Rams' 22-7 victory against the Denver Broncos on Sunday, it should be plenty clear in the aftermath. Against the league's best run defense both in terms of yards allowed per game (67) and yards allowed per carry (3.19), Mason registered the first 100-yard game of his career and the most rushing yards against Denver this season. He finished with 113 yards on 29 carries, a middling but deceptive average of 3.9 yards per attempt.

"That's how you have to beat this team," Rams coach Jeff Fisher said.

While that average won't blow anyone away, the fact that Mason even got to 29 carries is a feat in and of itself. The Broncos had faced the fewest rushing attempts in the league this year, in no small part because they often shut down the run early and jump out to big leads.

But Mason was effective enough early on that the offense was able to move the ball and keep Broncos quarterback Peyton Manning on the sideline. Although the Rams defense was doing just fine on its own, it's a widely accepted theory that the best defense against Manning is often a good offense, especially one that can run the ball consistently.

"You have got to have that mindset, got to get first downs, got to stay on the field," Mason said. "I was doing everything in my power to keep us on the field."

Mason and the Rams did just that, controlling the battle in time of possession by keeping the ball for 35 minutes and 50 seconds to Denver's 24:10. They had 16 first downs and rushed for 131 yards on 33 carries as a team, their best output of the season on the ground.

And while Mason spent plenty of time hammering away between the tackles, he was also also able to shake loose for a big gain every once in a while. His 27-yard run was his fourth 20-plus-yard carry of the season; he remains the only Ram to do that this season.

Clearly, the Rams trust Mason enough to turn the game over to him, too. His 29 carries were the most by a Ram this season by 10. Even if many of those runs didn't get very far, Mason's performance was instrumental in taking the Rams to an unexpected victory.

"That's just the way football is," Mason said. "Sometimes you have got to grind them out. It might not be a big play every play, but you've got to grind them out sometimes. That extra 1 or 2 [yards] means a lot when you're on the goal line, so if you're on the goal line, it can be the difference between a score and a first down."

The Rams drafted Greg Robinson to be their tackle of the future. Following Jake Long's season-ending knee injury against Kansas City, the future is now.

Robinson, the No. 2 overall pick in the 2014 draft, will make his first NFL start at left tackle Sunday in San Francisco. After four weeks of watching and learning, Robinson started the past three games at left guard.

But now he's at left tackle, the position he played all through college at Auburn. His spot.

Or as offensive coordinator Brian Schottenheimer put it: "Greg's playing a position that he's very, very comfortable with."

Robinson said: "It's just a little more natural to me. When I was at guard, I was learning. But I feel like it helped me learn the offense a lot, along with knowing what the guys on the side of me are thinking."

As the saying goes, playing guard or center is like playing in a phone booth. It's a confined space, and there isn't much time to think or adjust on the fly. The opponent gets on you quickly.

At tackle, there's a little more space, and a split-second more to think and react.

"I can use the space," Robinson said, smiling. "I'm a big guy. It's hard stay low when you're at guard and stuff like that. I'm gonna just try my best to stay focused and focus on my angles. Do my best when we get out there."

Throughout training camp and the preseason, and even early in the regular season, Robinson spent time at both guard and tackle. It didn't seem like a good idea at the time; why not concentrate on just one spot?

But now that Long is done for the year, those reps at tackle gave Robinson a bit of a base at the position and made the transition easier this week.

"We've done a lot of extra little things with him, and he understands what we're doing," coach Jeff Fisher said. "We've got all the confidence in the world in Greq. He's going to continue to get better and better."

Having a full week of practice at left tackle helped Robinson brush up on fundamentals such as pass-sets, which obviously are different at tackle than guard.

"He's working through a few things," Schottenheimer said. "The comfort level, he'll get right back into it. System-wise, he's done an amazing job with that. He's light years ahead of where he was even probably a month ago with the system."

There's not much finesse to the San Francisco defensive front. When the Rams played the 49ers just three weeks ago, it marked Robinson's first NFL start. Playing inside at left guard, he frequently ran into San Francisco star Justin Smith — a five-time Pro Bowler and one of the strongest players in the league. They had some violent collisions.

