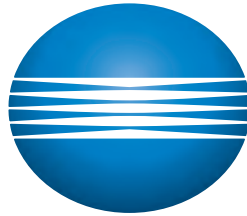

RAMS WRAP UP PRESEASON IN NEW ORLEANS

Los Angeles, Calif. - The Los Angeles Rams (2-1) complete their preseason slate against the New Orleans Saints (2-1) in the Big Easy.

The Rams won back-to-back games at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum using the legs of rookie RB John Kelly, who has recorded at least 13 rushes in each of the team's first three preseason games. The rookie's 197 rushing yards ranks second in the NFL. Kelly has posted three rushing touchdowns on 46 carries and averages 4.3 yards per rush. The Tennessee product is tied for the league lead in rushing touchdowns (three) through the first three weeks of the 2018 preseason.

Defensively, L.A.'s starting unit saw its first action of the preseason and forced a pair of interceptions with S Lamarcus Joyner and CB Sam Shields each coming away with a pick. The Rams defense held the Texans to a two-of-nine (22 percent) showing on third down attempts.

Offensively for L.A., the Rams began the second half with a 19-play 75-yard drive that chewed up 12:06 of clock, capped off with a 15-yard touchdown run by Kelly, his second score of the day. The Rams finished the contest converting 11-of-17 (65 percent) of their third-down tries.

The Rams will open the 2018 regular season with the last game of the Week 1 slate, the second game of a double-header on ESPN's Monday Night Football, at the Oakland Raiders.

COACHES' CORNER



On January 12, 2017, Los Angeles Rams Owner/Chairman E. Stanley Kroenke named Sean McVay the 23rd full-time head coach in franchise history. McVay became the youngest coach in modern NFL history.

In his first season guiding the Rams, McVay completed one of the greatest offensive turnarounds in NFL history. He helped the Rams move from the 32nd-ranked scoring offense in 2016 to the league's top-scoring team in 2017, marking the first time in league history a team has gone from last to first in scoring. The first-year head coach led the Rams to an 11-5 record and their first NFC West title since the 2003 season, earning the team's first playoff berth since 2004.

Following his first season in L.A., McVay was named The Associated Press Coach of the Year, becoming the youngest head coach to ever win the award. RB Todd Gurley II brought home Offensive Player of the Year, marking the first time in the 45-year history of the awards there was a sweep of three of the league's top awards. The Rams placed eight players in the 2018 Pro Bowl, the most in a single season by the franchise since the 1999 campaign.

Year honors, while DT Aaron Donald was named the Defensive Player of the Year, marking the first time in the 45-year history of the awards there was a sweep of three of the league's top awards. Under McVay's guidance in 2017, second-year QB Jared Goff flourished. Goff completed 296-of-477 (62.1 percent) of his passes for 3,804 yards with 28 touchdowns and seven interceptions posting a 100.5 QB rating on the season. Gurley led the league in scrimmage yards finishing the year with 2,093 yards, including 1,305 rushing yards and 788 receiving yards. Additionally, Gurley was the league's highest scoring non-kicker posting 19 total touchdowns on the season.

The Rams defense posted the fourth-most sacks (48.0), tied for sixth in interceptions (18) and finished the 2017 campaign fifth in total takeaways with 28 on the season. The 28 takeaways directly resulted in 126 points for L.A., the second-best total in the NFL.

In his first season as head coach, the Rams special teams unit played an integral part in the team's success and was rewarded with a total of four special teamers being named to the Pro Bowl. The L.A. special teams unit was a top-10 finisher in 18 of the 22 statistical categories in the 2017 special-teams rankings.

McVay completed his third season as the Redskins' offensive coordinator in 2016 after initially being promoted to the position on January 15, 2014. Prior to his promotion during the 2014 offseason, McVay spent three seasons as the team's tight ends coach and one as an offensive assistant.

The 2016 Redskins' offensive unit broke many franchise records and ranked in the top three in a number of statistical categories. The Washington offense became the first unit in franchise history to average over 400 yards per game (403.4) and notched a franchise record 6,545 total net yards. Quarterback Kirk Cousins finished the year with single-season team records in completions (406) and passing yards (4,917) and matched his team record for 300-yard passing games (seven). His 4,917 passing yards ranked third in the NFL in 2016 and are the 15th-most in a season in NFL history. Cousins closed out the season ranked second in the NFL in passing yards per game (297.4), passing yards per play (7.84) and yards per play (6.4), in addition to being the league's third ranked offensive team, averaging 403.4 yards per game.

From 2015-16, Cousins threw for 9,083 yards, the fourth highest output by a quarterback trailing only Drew Brees (10,078), Matt Ryan (9,535) and Philip Rivers (9,178). The Redskins offense had eight players finish the season with at least 500 yards from scrimmage (DeSean Jackson, Pierre Garcon, Jamison Crowder, Rob Kelley, Chris Thompson, Jordan Reed, Vernon Davis and Matt Jones), tying the 2011 New Orleans Saints for the most in a single season in NFL history.

McVay's group posted a breakout campaign in his second year as offensive coordinator in 2015, including record-setting performances by quarterback Kirk Cousins and tight end Jordan Reed. McVay's scheme and tutelage helped Cousins break Redskins records for attempts (543), completions (379), passing yards (4,166) and 300-yard passing games (seven) in a single season.

Collectively, McVay's 2015 offense recorded top-10 rankings in third down percentage (43.5, fifth in the NFL), red zone scoring percentage (61.2, eighth), yards per play (5.6, 10th) and points per game (24.3, 10th). The Redskins also led the NFL with a team-record 69.5 completion percentage in 2015, leading the league in the category for the 11th time in team history and the first time since 1970.

In his first season as offensive coordinator in 2014, McVay helped the offense to a Top 10 league ranking in yards per play (5.7) despite starting three different quarterbacks. His work with the three passers was instrumental in setting a team record for completion percentage (66.5 percent, later broken in 2015) and helping facilitate the explosive debut season of wide receiver DeSean Jackson.

In 2013, McVay played a crucial role in Reed's development, as the then-rookie compiled 45 receptions for 499 yards – both Redskins' single-season rookie tight end records – despite Reed playing in only nine games.

During Washington's NFC East championship season in 2012, McVay's unit was productive despite losing starting tight end Fred Davis to a torn Achilles tendon in Week 7. Davis had led the team in both receptions (24) and receiving yards (325) through seven games before being placed on the Reserve/Injured list.

In 2011, McVay played an integral role in Davis' emergence, as the then fourth-year tight end surpassed his previous career highs despite playing in only 12 games. Davis caught 59 passes for 796 yards, the second-highest total on the team in both categories.

McVay served as an offensive assistant to the Redskins in 2010 in addition to working with the tight ends during the final four weeks of the season following coach Jon Embree's departure. McVay joined the Redskins prior to the 2010 season after an undefeated regular season with the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League (UFL). The Tuskers finished a perfect 6-0 before losing in the UFL's inaugural championship game. McVay originally entered the National Football League as an offensive assistant with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2008.

McVay graduated from Miami University (Ohio) where he played wide receiver from 2004-07, earning Miami's Scholar-Athlete Award in 2007. His grandfather, John, served in various roles – including vice president/director of football operations from 1983-94 – for the San Francisco 49ers from 1979-95, overseeing five Super Bowl championship squads and earning induction into the 49ers Hall of Fame in 2013.



Since he was hired as head coach of the New Orleans Saints in 2006, Sean Payton has established himself as one of the most successful coaches in the NFL. Payton has led the Saints to six playoff berths, four NFC South division titles and in 2009 captured the franchise's first World Championship with a 31-17 win over the Indianapolis Colts in Super Bowl XLIV.

Payton has a 112-76 overall record (.596), including a 7-5 postseason mark (.583) after the franchise had won only one playoff game prior to his arrival. Payton holds the club's top win total and winning percentage for a head coach.

As Payton enters the 2018 campaign he continues to represent the Saints as the model of stability not only within the NFC South, as he is the longest tenured head coach within the division, but also within the National Football League as only New England's Bill Belichick (2000), Cincinnati's Marvin Lewis (2003) and Green Bay's Mike McCarthy (hired one week prior to Payton in 2006) have been with their teams longer. Payton is also one of just eight active coaches to lead a team to a Super Bowl victory. The others are Belichick, Seattle's Pete Carroll, Oakland's Jon Gruden (with Tampa Bay in 2002), Baltimore's John Harbaugh, McCarthy, Philadelphia's Doug Pederson and Pittsburgh's Mike Tomlin.

Payton's presided over the NFL's most prolific offense since his arrival, leading the league in net yards per game in 2006, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2014 and 2016, and finishing first in scoring in 2008 and 2009. These are the only six times the Saints have led the NFL in offense. Ranking in the top ten offensively every season since Payton arrived, the Saints have the third-longest streak (12 seasons) in the NFL since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger. In team history, the Saints have scored at least 45 points on 21 separate occasions with 17 of these outputs occurring under Payton's watch, including two in 2017. Defensively, New Orleans has finished in the top five twice (2010 and 2013). He has also sent a total of 44 selections to the Pro Bowl and earned the honor of coaching the NFC squad following the 2006 and 2017 seasons.