"That was a tough game, but I enjoyed it," Robinson said.

Playing left tackle, Robinson doesn't figure to see Smith as much.

"I wouldn't say I will miss it," Robinson said grinning. "But I wouldn't say won't miss it."

Besides losing Long for the season in Kansas City, the Rams also had guard Rodger Saffold (shoulder) and center Scott Wells (elbow) leave the game and not return because of injuries.

But after all was said and done this week in practice, the Rams' offensive line might not be as patchwork as initially feared. For example, Saffold and Wells were both full participants in Friday's practice and are listed as probable for the 49ers.



In Wells' case, the injury in Kansas City was muscular in nature and not a dislocation, which helps considerably in terms of a speedy return. Wells got the lion's share of the work at center Friday, but Barrett Jones and Tim Barnes got plenty of reps at center earlier in the week.

Meanwhile, Saffold continues to cope with shoulder issues that could require surgery at the end of the season. He and Mike Person shared time at left guard Friday.

"Mike understands this offense, which is big," Saffold said. "Especially for being next to Greg. He does a great job with his feet; does a good job sliding. As long as he's able to get the feel of the game down, because it's definitely gonna be a lot more physical and it's gonna be faster than practice, he'll be fine."

Before the Kansas City game, when he got 23 snaps at left guard after the line injuries took place, Person had played only four snaps on offense all season.

As for Saffold, he wasn't ready to say Friday that he would definitely be starting at left guard instead of Person.

"My biggest thing is making sure that I have myself as prepared as possible," Saffold said. "Whether that means going out and starting or even being an emergency (guy). Either way, I'm gonna be a part of the game. I'm gonna be focused."

Saffold practically lived in the trainers' room this week, spending about 16 hours getting treatment. Even so, he'll have to deal with some soreness Sunday.

"It's gonna be sore," Saffold said. "But those types of things are what you battle through anyway. It's halfway through the season — there's not a lot of people that are feeling fresh."

St. Louis Rams rookie defensive tackle Aaron Donald just won't stop making noise.

"Gosh, I wish he would stop talking so much," middle linebacker James Laurinaitis said, a grin creeping across his face.

Laurinaitis is, of course, only joking. Donald is probably the last player anyone in the Rams locker room would accuse of being too verbose. To see Donald's mouth moving is to know that he's probably been asked a question.

Soft-spoken defensive tackle Aaron Donald is emerging as one of the league's top rookies.

But while Donald isn't one to run his mouth, the part about him making noise absolutely stands. It's just that Donald announces his presence on a football field by what he does, not what he says.

"Aaron is extremely quiet; I love the way he goes about it," Laurinaitis said. "He's 100 miles per hour all the time. I've never been around a D-tackle like that. When you first see him, you're like, 'Are you kidding me?' But his quickness is uncanny for the position and he's able to be disruptive. I've been extremely impressed with him. He doesn't look at the season so far as a success for himself. I know he looks at it as, 'How can I get better?' Which I can definitely appreciate."

When it comes to Donald, there's plenty for the Rams and their fans to appreciate. When the team spent the No. 13 overall pick on Donald in May's draft, nobody questioned Donald's talent but there were plenty of questions if the Rams would be better served taking a position of more pressing need such as cornerback, receiver or even quarterback.

But the Rams' biggest need then and now remains blue-chip players capable of becoming among the league's best at their respective position. Only eight games into his career, Donald has already set his trajectory toward becoming one of those players who consistently ends every season with a trip to Hawaii.

At the halfway point of his rookie season, Donald has 21 tackles, three sacks and a forced fumble. According to the Rams' coaches review of the tape, Donald also has 11 tackles for loss, which leads the team. The coaching staff also credits Donald with 16 quarterback pressures and five quarterback hits, both of which rank second on the team.

"I think his statistics reflect the season that he's having," coach Jeff Fisher said. "The tackles for losses, the consistency, the big plays. We're just going to have to watch him because the season's getting longer and longer. First-year players have difficulty with the length of the season. We'll watch his reps, but he's playing good football right now."

The statistics don't even really tell the complete story when it comes to Donald. Take last week's goal-line stand to beat San Francisco, for example. On the game-deciding fumble by quarterback Colin Kaepernick, it was Donald who got off the snap fast and quickly lifted the 49ers' center up and backwards. That helped throw off Kaepernick's ability to cleanly take the snap and he fumbled the ball and the game away.

"He's different," Laurinaitis said. "He can go ahead and do what he wants because he's that quick that he's going to disrupt the play regardless."

The soft-spoken Donald was more than willing to talk for this story, but true to his humble nature, it's hard to get him to talk about himself. For the record, he says he believes the first half of the season has flown by and while he believes he's done "pretty good," he is quick to say he has plenty of room for improvement.

As a defensive tackle, it can be hard to draw much attention to yourself, which means Donald might have an uphill climb to land in the mix for Defensive Rookie of the Year. But it's also important to note that he's only been starting and playing extended snaps since Oct. 13.

"Anytime you get more snaps, you get a better feel for the game," Donald said. "Things start to slow down and you get a lot more comfortable out there come game time. You tend to make a lot more plays and I feel like that's been happening. But like I said, I feel like I've got a lot more improvement to do and I'm just trying to continue to build."

Now that he's playing more, his numbers and his profile should increase, even if his words per minute do not.



TITLE: Rams' E.J. Gaines unfazed by changing roles

Aside from the fact that this is indeed his first year in the NFL, there's very little about St. Louis Rams cornerback E.J. Gaines that would let you know he's only a rookie.

Gaines' game tape offers some ups and downs as many rookies have but he's also a cornerback, a position with more volatility than any on the defense. For the most part, though, Gaines has left almost anyone paying attention impressed with how the sixth-round draft pick has adapted to the NFL.

"I feel like being a rookie playing so much you have to get better as the season goes on," Gaines said. "You can't stay the same and keep using rookie as an excuse to make a mistake. I like to get out there and try to do better each and every game."

So far, Gaines has succeeded in that quest. In nine games, Gaines has 39 tackles, a fumble recovery, an interception and five pass breakups.

For what it's worth, Pro Football Focus grades Gaines as the Rams' second-best defensive player, coincidentally only behind another rookie in defensive tackle Aaron Donald. That same grading scale rates Gaines in a tie as the 11th-most productive corner in the league.

Perhaps more impressive is how Gaines has handled everything that's been thrown at him. After the third preseason game, Gaines was thrust into the starting role when Trumaine Johnson suffered a knee injury. He has since stepped in and started every game outside.

When rookie nickel corner Lamarcus Joyner suffered a groin injury against Arizona last week, Gaines had little problem sliding into the slot and taking on a different role.

"He was fine," coach Jeff Fisher said. "He got his hands on the ball. Didn't have any problems ... we didn't have to scale down the third-down package per se. He prepares mentally for it and thought he plugged in nicely.

"[It] tells you a lot about him, he's gone from outside to inside just during the course of a game."

Signs point to Gaines having to do even more work in the nickel this week against Denver with Joyner not practicing because of a groin injury. Playing in the slot against the likes of Wes Welker and Emmanuel Sanders is no easy task for any corner, never mind a rookie who hasn't spent much time playing inside where things happen faster and there's more space to cover.

But Gaines said Wednesday he doesn't expect it to be much of a problem and cited the chance to work on it more during the week as a reason he'd be better prepared to handle nickel duties than he was a week ago.

"It's a lot on my plate but I feel like I'm definitely ready for it," Gaines said. "I try not to look at myself like a rookie. I try to play like a vet. I do as many things as I can like a veteran to help this football team, help this defense out."



TITLE: T.J. McDonald carving his own path

The recent ascent of the St. Louis Rams' defense has been expected if not overdue. But it's no coincidence it has taken off in recent weeks at the same time some of its young cornerstones have begun coming into their own.

Perhaps none of those young players has made more strides over the past three weeks or so than safety T.J. McDonald.

Sometimes, that has meant putting up impressive numbers as he did two weeks ago against Arizona with nine tackles and a sack. Sometimes, it's more about the physical presence he provides, such as last week against Denver when he had five tackles and two pass breakups, but ensured that Denver pass-catchers would feel every bit of them.