The 2017 Saints produced an 11-5 regular season record, producing their first playoff berth since 2013, behind a squad that led by QB Drew Brees offensively and DE Cameron Jordan defensively featured seven players selected to the Pro Bowl, tied for the most in club history and four draft picks selected to the PFWA All-Rookie Team, two more than any other club. In RB Alvin Kamara and CB Marshon Lattimore, the 2017 Saints were the first team to have both the Associated Press NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year and Defensive Rookie of the Year since 1967. New Orleans, one of three NFC South teams to make the postseason, upended Carolina (11-5) and Atlanta (10-6) to finish first in the division and advanced to the Divisional Playoff round after capturing a 31-26 Wild Card victory over the Panthers in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. The Saints' bid to reach their third NFC Championship game under Payton was cut short in Minnesota, where New Orleans fell to the Vikings 29-24, after coming back from a 17-0 halftime deficit to hold a 24-23 fourth quarter lead during a thrilling battle.

Offensively, New Orleans was the only team to rank in the top five in the NFL in both rushing yards per game (129.4) and net passing yards per game (261.8), while giving up only 20 sacks, the second lowest total in the league and turning the ball over a franchise-low 18 times. Brees was selected to his club-record tenth Pro Bowl as a Saint as he completed 386-of-536 passes (72.0%) with 23 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 103.9 rating. Brees' completion percentage set an NFL record. His eight picks were his lowest total as a Saint. RBs Mark Ingram II and Alvin Kamara and WR Michael Thomas provided additional highlights on offense. Kamara led the team with 1,544 total yards from scrimmage, seventh in the NFL, as he carried 120 times for 728 yards with eight touchdowns and led NFL running backs in receiving yardage with 82 grabs for 826 yards and five touchdowns. His 6.1 yards per carry led the NFL. Adding a 106-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in Week 17, the longest play in club history, he set the club rookie record for touchdowns (14). Ingram ranked second on the club with 1,540 total yards from scrimmage as he and Kamara became the first running back duo in NFL history to each reach 1,500 yards. Ingram led the team in rushing with 230 carries for a career-high 1,124 yards and career-best 12 touchdowns. Thomas set a club record with 104 receptions for 1,245 yards and five scores. In addition to Brees, Ingram, Kamara and Thomas, RG Larry Warford, a free agent acquisition, also was named to his first Pro Bowl.

The Saints defense saw improvement in virtually every major statistical category. New Orleans moved up ten spots in total defense, including from 32nd to 15th against the pass. After ranking 31st in opponent points per game in 2016, New Orleans moved up to tenth in 2017, surrendering only 20.4 points per game. Led by Jordan, a first-team Associated Press All-Pro who posted a career-high 13 sacks, New Orleans racked up 42 takedowns (tied for seventh in the NFL). Lattimore, who led NFL rookies with five interceptions, joined Jordan as a Pro Bowl selection.

On special teams, New Orleans ranked sixth in the NFL in kickoff return average (22.9), as Kamara brought back the team's first kickoff for a touchdown since 2009 and K Wil Lutz tied the single-season franchise record with 31 field goals.

Since his first year as a play-caller in 2000, every passer under Payton's guidance has thrown for over 3,000 yards. In addition to Brees since 2006, the three starters he worked with in Dallas - Drew Bledsoe in 2005, Vinny Testaverde in 2004 and Quincy Carter in 2003 - all surpassed the milestone. While in New York, Giants QB Kerry Collins had 4,073 yards in 2002.

Payton wrapped two coaching stints at San Diego State University (1988-89 and 1992-93) around a stop at Indiana State (1990-91). During his second stretch with the Aztecs, Payton was running backs coach, working with Heisman Trophy runner-up Marshall Faulk before becoming quarterbacks coach.

Following the 1993 season, Payton moved to Miami (Ohio) (1994-95) where he was quarterbacks coach. He spent 1996 as quarterbacks coach at Illinois before entering the NFL with Philadelphia.

Payton earned a bachelor's degree in communications at Eastern Illinois, where as a quarterback he had 10,665 passing yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. The three-time AP All-American selection had professional stints with Chicago of the Arena Football League, Ottawa of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Payton was inducted into the Eastern Illinois Hall of Fame in September of 2000 and had his jersey retired in a ceremony in September of 2010. He received an honorary doctorate from his alma mater in 2013.

Payton was born Dec. 29, 1963 in San Mateo, Calif., and raised in Naperville, Ill., as he has a daughter, Meghan and a son, Connor.

OFFENSE

WR Cooper Kupp – During the 2017 regular season, led the team in receiving yards (869) and ranked second in receptions (62). Scored his first professional touchdown in Week 1 by way of an 18-yard pass from QB Jared Goff. Totalled five receiving touchdowns in his rookie season. Posted first-career 100-plus receiving yard game with 116 yards receiving in a 26-20 win over New Orleans in a Week 12 contest. Played in the Wild Card game against the Falcons, hauling in eight receptions for 69 yards and a touchdown. Kupp is the first Rams rookie in franchise history to catch eight passes in a postseason game.

TE Tyler Higbee – Played in 32 career regular season games with 23 starts, including all 16 contests of the 2017 regular season. Recorded 25 receptions for 295 yards and a touchdown a season ago. Posted a career-best 98 yards receiving on four receptions against the Seahawks in a Week 5 contest.

LT Andrew Whitworth – 13th-year pro has started 179-of-183 career regular season games played and started all seven postseason games he has played in. Helped provide time for Goff to throw for a career-best 146.8 QB rating in Week 9 51-17 win at the New York Giants. Voted a team captain by his peers in his first season with the Rams. Named to his fourth-career Pro Bowl following the 2017 campaign.

LG Rodger Saffold – Ninth-year pro has started 95-of-98 career regular season games played, including 15 games of the 2017 campaign at LG. Has started at four different positions in 95 career starts - 39 at LG, 38 at LT, 13 at RG, and five at RT. Made his postseason debut starting at LG in the Wild Card round against Atlanta, blocking for Gurley to rush for 101 yards, first Rams running back to notch a 100-plus yard game in his postseason debut since Jim Gillette had 17 carries for 101 yards vs. Washington (12/16/45).

C John Sullivan – Started 109-of-137 career regular season games played, all at the center position. Helped provide a pocket for QB Jared Goff to throw for a career-best 355 yards in Week 10 win over Houston. Paved the way for RB Todd Gurley II to amass 2,093 yards from scrimmage through 15 games played. Has appeared in five playoff games with four starts, including the Wild Card game versus Atlanta.

RG Jamon Brown – A third-round selection (No. 72 overall) by the Rams in the 2015 NFL Draft. Started 30-of-36 career regular season games played, primarily at RG, including all 16 contests of the 2017 campaign. Started the Rams Wild Card contest against the Falcons. According to Pro Football Focus, was the only Rams player in 2017 to play over 1,000 snaps, leading the team with 1,031 snaps played, 99.81% of the team's offensive plays.

RT Rob Havenstein – Fourth-year pro, started all 43 career regular season games played and the 2017 Wild Card contest, has committed only 10 penalties in 43 games. A second-round selection (No. 57 overall) by the Rams in the 2015 NFL Draft. Provided blocking for RB Todd Gurley II to rush for 101 yards, first Rams running back to notch a 100-plus yard game in his postseason debut since Jim Gillette had 17 carries for 101 yards vs. Washington (12/16/45).

WR Brandin Cooks – Acquired by the Rams via a trade that sent the Rams 2018 first-round pick to the Patriots. Signed a five-year contract extension prior to reporting to training camp. Fifth-year pro has played in 58 regular season games with 46 starts. Posted at least 1,000 yards receiving in each of the last three seasons. Recorded 280 career receptions for 2,943 yards and 27 touchdowns. Averages 14.1 yards per reception with a 98-yard touchdown as his longest reception. Has nine 100-plus yard receiving games with a career-best 186 yards coming against the Arizona Cardinals in 2016 when Cooks played with the Saints.

WR Robert Woods – The USC product has played in 69 regular season games with 59 starts through the 2017 regular season and started his lone playoff game. Established a career-best 171 yards receiving vs. Houston in a week 10 win. Totalled 56 catches for a 781 yards through 12 games played last season. Led the team in receptions (nine) and receiving yards (142) against the Falcons in the NFC Wild Card game. Woods' 142 receiving yards are the fourth-highest output in a single postseason game in Rams history and is the fourth receiver in franchise history to post 100-plus receiving yards in their postseason debut with the Rams.

QB Jared Goff – Started all 22 regular season games he has played in as a professional and his first playoff contest. During the 2017 regular season, completed 296-of-477 passing attempts with 28 touchdowns, seven interceptions and a 100.5 QB rating. Established a career-best 355 yards passing vs. Houston in Week 10 win and a career-high 146.8 QB rating in Week 9 win at New York Giants, a game in which he averaged 22.2 yards per completion. Completed 24-of-45 passes for 259 yards and one touchdown, the 45 pass attempts is tied for the second-most in postseason history with Kurt Warner, vs. Tennessee (1/30/00 - SB XXXIV) and Jim Everett, at Minnesota (12/26/88).

RB Todd Gurley II – Posted 2,093 yards from scrimmage in 15 regular season games this season and 19 total touchdowns in 2017, both are single-season career bests. Recorded 279 rushing attempts for 1,305 yards (4.7 yards/rush) with 13 rushing touchdowns. Led the team with 64 receptions for 788 yards (second-highest total on the team) and six receiving touchdowns. Named the NFC Offensive Player of the Month for September and December and named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for the team's Week 4 win at Dallas and Week 15 win at Seattle. Rushed 14 times for 101 yards, in his playoff debut against Atlanta, becoming the first Rams running back to notch a 100-plus yard game in his postseason debut since Jim Gillette had 17 carries for 101 yards vs. Washington (12/16/45).

KEY CONTRIBUTOR

TE Gerald Everett – Second-year pro has played in all 16 regular season games and one playoff contest with two regular season starts. Hauled in 16 receptions for 244 yards and two touchdowns as a rookie in 2017. Averaged 15.3 yards per reception, with his longest reception netting 69 yards. Tallied one rushing attempt for a 13-yard gain.

DEFENSE

DE Michael Brockers – The seventh-year pro started 89-of-91 career regular season games played. Led all Rams defensive linemen with 65 tackles, including 41 solo stops, eight tackles for a loss, 4.5 sacks and four passes defended during the 2017 regular season. The LSU product has 19.0 career sacks, eight passes defended, two forced fumbles and one fumble recovery. Started his playoff debut, a Wild Card contest against the Falcons. Recorded 0.5 sack in 2017 Wild Card contest, a sack split with DT Aaron Donald.

NT Ndamukong Suh – Ninth-year pro has started all 126 career games played, including all 16 regular season games over the last six seasons. Totalled 51.5 career-sacks resulting in 339 yards lost. Joined the Rams as a free agent during the 2018 offseason. A five-time Pro Bowler, has been named first-team All-Pro three times and second-team All-Pro twice. Recorded seven multi-sack games, including five games with 2.0 sacks, most recently against the Texans in 2015, as a member of the Dolphins organization.

DT Aaron Donald – Four-time Pro Bowler has started 58-of-62 regular season games played. Recorded 52 tackles including 31 solo and 16 tackles for a loss, a team-best 11.0 sacks and five forced fumbles during the 2017 regular season. In the team's Week 3 contest, his second game of the season, corralled 49ers QB Brian Hoyer for a game-clinching sack. Tallied at least 1.0 sack in seven of the team's last 10 games. Matched a career-best 3.0 sacks in Week 15 win over Seattle. Started the team's Wild Card contest against Atlanta, posted five tackles, 0.5 sack, one tackle for loss and one QB hit in postseason debut.

OLB Samson Ebukam – Second-year pro out of Eastern Washington played in all 16 regular season games with two starts in 2017. Tallied 38 tackles during the regular season, including 18 solo stops and 2.0 sacks and one forced fumble. First-career sack came in a Week 10 win over Houston. Appeared in the 2017 Wild Card contest against the Falcons, finishing with one tackle.

OLB Matt Longacre – Fourth-year pro has played in 25 games with one start entering the 2018 season. Recorded a career-best 5.5 sacks in 14 games played a season ago. Tallied 15 QB hurries, eight tackles for loss, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery in his career.

LB Cory Littleton – Third-year pro has played in all 32 regular season games and one playoff game since joining the team as an undrafted free agent following the 2016 NFL Draft. Earned five career starts, including four during the 2017 campaign. Tallied four passes defended, three quarterback hurries, two tackles for loss, one forced fumble, one interception and 1.0 sack.

LB Mark Barron – Seventh-year pro out of Alabama started 81-of-92 career regular season games played. Ranked second on the team with 108 total tackles including a team-high 80 solo stops during the regular season. Transitioned for a pure safety to a hybrid linebacker role, before settling in as a true linebacker under Defensive Coordinator Wade Phillips' 3-4 defense. In the team's Week 5 contest with the Seahawks, registered a team-high 18 total tackles. Was one-of-two Rams defenders to record at least 10 tackles in 2017 Wild Card game against Atlanta, finishing second with 10 total tackles in his playoff debut.

CB Aqib Talib – 11th-year professional, acquired via trade during 2018 offseason. Played in 135 regular season games with 121 starts. Recorded a 103-yard interception returned for a touchdown in 2017. Has 10 career pick-sixes, two short of matching the all-time NFL record for interceptions returned for touchdowns (12) set by Rod Woodson. Started all eight postseason games he has appeared in, including Super Bowl 50, as a member of the Denver Broncos playing for Rams Defensive Coordinator Wade Phillips. Five-time Pro Bowler, most recently following the 2016 season.

CB Marcus Peters – Fourth-year pro joined the Rams via a trade with the Kansas City Chiefs in the 2018 offseason. A 2016 First-Team All-Pro was the No. 18 overall selection in the 2015 NFL Draft by the Chiefs out of Washington. Since entering the league in 2015, has recorded 19 interceptions, most in the NFL during that span. Started all 45 career games played, including 14 last season. Named to consecutive Pro Bowls following the 2015 and 2016 seasons.

FS Lamarcus Joyner – Tallied first-career INT and returned it 29 yards for a TD in Week 1 win over the Colts. Recorded 61 total tackles during the 2017 campaign, including 32 solo tackles, seven passes defended and one forced fumble. Tied for a team-best three interceptions in 12 games played during the regular season. Led the team with 11 total tackles, including 10 solo stops in his playoff debut against the Falcons.

SS John Johnson III – Second-year pro out of Boston College played in all 16 regular season games for the Rams with 11 starts during the 2017 season. Earned first-career start in team's Week 5 game against the Seahawks, recorded first-career interception and returned it 69 yards setting up a FG. Recorded 87 total tackles on the season, including 51 solo stops and 11 passes defended on the season. Posted a team-high 13 total tackles in Week 14 loss to Philadelphia. Started Wild Card contest against Atlanta and finished with six total tackles.

KEY CONTRIBUTORS

CB Nickell Robey-Coleman – Fifth-year CB earned first start as a Ram in a Week 2 contest. Tallied two tackles and one pass defended in his L.A. debut. Registered 50 total tackles, including 36 solo with two interceptions and nine passes defended during the 2017 regular season. Played in 79 career games with 19 starts in his career. Posted five career interceptions and two returned for touchdowns. Played in his first playoff game against the Falcons, tallied three tackles and one pass defended in postseason action.

DL Ethan Westbrooks – Fifth-year professional has played in 51 career regular season games with 11 starts, including nine starts during the 2017 regular season. Posted 28 tackles, including 16 solo, seven tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks, five quarterback hits and one pass defended a season. Started his first-career playoff game against Atlanta, recorded three total tackles in playoff debut.

COORDINATORS' CORNER



RUN AND PASS GAME COORDINATORS

Aaron Kromer, Run Game Coordinator: Aaron Kromer begins his second season with the Los Angeles Rams, his first season serving as the team's run game coordinator.

In his first season with the Rams, Kromer served as the offensive line coach overseeing the most stable offensive line unit in the NFL during the 2017 season. With the help of Kromer and the offensive coaching staff, the Rams improved from the 32nd ranked scoring team in 2016 to the league's top-scoring team in 2017.

Under Kromer's guidance, the offensive line blocked for RB Todd Gurley II, who was named The Associated Press Offensive Player of the Year after leading the league in scrimmage yards (2,093) and total touchdowns (19).

A veteran of more than 17 years as an offensive line coach, Kromer came to Los Angeles prior to the 2017 season after serving the past two seasons in the same capacity with the Buffalo Bills. In his 18 years as an NFL offensive line coach or coordinator, Kromer has helped 16 players earn a total of 23 Pro Bowl appearances.

Shane Waldron, Pass Game Coordinator: Waldron is entering his seventh NFL season, second with the Los Angeles Rams and his first season serving as the team's passing game coordinator.

Under Waldron's guidance in 2017, the tight end duo of Tyler Higbee and Gerald Everett combined for 539 yards, three touchdowns and averaged 13.1 yards per reception. Everett recorded a 69-yard reception in his second game as a professional which tied for the second-longest reception by a tight end during the 2017 season.

Previously, Waldron served as the Washington Redskins offensive quality control coach for the 2016 season. That season, Washington's offense broke the franchise record for total net yards in a single season (6,454), surpassing the previous team record set in 1989.

FASSEL'S FLYERS

The Rams have developed a reputation for delivering the unexpected in the kicking game, and special teams coordinator John Fassel is at the helm of the trickery that has helped the Rams become one of the NFL's best when it comes to special teams.

In 2017, the special teams unit played an integral part in the Rams success and was rewarded with a total of four special teamers being named to the Pro Bowl in PR/KR. Pharoh Cooper, P Johnny Hekker, LS Jake McQuaide and K Greg Zuerlein. Zuerlein led the league in scoring (158 points), despite playing in only 14 games before being placed on season-ending injured reserved.

The Rams special teams unit was a top-10 finisher in 18 of the 22 statistical categories in the 2017 special-teams rankings. There were only 11 punts blocked league-wide on the season, and the Rams had three of them. LB Cory Littleton was the only player in the NFL to block two punts. In total, the Rams blocked a total of five kicks in 2017.

In addition to his special teams duties, Fassel served as interim head coach for the final three games of the 2016 season.

PHILLIPS' PHILOSOPHIES

Wade Phillips, who is in his 49th year of coaching, enters his second season with the Rams as defensive coordinator on Head Coach Sean McVay's staff.

A veteran coach entering his 41st NFL season, Phillips owns 36 years of experience as a defensive coordinator or head coach. Phillips continued his streak of helping teams to the playoffs in his first season with the organization when the Rams clinched the NFC West, marking the eighth-straight team that has made the postseason in Phillips' first year with the organization.

In his first season with the Rams in 2017, he guided a defense that finished fourth in sacks (48.0), tied for sixth in interceptions (18) and finished fifth in total takeaways with 28 on the season. The 28 takeaways directly resulted in 126 points for L.A., the second-best total in the NFL.

DT Aaron Donald was named AP Defensive Player of the Year for his efforts, becoming the first player in Rams history to ever earn DPOY. In 2017, Donald racked up 52 tackles, 31 solo (according to coaches' stats), 11.0 sacks for 95 yards, five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and two passes defended, despite playing in only 14 games. Donald had team highs in sacks (11.0), quarterback hits (27) and forced fumbles (5).