On a defense loaded with more familiar names like end Robert Quinn, linebackers James Laurinaitis and Alec Ogletree, and defensive tackle Aaron Donald, it's McDonald's performance from the safety spot that has elevated the Rams' defense into one of the league's best over the past three weeks.

"It's just been tremendous growth, especially this whole season and the past few weeks in particular," fellow safety Rodney McLeod said. "The guy is showing up in every phase, whether it's special teams and on defense, tackling, pass-breakups. We've got to work on his hands a little bit, but other than that, the guy has been doing a great job for us. It's just great to see him making plays back there at a time like this when we are trying to make a push for the playoffs and we need everybody to step up and make plays for us."

In many ways, McDonald's play has been what was expected when the Rams used a third-round choice on him in the 2013 NFL draft. McDonald quickly claimed a starting spot and earned praise for how fast he was able to pick up the system. A fracture in his leg limited him to 10 games as a rookie with mixed results.

But when the Rams hired defensive coordinator Gregg Williams in the offseason, many believed McDonald was a perfect safety for his system. At 6-foot-2, 217 pounds, McDonald is the prototype of a Williams safety who can be a force near the line of scrimmage offering an additional hammer in the run game with emerging blitz skills. That McDonald wasn't known for his coverage abilities didn't figure to matter given Williams' propensity for playing with a lot of single-high safety looks, a look that would generally feature McLeod on the back end.

True to that idea, McDonald spent much of the early part of the season near the line of scrimmage, defending the run and bringing the blitz. Through the Rams' first eight games, McDonald had almost an identical split in snaps played in the run box (230) and snaps played on the back end (221).

What's interesting, though, is how much more McDonald has been asked to do in coverage over the past three weeks. Although that lines up with the arrival of Mark Barron via trade, Barron has only been heavily involved in one of those games.

According to Pro Football Focus' metrics, McDonald has played 144 of his 209 snaps over the past three weeks in coverage, which works out to about 69 percent. For what it's worth, McDonald has earned his highest grades in coverage from PFF over that same span.

"I feel like I am recognizing things faster and I am more comfortable in the defense," McDonald said. "I feel like I'm on my toes and playing downhill and having a lot of fun playing.

"I think just like any new defense, anything that's new, you have got to understand what your job is, and that was the first thing. Everybody was trying to make sure they did their job. I felt like we got a good grip on what our coaches want from us. Then it becomes 'what is the offense going to do?' Then we put that stuff together and really focus on what is going on with them."

Against the Broncos, quarterback Peyton Manning targeted McDonald seven times and came away with three completions for just 6 yards with a long of 3 yards. Even on those rare completions, McDonald was quick to lower the boom and finished with a pair of pass-breakups.



It was the type of performance that left many making the seemingly endless and easy comparisons to his father, former six-time All Pro safety Tim McDonald. But as McDonald continues to string together solid performances, maybe it's time to start letting what he does on the field stand on its own.

"I have definitely walked in his shadow for a long time," McDonald said. "I can't say I've been trying to stray away from that, but at the same time you want to be your own man and you definitely want to be known as, I want people to one day be able to say 'That's T.J.'s dad' not 'I'm Tim's son.' I have a long ways to go. I'm in no rush, I'm just trying to get better, have fun and play ball."

In a strong game for both defensive units, Rams kicker Greg Zuerlein literally provided the difference in Sunday's 22-7 victory over the visiting Denver Broncos with 16 points on five field goals and an extra point.

On Wednesday, Zuerlein was named the NFC Special Teams Player of the Week. It was the third such honor for Zuerlein, who was named twice as a rookie in 2012.

"Any time you can win an award, it's great," the third-year pro from Missouri Western said. "But that's not what you set out to do. You go out to do what you can to help your team and that's what I'm happiest about, that I did my job and helped my team.

"Haven't had a lot of chances lately — that's just the way it goes sometimes — but we got a bunch on Sunday and, yeah, it was a good time."

After successful kicks from 37, 29 and 22 yards in the opening three quarters, respectively, Zuerlein finished strong Sunday with fourth-quarter kicks from 55 and 53 yards to close out the Rams' most complete win of the season.

"In pregame, he was really crushing it, and I think having a kick each quarter helped him keep that going," Rams special teams coordinator John Fassel said. "The (honor) is very well-earned for a kid who works very hard and really has been very good all season long."

Zuerlein, who remembers kicking five field goals in a game as a college senior, has made all 20 extra points and is 15 of 18 on field goals this season, going three for three from 20-29 yards, seven for eight from 30-39 yards, two for two from 40-49 yards and three for five from 50-plus yards.

"He had one bad hit, to the right, but the other misses, he hit great balls, straight with good contact and just started out a little left," Fassel explained.

Zuerlein joins Jeff Wilkins (Oct. 1, 2000 vs. San Diego) as the only Rams' kickers to go five for five on field goals in a game. And according to NFL Communications, Zuerlein also is one of just three kickers in NFL history to go five for five with multiple kicks from 53 yards or longer.

Johnny Hekker, the Rams' punter and holder, called Zuerlein a "technician."

"He's a student of the game and takes a great deal of pride in his putting the ball where it needs to be," Hekker said. "If he's not hitting the ball correctly, he'll check his approach, his steps, where his feet are landing. He's constantly making adjustments."

Zuerlein, who had touchbacks on five of seven kickoffs Sunday, said consistency is always the goal.

"You really have to get into your own world and focus on what you do," he said. "You're going to miss some — nobody's perfect — but when you do, you have to let it go and try to make sure you're ready for that next kick."



TITLE: Davin Joseph sheds the dreads for fresh start

St. Louis Rams right guard Davin Joseph didn't practice Wednesday afternoon for what the Rams called a "coach's decision" also known as a veteran's day off. At least, we think he didn't practice.

It might have been hard to tell because Joseph was hard to recognize. Fresh off his best performance as a Ram against the Broncos last week, a performance which earned him a game ball from coach Jeff Fisher, Joseph showed up without his trademark dreadlocks.

The same dreadlocks that Joseph has been sporting for the past 12 years. To outside observers, it was a shock. To Joseph, it was even stranger.

"I feel naked right now," Joseph said, laughing. "I feel naked. I'm getting used to it. I had to buy a comb yesterday. I've got to get used to it. It's not easy."

With Joseph's 31st birthday coming up on Saturday and a new start in St. Louis, Joseph said he began thinking of the change on Tuesday and then decided to pull the trigger on making the change. According to Joseph, the haircut took about two hours with constant reminders that this is the time of year when people are usually trying to grow more hair in any effort possible to help stay warm.

Along the way, Joseph did plenty of second guessing.

"I had some thoughts of 'I don't know if this is the right move,' but once you start you can't stop," Joseph said. "So it's just like let's go with it. It's some change."

It sounds silly but Joseph is being quite serious when he says it's a big change.

For example, Joseph said he hasn't really been able to wear a hat in years and had plans to go hat shopping on Wednesday night just to see what it was like. And though he can continue to wear his same helmet, he spent some time Wednesday figuring out how much air he needed to add to it to make it fit right. When he returns the practice field, likely Thursday afternoon, he'll give that a trial run to see how it works.

"It's a big change but a good change though," Joseph said. "I'm excited about it."

For excited as the eight-year veteran might be about his new look, he's even more fired up about what he believes is an offensive line that's starting to gain traction. The Rams rushed for 131 yards against Denver's top ranked rush defense last week in no small part because of Joseph's improved production at right guard.

The always humble and affable Joseph made it clear he didn't want any individual credit.

"It was a good performance for the entire group, coming off a couple tough weeks we fought back last week against a really good defensive line," Joseph said. "We had some positive things so we're looking to just keep the momentum going forward."

Dreads or no dreads, that's the only recognition Joseph wants.

The Rams had two players selected to the Pro Bowl last season, and now both have been locked up via long-term contracts.

In signing a six-year, \$18 million extension Friday, punter Johnny Hekker is under contract with the Rams through 2020.

The team's other 2013 Pro Bowler, defensive end Robert Quinn, was signed to a four-year, \$65.5 million extension (with \$41.2 million guaranteed) on Sept. 13 that keeps him under contract through the 2019 season.