Prior to joining the Rams, Phillips served as defensive coordinator for the Denver Broncos (2015-16), which was his second stint with the club after serving the same role from 1989-92, and also as head coach from 1993-94.

Phillips has been a part of 21 different top-10 defensive units during his NFL career and has coached a total of 31 Pro Bowlers. He is one of three individuals in NFL history to be named Assistant Coach of the Year multiple times by the Pro Football Writers of America, being honored with that distinction in 2011 with Houston and in 2015 with Denver. Phillips also received the Paul "Dr. Z" Zimmerman Award from the PFWA in 2016 (lifetime achievement as an NFL assistant coach).

RUN ROOKIE, RUN

Kelly recorded 77 yards on 13 attempts (5.9 yards per rush) against the Ravens and followed it up with 56 yards on 18 rushing attempts (3.1 yards per rush) against the Raiders. Against the Texans, Kelly rushed 15 times for 64 yards (4.3 yards per rush) and two rushing touchdowns.

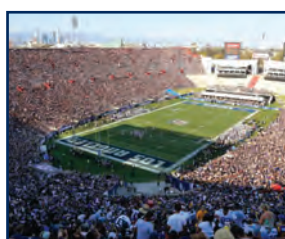

Defensively, all seven selections were used to bolster the Rams defensive front-seven.

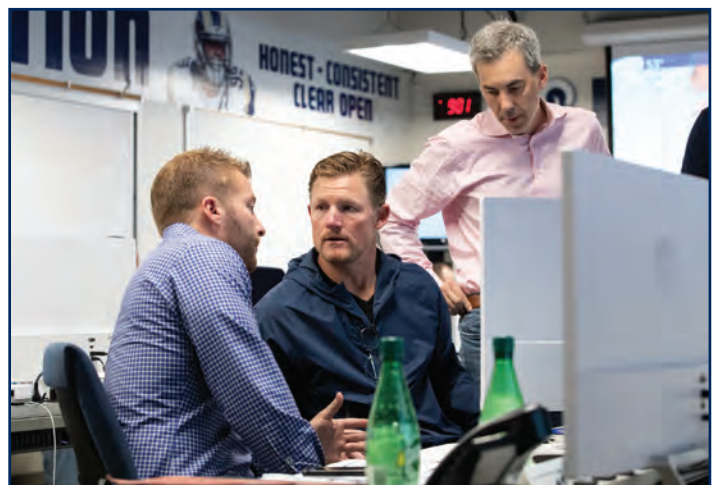

DOMINATING THE DIVISION

The Rams entered Week 17 with a two game lead in the NFC West and an 11-4 record when they decided to rest their starters against the 49ers. The Rams finished 4-2 against divisional opponents during the 2017 campaign.

After defeating the Seahawks at CenturyLink Field on Dec. 17, the Rams moved to 3-0 on the road against teams in the NFC West, the first time a Rams team has accomplished this feat since the 2001 Rams went 4-0 on the road in the then five team NFC West.

The Rams outscored their divisional opponents 171-112 last season, which was a 59 point differential. It is the highest positive point differential in the division for the Rams since the 2001 Rams outscored their divisional opponents 274-160 for a 114 point differential. The 2001 Rams played in a five team division and therefore had eight divisional games that season.

The Rams also posted 30-plus points against all three of their divisional opponents last season. The 2002 Rams were the last team to accomplish that feat.

Rams Head Coach Sean McVay immediately fixed the team's scoring issues, surpassing the 224 points scored in 2016 in only eight games in 2017. The Rams not only improved, they went from worst to first in total scoring and points per game from the 2016 to the 2017 season with 478 points scored and averaged 29.9 points per game.

The Rams scored 30-plus points nine times during the 2017 regular season, a feat the team achieved only three times in the previous two seasons combined.

The 2018 NFL Draft marked the 82nd draft for the Rams franchise dating back to the second-ever NFL draft in 1937. The team has not had a first-round selection in only nine of those drafts, most recently in 2018.

The season following a draft in which the team didn't make a selection in the first round, the Rams went on to win at least 10 games on five different occasions (1967, 1968, 1973, 1984, 2017), including three seasons where the Rams claimed the NFC West title (1967, 1973, 2017).

Additionally, five of the franchise's 21 ties have come the season following a draft that the Rams didn't make a first-round selection.

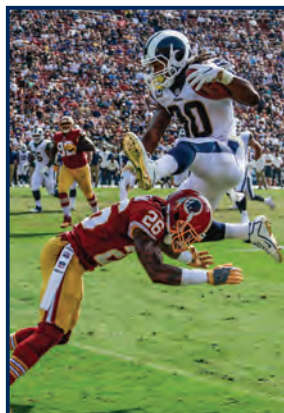

There were five Rams honored 10 times during the 2017 campaign with two NFC Special Teams Players of the Week, four NFC Offensive Players of the Week, one NFC Defensive Player of the Week, two NFC Offensive Players of the Month and two Special Teams Players of the Month.

RB Todd Gurley II was named the NFC Offensive Player of the Month for September last season. Gurley rushed 63 times for 241 yards and four rushing touchdowns and recorded 13 receptions for 140 yards and two touchdowns in the month of September. Gurley's six touchdowns led the NFC and were tied for first in the NFL in the

opening month of the 2017 season. A week after being named NFC Player of the Month for the first three games of the 2017 season, Gurley led the team in rushing (121 yards) and receiving (94 yards) to account for a then career-best 215 yards from scrimmage, earning a 35-30 win over the Cowboys and his first-career NFC Offensive Player of the Week accolades. Gurley was also named player of the week in Week 15. Gurley became the first RB to receive the weekly award back-to-back weeks since the award started in 1984.

K Greg Zuerlein booted his way into the Rams history books in the Week 4 win over Dallas with a 7-of-7 showing on field goal attempts, establishing a new franchise record for single-game made field goals and posting 23 points en route to his first NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors since the 2014 season. Zuerlein was named the NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for October 2017, his first-career player of the month accolades. Zuerlein continued his hot streak becoming the first player in NFL history to be named the NFC Special Teams Player of the month in back-to-back months.

WR/Returner Pharoh Cooper earned his first-career Player of the Week Accolades following the Week 6 win over Jacksonville, taking the opening kickoff 103 yards to pay dirt and tying a franchise record for longest kickoff return.

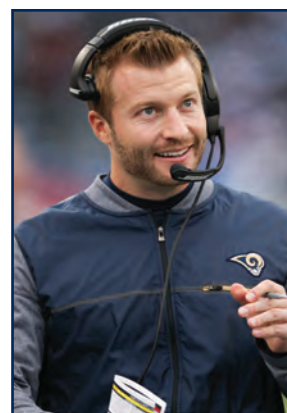

COACH 'EM UP

Rams Head Coach Sean McVay had one of the best seasons for a rookie head coach in franchise history.

McVay took over a team that was coming off of a 4-12 season and helped transform it into the No. 1 scoring team in the league and helped secure the franchise's first NFC West title since 2003.

Due to his excellent first season and his instrumental part in revamping the Rams offense, McVay was chosen as the Associated Press Coach of the Year for 2017. He is the fourth head coach in franchise history to achieve this honor.

The last Rams head coach to win the award was Dick Vermeil in 1999. Vermeil helped guide the Rams to a 13-3 record, winning the NFC West and culminating with the franchise's lone Super Bowl victory over the Titans, 23-16, in Super Bowl XXXIV.

Chuck Knox was the only other rookie head coach in franchise history to win the award. He claimed the AP Coach of the Year honors in 1973 after leading the team to a 12-2 regular season record and division title in his first year as head coach.

The first Rams head coach to ever win the AP Coach of the Year was George Allen in 1967. Allen guided the Rams to an 11-1-2 record in his second year as head coach. Allen's Rams would eventually lose to the Green Bay Packers, 28-7, in the Divisional Round.

McVay became the youngest coach in NFL history to win the Associated Press Coach of the Year award. McVay was 31 years old during the team's final game of the season. Previously, Don Shula (34 years old) was the youngest coach to win the award.

Gurley had 10 receptions for 158 yards and two touchdowns, including an 80-yard touchdown reception on a screen pass from QB Jared Goff. Gurley's 80-yard touchdown reception was the second longest of the season for a running back behind Dallas RB Rod Smith who scored on an 81-yard touchdown reception against the Giants on Dec. 10.

Rams RB Todd Gurley II made a strong case for the league's Most Valuable Player, as he led the league in touchdowns (19), was the highest scoring non-kicker (114), ranked first in the league in scrimmage yards (2,093) and finished second in rushing yards (1,305). Gurley was amongst the best receiving backs in the NFL last season, finishing second in the league in receiving yards by a RB (788) and posting the best reception average amongst RBs (12.3 yards per reception).

ROAD WARRIOR

Rams QB Jared Goff was one of only two quarterbacks to start at least seven road games and have only two interceptions during the 2017 regular season.

Goff completed 148 passes for 1,848 yards, 18 touchdowns and two interceptions in eight road games last season. The Rams finished the season 7-1 in road games and 8-1 in games played away from the Coliseum in 2017.

Goff posted a 109.8 passer rating on the road with 18 touchdowns, second only to Kansas City QB Alex Smith, who played in only seven road games during the 2017 season.

Goff's 15 25-plus yard passes on the road was tied for the 10th-most with Panthers QB Cam Newton. Additionally, Goff threw a touchdown on 7.7 percent of his passes in road contests, the best percentage in the league.

LINING THEM UP

One of Head Coach Sean McVay's first tasks was shoring up the Rams offensive line - a unit that saw six different starting combinations during the 2016 campaign. The Rams were the only team in the NFL to use the same five starting offensive linemen in 15 of their contests last season before resting starters during Week 17.

The Rams allowed only 28 sacks during the 2017 regular season, the ninth-fewest sacks allowed this past season. The Los Angeles Chargers allowed the fewest sacks during the 2017 regular season with 18. L.A. had two games last season in which they did not surrender a sack, both of which came on the road. The unit paved the way for RB Todd Gurley II to score a league-best 19 touchdowns and was the only player in the league to surpass over 2,000 scrimmage yards. Gurley averaged over 175 yards from scrimmage from Weeks 12-16.

The franchise had not used a draft pick on an offensive lineman from the 2015 draft to the 2018 draft, so McVay and Co. infused the existing youth on the roster with a pair of veteran free agents in T Andrew Whitworth and C John Sullivan. The duo has combined to play in 324 career games with 288 starts. Additionally, Whitworth and Sullivan have played in 12 postseason contests with nine career playoff starts between them.

G Rodger Saffold was able to settle in at LG in 2017, a position he has started 39 games at in his 95 career starts. Saffold also has started at LT (38), RG (13) and RT (five).

T Rob Havenstein, a massive 6-8 lineman from Wisconsin, was the team's second round (57th overall) pick in 2015. Havenstein started the first 15 games of the 2016 season at RT before suffering an ankle injury. Havenstein started the first 15 games and Wild Card round of the 2017 season.

2015 third-round pick G Jamon Brown started five games in 2016 at both left and right guard positions. He won the RG position heading into the 2017 campaign, a position he started all 16 regular season games and one playoff game at.

Rams WR Cooper Kupp was one of the best rookie wide receivers in the league in 2017. Kupp finished the regular season leading all rookies in first down receptions (42) and tied Pittsburgh's JuJu Smith-Schuster for the most 20-plus yard receptions (12). He finished second among rookies in receiving yards (869), tied for fourth in touchdown receptions (5) and fourth in receptions (62).

Despite not playing in Week 17, Kupp was one-of-six rookies a season ago to record multiple 40-plus yard receptions.

After enjoying a career day in the team's opening win over the Indianapolis Colts to start the 2017 season, QB Jared Goff established a then career-high in passing yards (311), QB rating (146.8) and passing touchdowns (4) in a rain-soaked win over the New York Giants in the team's Week 9 win. A week later in the team's first game back in L.A. in over a month away, Goff posted a new career-high 355 yards passing.

Goff was one of only four quarterbacks to pass for over 300 yards with four passing touchdowns a season ago in the team's 51-17 win over the New York Giants.

In his first road start of his sophomore campaign, a Thursday Night game at San Francisco, the Cal product had his most efficient day in the NFL, completing 22-of-28 passing attempts (79 percent) for 292 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions with a 145.8 QB rating, earning his first road victory. It was Goff's second three-touchdown game, both games came on the road in his first road start of each of his first two seasons.

Rams QB Jared Goff threw three touchdowns in the first half of his first-career road start as a rookie in a Week 12 matchup with the New Orleans Saints in 2016, becoming the third rookie to throw three touchdowns in their first-career road start over the past 20 years.

The Los Angeles Rams lit up the scoreboard in a variety of different ways in 2017, as they led the league in scoring, finished tied for the third-best scoring differential and outscored opponents by 149 points during the 2017 regular season.

L.A. scored 53 points on its opening drives during the 2017 regular season, which is tied for the third-highest total in opening drive points. The Rams scored on 11 of their 16 opening drives, including five touchdowns.

The Rams had 188 offensive drives during the 2017 regular season and scored 45 touchdowns and connected on 40 field goals, scoring on 85-of-188 offensive drives (45.2 percent), which is the second-most efficient output in the league during the 2017 campaign trailing only the New England Patriots.

L.A. was also efficient in goal-to-go situations, converting 96.7 percent of their goal-to-go series into points. 33-of-188 offensive drives ended in goal-to-go situations and the Rams scored on 32 of those 33 drives for 198 points, the second-most goal-to-go points in the NFL in 2017.

The Rams were one-of-12 teams that did not have a giveaway in goal-to-go situations during the 2017 regular season.

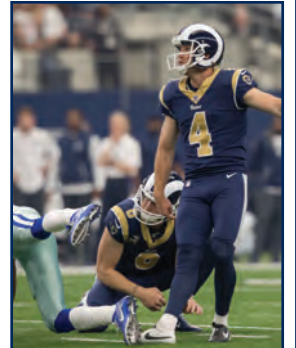
LET'S SCORE SOME MORE

Despite only playing in 14 games in 2017, K Greg Zuerlein still led the league in total points scored during the 2017 regular season with 158 points scored.

RB Todd Gurley II finished 13th in the NFL in 2017 with 114 points scored, the highest total by a non-kicker.

Zuerlein's 158 points a season ago was aided by a 23-point game against the Cowboys in the team's Week 4 road victory. The 23 points scored was the third-best single-game points total by a kicker in NFL history.

PRODUCTIVE ROOKIE PASS CATCHERS

The Rams finished the regular season with the third-most receiving yards among rookies. Cooper Kupp (869), Gerald Everett (244) and Josh Reynolds (104) all contributed to a passing attack that finished the season ranked 10th in the NFL. Kupp, Everett and Reynolds combined for 1,217 of L.A.'s 4,023 receiving yards.

The Jacksonville Jaguars lead the league in rookie receiving yards (1,475), and the San Francisco 49ers (1,397) were second.

FIRST TIME FOR A RAM

Rams DT Aaron Donald was named the Associated Press Defensive Player of the Year at NFL Honors on Feb. 3, 2018.

Donald is the first player in Rams history to ever earn the distinction of AP Defensive Player of the Year.

This past season, Donald racked up 52 tackles (31 solo), 11.0 sacks for 95 yards, five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and two passes defended despite playing in only 14 games. Donald had team highs in sacks (11.0), quarterback hits (27) and forced fumbles (5).

Donald was named First Team All-Pro for the third-consecutive season and was selected for the Pro Bowl for the fourth-consecutive season. He tied his career-high in sacks this season with 11.0 and set new career highs in sack yardage (95) and forced fumbles (5).



PRESSURE UP THE MIDDLE

Donald was the best interior pass rusher in 2017. Last season, Donald ranked first in sacks (11.0) and sack yardage (95) among interior pass rushers.

He is the first defensive tackle since Cincinnati's Geno Atkins (11.0) and Carolina's Kawann Short (11.0) in 2015 to post 10-plus sacks in a single season. Since entering the league in 2014, Donald and Atkins are the only defensive tackles to post 10-plus sacks in multiple seasons.

Donald led the Rams in sacks and finished tied for 11th in the league despite missing two games.

Not only did Donald sack opposing quarterbacks in 2017, but he also forced a career-high five fumbles.

Donald was tied for second in the NFL in forced fumbles with Tampa Bay LB Lavonte David and led all interior defensive linemen.

In the first four years of his NFL career, the Pitt product has amassed 39.0 sacks, 72 TFL and nine forced fumbles. His 39 sacks are the ninth-most in the NFL over the last four seasons and the most amongst all defensive tackles since he entered the league in 2014.

Rams DT Aaron Donald tied his career high in sacks with 11.0 in 2017. However, Donald set a new career high in sack yardage (95) shattering his previous career high of 68 yards in 2014.

Donald's sacks during the 2017 season were game changing. Three of his 11 sacks this season were for losses of 10-plus yards. Donald also set an NFL record for most sack yardage generated in a single game by an interior defensive lineman when he posted three sacks for 37 yards against Seattle in Week 15. That is the 11th most in a game in NFL history since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

He finished the season ranked fourth in the NFL in sack yardage, despite finishing 11th in sacks. He also posted the sixth-highest sack yardage output among defensive tackles in a single season since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

Not only did the Rams take the ball away, they made their opponents pay for turning the ball over. L.A. finished the 2017 regular season ranked fifth in the league in total takeaways with 28.

The Rams scored 126 points off of turnovers, the second-best total created by the defensive unit. 26.4 percent of the team's points last season came following a takeaway, which was the fourth-highest percentage in the NFL.

Following the team's Bye Week, the Rams went +6 in turnover differential, which was tied for the eighth-best in the NFL last season.

ON THE MARK

LB Mark Barron recorded 135-plus tackles in back-to-back seasons in 2015-2016 and tallied 108 tackles in 2017 despite missing the three games during the regular season.

Barron finished second on the team during the 2017 regular season with 108 total tackles, including 80 solo stops which is the most on the team.

Barron tied for the most interceptions on the team with three interceptions last season. The former first-rounder has returned his three interceptions for 29 yards.

In the team's Week 4 win at Dallas, the Alabama product posted his first interception of the season, intercepting QB Dak Prescott. Barron led the team in back-to-back weeks with 18 tackles against the Seahawks and 14 against the Jaguars.

Barron started all 16 contests of the 2016 campaign and finished second on the team with 147 tackles. He led or tied for the most tackles on the team in eight of the Rams' 2016 contests.

In the team's 2015 Week 7 win over Cleveland, Barron recorded a career-high 19 tackles, which is the most by any Ram in a game since 2001, and was close to matching it against the New Orleans Saints in the 2016 Week 12 match-up, finishing with 18 tackles.

In his career, Barron has recorded 41 TFL, 8.0 sacks, eight interceptions, forced four fumbles and added three fumble recoveries in 91 professional games as both a safety and a linebacker.

COUNT IT ALL FOR LOSS

Both against the run and the pass, the Rams defense was among the NFL's best over the past three seasons when it came to making plays behind the line of scrimmage.

Since the start of the 2015 season, the L.A. Rams rank third in the league in opponents' negative plays, preventing 336 of the opponents plays from even reaching the line of scrimmage.

The Rams forced 91 negative plays during the 2017 regular season. The Cleveland Browns lead the league in total negative plays with 138 plays made behind their opponents' line of scrimmage.

The Rams defense forced 113 negative plays by opposing offenses in 2016, the third-most in the NFL this past season.

The Rams finished the 2015 season with a league-best 132 negative plays, which included 82 negative rushes and 50 negative passing plays by their opponents.

BROCKERS BRINGING IT

DT Michael Brockers started the 2017 with a seven-tackle performance against the Colts, the most on the team in Week 1.

During the 2017 regular season, Brockers led the Rams defensive line with 65 total tackles, the fifth-most on the team. The LSU product also added eight TFL, 4.5 sacks, eight QB hits and four PDs in 2017.

Since entering the league as a first-round pick in 2012, Brockers has started 88-of-90 games played. Brockers is one of three defensive linemen this season to have multiple PDs in one game. No defensive lineman had multiple PDs until Week 4.

In 2016, he recorded the second-most tackles on the team by an interior defensive lineman (58) during the 2016 season. His 58 total tackles ranked eighth on the team a season ago. In 2016, the LSU product tallied seven quarterback pressures and four quarterback hits despite missing two games in the middle of the season.

Brockers finished the 2015 season with career highs in tackles (74) and tackles for loss (12). His tackle for loss total tied for third among all Rams.

Brockers has posted 36 TFL, 39 QB hits, 19.0 sacks, seven PDs, forced two fumbles and recovered one fumble appearing in 89 games with 89 starts in his first six seasons in the National Football League.

Rams K Greg Zuerlein had one of the best years of his career and posted some of the best numbers among kickers before being placed on injured reserve, ending his 2017 campaign.

Zuerlein finished tied for third in the NFL with a 95.0 percent conversion rate. Out of his 40 field goal attempts he only missed two, one Week 5 against Seattle, the other was an attempt at a career-long 63-yard field goal as time expired in the first half of a Week 12 game against the New Orleans Saints.

A LEG UP IN THE SCORING COLUMN

Against Buffalo in the Rams' 2016 Week 5 contest, K Greg Zuerlein made his 100th career field goal. He now has connected on 150 field goals and 187 PATs in his five-year NFL career.

Against the Cowboys in the 2017 Week 4 contest, Zuerlein booted the Rams to their third win of the season, accounting for 23 of the team's 35 points, connecting on 7-of-7 field goal attempts and 2-of-2 PATs. The seven made field goals established a franchise record for single-game field goals and his 23 points is the second-highest total for a Ram in a single game. Zuerlein ties Billy Cundiff for the third-most points by a kicker in a single game in NFL history, falling three points short of Rob Bironas' 26-point effort on 10/21/07. On the season, Zuerlein was 36-of-38 on field goal attempts and 35-of-36 on PATs.

Zuerlein's 97.4 percent PAT success rate is the fourth-highest percentage in franchise history. Zuerlein is the only kicker in franchise history that has kicked PATs from the 2-yard line and the 15-yard line.

In his career, Zuerlein has scored 637 points and connected on 150-of-181 FG attempts and 187-of-192 PATs.

Zuerlein ranks third in franchise history with 637 career points, and posted a personal-best 158 points, which was the most points by anyone during the 2017 regular season.

SPECIAL, SPECIAL TEAMS

The Rams were one-of-five teams in the NFL to block a punt during the 2017 season and they are the only team with multiple blocked punts, marking the 12th season in which a Rams team has blocked multiple punts in a single season. They are the first team to do so in franchise history since the 2003 Rams.

The 2017 Rams are the first team to block multiple punts and return them for touchdowns since 2014 when the Philadelphia Eagles (three) and Minnesota Vikings (two) achieved the feat. On the season, L.A. blocked three punts, one PAT and one field goal.

Rams LB Cory Littleton was the first player to block multiple punts in a single season since 2014 when Tennessee's Jurrell Casey and Buffalo's Anthony Dixon each had two blocks.

After taking over punt return duties for the Rams in Week 5 of last season, Pharoh Cooper proved to be one of the most dynamic all around returners in the league.

Cooper has returned 30 punts for 393 yards and a 53-yard long.

GREG THE LEG

Rams K Greg "The Leg" Zuerlein is one of the most prolific long-distance kickers in NFL history.

At Minnesota (11/8/15), he broke his own team record with a 61-yard field goal. In the process, he became just the second kicker in NFL history to make two 60-yard field goals in a career, joining Sebastian Janikowski. Coincidentally, Rams Special Teams Coordinator John Fassel held the same position with the Raiders when Janikowski accomplished his feat.

Zuerlein owns five of the six longest field goals made in Rams history, and his 61-yard kick in Minnesota was the longest in the NFL during the 2015 season.

Zuerlein has been one of the best deep ball kickers in the league since he arrived in 2012. At Washington (9/20/15), Zuerlein made a 52-yard kick. With 24 career kicks from 50 yards or more, Zuerlein ranks second in team history in field goals of 50 yards or more. He passed Josh Brown last season to move into second on the Rams all-time scoring list. He's tied for the third-most 50-yard field goals in the NFL since 2012.

WR Pharoh Cooper recorded the first kickoff returned for a touchdown for the Rams since the 2006 season when he took the opening kickoff against the Jaguars 103 yards for the score.

Cooper led the NFL in kickoff return average (27.4) among those with at least 1.25 returns per game during the 2017 regular season.

JOHNNY ON THE SPOT

P Johnny Hekker posted the third-best net average in NFL history with a 44.3 net average during the 2017 regular season, the second-best average of Hekker's career. Tennessee punter Brett Kern led the league in 2017 with a 44.6 yard net average.

Hekker enjoyed a record-breaking 2016 season, recording the most punts downed inside opponents' 20-yard line in NFL history. Additionally, Hekker broke his own NFL single-season net punting average record (46.0).

Hekker booted a then career-long 75-yard punt against the Carolina Panthers in the Rams' 2016 Week 9 contest, and bested himself a week later with a 78-yarder against the New York Jets.

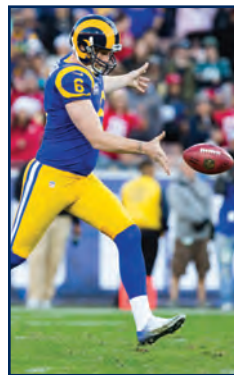
The Oregon State product finished the 2016 season with 98 punts, a 47.8 yard gross punting average, 51 punts inside opponents 20-yard line with only one touchback. As a unit, the Rams punt coverage team limited opponents to 152 return yards on 35 attempts and limited opponents to a league-best 4.3-yard average. With the outstanding coverage unit and directional punting, Hekker posted a 46.0-yard net average on the season, the best in NFL history.

Hekker led the NFL in 2015 in net average (43.7), gross average (47.9) and punts downed inside the opponents' 20 yard-line (41). Since the NFL began tracking punts inside 20 yard-line in 1976, Hekker is the first player to lead the league in gross, net and punts placed inside the 20-yard line in the same season.

P Johnny Hekker pinned 46.15 percent of his punts in 2017 inside the 20-yard line, the third-best mark in the NFL.

Of Hekker's 65 punts, he pinned 30 inside the 20-yard line with only four touchbacks.

Opponents only posted 152 punt return yards against the Rams last season, the fifth-fewest yards in the NFL a season ago.

Last season, Hekker punted 65 times covering 3,113 yards for a 47.9-yard average and a net average of 44.3 yards, which is the second-best net average in the league during the 2017 season.

Hekker's 65 punts finished tied for the 25th-most last season among punters that appeared in every game.

FLIPPING FIELDS

P Johnny Hekker continues to be not only one of the most accurate punters in the NFL, but has developed into a complete special teams weapon at flipping the field.

Hekker became the first punter in the NFL to record a 75-plus yard punt in back-to-back games since Patriots' P Luke Prestridge in 1984.

The Oregon State product established a career-long 75-yard punt in the team's 2016 Week 9 contest against the Carolina Panthers, a record that stuck for a week before he booted a 78-yarder against the New York Jets in the Rams' Week 10 contest. On the season, Hekker had three punts over 75 yards.

There were only nine 70-plus yard punts during the 2016 NFL campaign, Hekker and Jaguars' Brad Norton each had a 78-yarder to their name. There had not been one 70-yard punt through the first three weeks of the 2017 season.

Hekker's 46.0-yard net average led the league in 2016, and ranks first in NFL history for a single season. Previously, the 16-game record was 44.2, a record Hekker himself set in 2013.

Since the NFL went to a 16-game season in 1978, the lowest opponent punt return average, with a minimum of 25 returns, is 2.6 yards, set by the Rams in 2013. The 2016 version of the Rams saw its opponents return 35 punts for just a 4.3 yards per return average.

ONE 'HEK' OF A RECORD

P Johnny Hekker went on a 13-game streak without a touchback, the longest of his career. He had previously posted two separate nine-game streaks without a touchback.

In the team's 2016 Week 16 game against the San Francisco 49ers, Hekker recorded four punts inside the 20-yard line, moving him in to sole possession of the single-season record with 51 punts downed inside opponents' 20-yard line. The punts downed inside the 20 aided his 46.0 net yard average, the best in league history.

The record was previously held by Arizona punter Dave Zastudil, who amassed 46 punts inside opponents territory during the 2012 season. Zastudil needed 112 punting attempts to reach the record and also recorded eight touchbacks. Hekker reached 51 punts inside the 20 with 98 punting attempts and only committed one touchback during the 2016 season. Hekker punted a career-high 98 times in 2016.

The Rams special teams units have flourished since Special Teams Coordinator John Fassel took over prior to the 2012 season. During the 2017 regular season, the Rams opponents have averaged 6.1 yards per return, the ninth-best mark in the league, while P Johnny Hekker's 44.3 net yard average was the second-best total last season.

Hekker and the Rams coverage units have backed opponents up deep in their own territory and limited opponents to average just 6.4 yards per punt return, which is the lowest average in the NFL since the start of the 2012 season.

On January 12, 2017, Los Angeles Rams Owner/Chairman E. Stanley Kroenke named Sean McVay the 23rd full-time head coach in franchise history. McVay became the youngest coach in modern NFL history.

In his first season guiding the Rams, McVay completed one of the greatest offensive turnarounds in NFL history. He helped the Rams move from the 32nd-ranked scoring offense in 2016 to the league's top-scoring team in 2017, marking the first time in league history a team has gone from last to first in scoring. The first-year head coach led the Rams to an 11-5 record and their first NFC West title since the 2003 season, earning the team's first playoff berth since 2004.

Following his first season in L.A., McVay was named The Associated Press Coach of the Year, becoming the youngest head coach to ever win the award. RB Todd Gurley II brought home Offensive Player of the Year honors, while DT Aaron Donald was named the Defensive Player of the Year, marking the first time in the 45 year history of the awards there was a sweep of three of the league's top awards. The Rams placed eight players in the 2018 Pro Bowl, the most in a single season by the franchise since the 1999 campaign.

Under McVay's guidance in 2017, second-year QB Jared Goff flourished, earning his first Pro Bowl appearance. Goff completed 296-of-477 (62.1 percent) of his passes for 3,804 yards with 28 touchdowns and seven interceptions posting a 100.5 QB rating on the season. Gurley led the league in scrimmage yards finishing the year with 2,093 yards, including 1,305 rushing yards and 788 receiving yards. Additionally, Gurley was the league's highest scoring non-kicker posting 19 total touchdowns on the season.

The Rams defense posted the fourth-most sacks (48.0), tied for sixth in interceptions (18) and finished the 2017 campaign fifth in total takeaways with 28 on the season. The 28 takeaways directly resulted in 126 points for L.A., the second-best total in the NFL.

In his first season as head coach, the Rams special teams unit played an integral part in the team's success and was rewarded with a total of four special teamers being named to the Pro Bowl. The L.A. special teams unit was a top-10 finisher in 18 of the 22 statistical categories in the 2017 special-teams rankings.

Before joining the Rams, McVay completed his third season as the Redskins' offensive coordinator in 2016 after initially being promoted to the position on January 15, 2014. Prior to his promotion during the 2014 offseason, McVay spent three seasons as the team's tight ends coach (2011-13) and one as an offensive assistant (2010).

The 2016 Redskins' offensive unit broke many franchise records and ranked in the top-three in a number of statistical categories. The Washington offense became the first unit in franchise history to average over 400 yards per game (403.4) and notched a franchise record 6,545 total net yards.

Quarterback Kirk Cousins finished the year with single-season team records in completions (406) and passing yards (4,917) and matched his team record for 300-yard passing games (seven). His 4,917 passing yards ranked third in the NFL in 2016 and are the 15th-most in a season in NFL history. Cousins closed out the season ranked second in the NFL in passing yards per game (297.4), passing yards per play (7.84) and yards per play (6.4), in addition to being the league's third ranked offensive team, averaging 403.4 yards per game.

From 2015-16, Cousins threw for 9,083 yards, the fourth highest output by a quarterback trailing only Drew Brees (10,078), Matt Ryan (9,535) and Philip Rivers (9,178).

The Redskins offense had eight players finish the season with at least 500 yards from scrimmage (DeSean Jackson, Pierre Garcon, Jamison Crowder, Rob Kelley, Chris Thompson, Jordan Reed, Vernon Davis and Matt Jones), tying the 2011 New Orleans Saints for the most in a single season in NFL history.

McVay's group posted a breakout campaign in his second year as offensive coordinator in 2015, including record-setting performances by quarterback Kirk Cousins and tight end Jordan Reed. McVay's scheme and tutelage helped Cousins break Redskins records for attempts (543), completions (379), passing yards (4,166) and 300-yard passing games (seven) in a single season. Reed has been a direct beneficiary of McVay's work, spending 2013 as a member of his unit during McVay's time as tight ends coach and being a focal point of the offense in 2015, as Reed recorded 87 receptions for 952 yards (both team records for a tight end) with 11 receiving touchdowns (one shy of the team record) in 2015.

Collectively, McVay's 2015 offense recorded Top 10 rankings in third down percentage (43.5, fifth in the NFL), red zone scoring percentage (61.2, eighth), yards per play (5.6, 10th) and points per game (24.3, 10th). The Redskins also led the NFL with a team-record 69.5 completion percentage in 2015, leading the league in the category for the 11th time in team history and the first time since 1970.

In his first season as offensive coordinator in 2014, McVay helped the offense to a Top 10 league ranking in yards per play (5.7) despite starting three different quarterbacks. His work with the three passers was instrumental in setting a team record for completion percentage (66.5 percent, later broken in 2015) and helping facilitate the explosive debut season of wide receiver DeSean Jackson. Jackson averaged a league-best 20.9 yards per reception and became only the fourth player in team history to lead the NFL in that category.

In 2013, McVay played a crucial role in Reed's development, as the then-rookie compiled 45 receptions for 499 yards – both Redskins' single-season rookie tight end records – despite Reed playing in only nine games. Under McVay's tutelage, Reed joined Chris Cooley (2004) as the only Redskins tight ends named to the PFWA All-Rookie Team. In addition, McVay helped tight end Logan Paulsen from an undrafted free agent into a 30-game starter from 2010-13, with Paulsen increasing his

reception total each season.

During Washington's NFC East championship season in 2012, McVay's unit was productive despite losing starting tight end Fred Davis to a torn Achilles tendon in Week 7. Davis had led the team in both receptions (24) and receiving yards (325) through seven games before being placed on the reserve/injured list.

In 2011, McVay played an integral role in Davis' emergence, as the then fourth-year tight end surpassed his previous career highs despite playing in only 12 games. Davis caught 59 passes for 796 yards, the second-highest total on the team in both categories. Before missing the final four games of the season, Davis was on pace to set a franchise record in receiving yards by a tight end and was on pace to post the first 1,000-yard receiving season by a tight end in Redskins' history.

McVay served as an offensive assistant to the Redskins in 2010 in addition to working with the tight ends during the final four weeks of the season following coach Jon Embree's departure. The Redskins offense ranked eighth in the NFL in passing yards per game (244.6) and tight end Chris Cooley ranked second among NFL tight ends in receptions (77) and third in receiving

yards (849). The offensive unit also set a franchise record for completions in a season (349), and registered a touchdown pass in 15 consecutive games for the first time in team history.

McVay joined the Redskins prior to the 2010 season after an undefeated regular season with the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League (UFL). The Tuskers finished a perfect 6-0 before losing in the UFL's inaugural championship game. McVay originally entered the National Football League as an offensive assistant with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2008. During his time in Tampa Bay, McVay worked closely with wide receiver Antonio Bryant, who recorded career highs in receptions (83), receiving yards (1,248), and touchdowns (seven), en route to winning The Sporting News Comeback Player of the Year Award.

McVay graduated from Miami University (Ohio) where he played wide receiver from 2004-07, earning Miami's Scholar-Athlete Award in 2007. His grandfather, John, served in various roles – including vice president/director of football operations from 1983-94 – for the San Francisco 49ers from 1979-95, overseeing five Super Bowl championship squads and earning induction into the 49ers Hall of Fame in 2013.

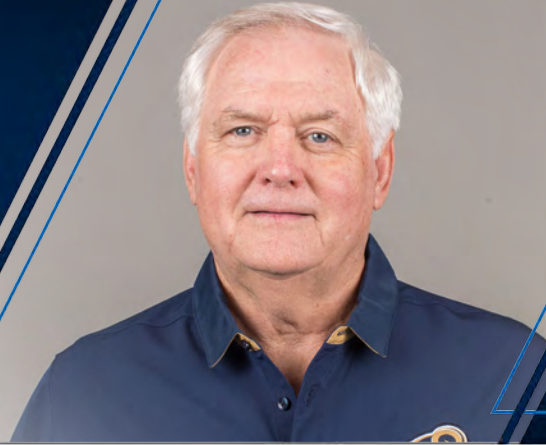

Wade Phillips, who is in his 49th year of coaching, enters his second season with the Rams as defensive coordinator on Head Coach Sean McVay's staff.

A veteran coach entering his 41st NFL season, Phillips owns 36 years of experience as a defensive coordinator or head coach. Phillips continued his streak of helping teams to the playoffs in his first season with the organization when the Rams clinched the NFC West, marking the eighth-straight team that has made the postseason in Phillips' first year with the organization.

In his first season with the Rams in 2017, he guided a defense that finished fourth in sacks (48.0), tied for sixth in interceptions (18) and finished fifth in total takeaways with 28 on the season. The 28 takeaways directly resulted in 126 points for L.A., the second-best total in the NFL.

DT Aaron Donald was named *The Associated Press* Defensive Player of the Year for his efforts. Donald became the first player in Rams history to ever earn the distinction of AP Defensive Player of the Year. In 2017, Donald racked up 52 tackles, 31 solo (according to coaches' stats), 11.0 sacks for 95 yards, five forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and two passes defended, despite playing in only 14 games. Donald had team highs in sacks (11.0), quarterback hits (27) and forced fumbles (5).

Prior to joining the Rams, Phillips served as defensive coordinator for the Denver Broncos (2015-16), which was his second stint with the club after serving the same role from 1989-92, and also as head coach from 1993-94.

Phillips has been a part of 21 different top-10 defensive units during his NFL career and has coached a total of 31 Pro Bowlers, including Pro Football Hall of Famers Elvin Bethea, Curley Culp, Rickey Jackson, Bruce Smith and Reggie White.

He is one of three individuals in NFL history to be named Assistant Coach of the Year multiple times by the Pro Football Writers of America, being honored with that distinction in 2011 with Houston and in 2015 with Denver. Phillips also received the Paul "Dr. Z" Zimmerman Award from the PFWA in 2016 (lifetime achievement as an NFL assistant coach).

Denver finished the 2016 season at the top of the league in several key categories with Phillips at the helm of the defense. The Broncos ranked first in the NFL in pass defense, yards per play and interception return yards, as well as fourth in total defense and scoring defense. The unit tied for third in the NFL with 42 sacks and ranked second in the league with 113 quarterback hits in 2016. Several players earned consecutive Pro Bowl nods in Von Miller, Chris Harris Jr., and Aqib Talib, while Darian Stewart notched his first such honor.

In his first year back with the Broncos in 2015, Phillips directed a historic defense that finished as the top unit (283.1 ypg) in the NFL for the first time in team history. Featuring four Pro Bowlers—linebackers Von Miller and DeMarcus Ware as well as cornerbacks Chris Harris Jr. and Aqib Talib—Denver's defense posted a league-high 52 sacks while contributing five defensive scores in the regular season.

During the Broncos' postseason run, the defense recorded 14 sacks and six forced fumbles while limiting the league's No. 1, No. 3 and No. 4 scoring offenses to nearly half (50.7 percent) of their average regular-season point totals and a combined 7-of-42 (16.7 percent) on third down attempts. Miller posted 2.5 of Denver's seven sacks in their Super Bowl 50 win against Carolina to become just the 10th defensive player to earn Super Bowl MVP honors.

Prior to returning to Denver, Phillips was the defensive coordinator on Gary Kubiak's staff in Houston from 2011-13. He took over the league's 30th-ranked unit in 2011 and guided the defense to a No. 2 overall ranking (285.7 ypg) in his first year with the club to earn PFW/PFWA Assistant Coach of the Year honors. The Texans ranked seventh in total defense (323.3 ypg) in 2012, paced by Associated Press NFL Defensive Player of the Year J.J. Watt, who led the league with a franchise-record 20.5 sacks and added 16 passes defended.

Phillips served as interim head coach of the Texans for the team's final three weeks in 2013, representing the third time in his career he assumed that role to close out a season for an NFL team.

His longest head-coaching tenure came with Dallas from 2007-10 as he compiled a 34-22 (.607) regular-season record and led the Cowboys to NFC East Division titles following the 2007 and 2009 seasons.

Before arriving in Dallas, Phillips spent three years as defensive coordinator for San Diego (2004-06). During that time, the Chargers ranked second in the league in run defense (88.9 ypg) and sacks (136) while twice finishing first in the AFC West standings.

In his two seasons with Atlanta from 2002-03, Phillips' defense was one of the best in the NFL in forcing turnovers, tying for sixth in the league with 63 takeaways (34 INT, 29 FR) in that period. He was named interim head coach for the final three weeks of the 2003 season, guiding the Falcons to a 2-1 record.

Phillips was with the Buffalo Bills for a six-year stretch from 1995-2000, spending three seasons as the club's defensive coordinator before being promoted to vice president of football operations/head coach for three additional campaigns. His defenses finished no worse than ninth in the NFL during five of his six years with the Bills, including consecutive top-three finishes in 1999 and 2000. Bruce Smith tied for third in the NFL with 55 sacks during his final five seasons (1995-99) in Buffalo, helping the Bills rank second in total quarterback take downs (223) in that period.

Phillips led Buffalo to a 29-19 (.604) regular-season record in his three years at the helm, helping the Bills to their two most recent playoff appearances and double-digit win seasons (1998, '99). In addition to coaching defensive standouts like Bruce Smith, Bryce Paup and Ted Washington, Phillips coached a talented trio of future offensive Hall of Famers: quarterback Jim Kelly, wide receiver Andre Reed and running back Thurman Thomas.

As the 10th head coach in Broncos history from 1993-94, Phillips recorded a 16-16 (.500) regular-season record. His initial 1993 squad finished 9-7 and earned a wild card playoff berth as quarterback John Elway piloted the AFC's top-ranked scoring offense (23.3 ppg) and led the conference in attempts (551), completions (348), passing yards (4,030), touchdown passes (25), completion percentage (63.2) and passer rating (92.8).

Phillips also coached tight end Shannon Sharpe and tackle Gary Zimmerman, as the pair teamed with fellow future Hall of Famer Elway to lead the Broncos to a third-place NFL offensive ranking (341.1 ypg) from 1993-94.

During his four seasons as Denver's defensive coordinator (1989-92), Phillips coached safety Steve Atwater, linebacker Michael Brooks, defensive tackle Greg Kragen, linebacker Karl Mecklenburg and safety Dennis Smith to Pro Bowl honors.

The Broncos finished fifth in total defense (284.3 ypg) in 1991 as Denver advanced to the AFC Championship Game for the fourth time in six seasons. Phillips' most complete defense was the Broncos' 1989 Super Bowl unit that ranked in the top five in the NFL in total defense (3rd), scoring defense (1st), run defense (6th), pass defense (3rd), takeaways (2nd) and sacks (4th).

Before his first stint in Denver, Phillips spent three seasons (1986-88) as defensive coordinator in Philadelphia. The Eagles posted the second-most takeaways (128) in the league during that stretch and ranked third in the NFL with 152 sacks—including 57 quarterbacks take downs by White to represent the highest three-year total in history.

Phillips' first coordinator position came with New Orleans from 1981-85, working under his father and Head Coach Bum

Phillips. Led by Jackson, who was selected by the club in the second round (51st overall) of the 1981 NFL Draft, Phillips' defenses were among the best in the league, especially during a three-year stretch from 1982-84 when the Saints ranked second in total defense (297.9 ypg) and fifth in sacks (142).

He served as interim head coach for the Saints during the last four games of the 1985 season, earning a 29-3 win against the Los Angeles Rams in his head coaching debut on Dec. 1, 1985.

Phillips began his NFL career as linebackers coach for Bum Phillips and the Houston Oilers in 1976 before moving on to coach the club's defensive line from 1977-80. Houston advanced to the AFC Championship Game in 1978 and 1979 as Elvin Bethea earned Pro Bowl selections following both of those years playing for Phillips.

A linebacker at the University of Houston from 1966-68, Phillips began his coaching career with his alma mater as a graduate assistant in 1969.

He spent three years (1970-72) as defensive coordinator at Orange (Texas) High School before working as an assistant coach at Oklahoma State University (1973-74) and the University of Kansas (1975).

Phillips, who was born on June 21, 1947, in Orange, Texas, played linebacker at Port Neches-Grove High School in Port Neches, Texas. Phillips and his wife, Laurie, have a son, Wesley, the tight ends coach for the Washington Redskins, and a daughter, Tracy, who is a professional actress, dancer and choreographer in Hollywood, Calif.

Joe Barry enters his second season as the Rams' assistant head coach/linebackers in 2018.

In his first season with the Rams, Barry oversaw a linebacking corps that saw Alec Ogletree (128) and Mark Barron (108) each post over 100 tackles. Ogletree led the Rams in tackles for the fourth time in the previous five seasons. Barron's three interceptions were tied for the most on the team in 2017 and were tied for the most in the NFL amongst linebackers.

Under Barry's leadership, outside linebackers Connor Barwin and Samson Ebukam each were able to carve out a role in the Rams defense in their first season with the organization, combining for 7.0 sacks between the pair.

Prior to joining the Rams, Barry spent the previous two seasons as the Washington Redskins' defensive coordinator. In 2016, Barry's defense had two players finish in the top-10 in the NFC in sacks, including LB Ryan Kerrigan, whose 11.0 sacks ranked eighth in the NFL. His first season in Washington saw Barry's defense record 26 takeaways in the final 14 weeks of the regular season, ranking in a tie for third in the NFL.

Before joining Washington in 2015, Barry spent three seasons as the linebackers coach of the San Diego Chargers. In his first season with the Chargers in 2012, Barry's linebackers were part of a unit that tied for sixth in the AFC in sacks.

Prior to his time in San Diego, Barry returned to his alma mater for his second stint at USC. For two seasons from 2010-11, Barry was the linebackers coach for the Trojans. Barry helped tutor LB Malcolm Smith, who went on to be named MVP of Super Bowl XLVIII. Additionally, following the 2012 season, Barry saw another one of his USC linebackers – Nick Perry – become a first-round draft pick by the Packers.

Barry came to USC after one season as the linebackers coach of the Buccaneers in 2009, his second stint in Tampa Bay.

From 2007-08, Barry was the defensive coordinator for the Detroit Lions. In 2007, the Lions' defense ranked third in the NFL in takeaways. Additionally in 2007, LBs Ernie Sims and Paris Lenon led the Detroit defense in tackles, each recording more than 115 on the season.

In 2001, Barry began his first stop with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as the club's linebackers coach through 2006. In his six seasons with the Buccaneers, Barry's linebackers helped the defense to allow the fewest passing yards per game, and rank second in fewest yards allowed per game and second-fewest points allowed per game. Barry helped Tampa