While Quinn's original contract wasn't scheduled to expire until after the 2015 season, Hekker was scheduled for restricted free agency after this season.

"We're real excited about that," coach Jeff Fisher said Friday, referring to Hekker's deal. "He's going to be our punter, and passer, for a long time."

Fisher laughed at the last part of his comment, but Hekker's passing ability on fake punts and fake field goals (as the Rams' holder) is no joke. It brings an added dimension to his game.

Fisher loves trick plays, especially on special teams. A former high school quarterback, Hekker has completed five of six career passes in the NFL as he winds down his third pro season, good for 79 yards, one touchdown and a perfect passer rating of 158.3.

Fisher said there are plenty of trick plays left in the playbook for Hekker.

"Oh yeah," Fisher said. "We've got plenty. Actually, we've got some work to do. We've got to keep loading up that play-book of his."

But obviously, it's Hekker's skill as a punter that got him his big contract, one that includes \$9 million in guaranteed money — an NFL record for a punter. Among that guaranteed money is a signing bonus of a little more than \$750,000.

Otherwise, his money for 2014 does not change. With the signing bonus deducted from the Rams' 2014 salary cap, the team has less than \$200,000 of cap space remaining for the year.

"I'm not sure this is the kind of thing that really sinks in," Hekker said. "It's just such a blessing to be considered for an extension, and to have the opportunity to stick with an organization for this long and to potentially be a Ram for nine years.

"That means a lot to me, and my family, and everyone that's supported me to this moment in my life. I think this is really a big moment, but in no way is this deterring me from still wanting to be the best punter ever. So I've got to really give this team their money's worth."

Hekker earned Pro Bowl and All-Pro honors in 2013 after setting an NFL single-season record for net punting average (44.2 yards). His gross, or overall, average in 2013 was 46.3 yards a punt.

Through 12 games this season, Hekker's 41.4 net average ranks sixth in the NFL. His overall average of 45.7 yards is tied for 14th.

His career net average of 41.9 yards per punt is third-best in the league since he joined the Rams as an undrafted rookie out of Oregon State in 2012.

"During the (pre-draft) evaluation process when we came in here, obviously he was a tremendous athlete," Fisher said. "People were talking about how he dunks the basketball and does all that, and then his ability to throw the football and what he'd done in high school and (college).

"That's the kind of guy that we want back there running the punt team for us. He's got a great group of teammates around him. He's got a really fine long snapper (Jake McQuaide), and he's got a lot of good years ahead of him."



The Rams actually began working on an extension last spring. But there were starts and stops in the process. After Quinn's deal got done in September, Hekker said he got a feeling that he might be next in line.

"Getting this thing done was kind of a laborious process, but they did a great job," Hekker said.

All things considered, it's been a laborious process for Hekker to reach this point, and this level of security.

"I scratched and clawed for that first contract just to get in the league," Hekker said. "Just as I scratched and clawed in college to earn a scholarship. And I'm not gonna stop that train of thought. There's still a lot of work to go ... to be worthy of this contract."

The days are long gone when you could get an established punter for \$1 million a year or so. A contract averaging \$3 million a year for a punter may sound like a lot, but consider this: The 2014 transition number, or yearly average of the 10 highest-paid punters and place-kickers, was over \$3.2 million.

So while Hekker's contract puts him in the high-rent district for his position, he's certainly not at the top of the list.

"It's awesome when you get paid like that to kick a football," place-kicker Greg Zuerlein said. "I love Johnny to death. I'm so happy for him. It couldn't happen to a better guy. He works hard."

The punter, place-kicker, and long snapper are always a tight-knit trio on any team, but that's especially the case with Hekker, Zuerlein, and McQuaide.

When asked if he should at least buy Zuerlein and McQuaide a nice dinner now that he's a millionaire, Hekker replied: "They'll get more than a dinner, yeah."

"I think he's probably jerking your chain a little bit," Zuerlein said, laughing loudly. "I don't know. I don't think we'll ask him for anything."

Except for long, high punts — and the occasional pass.
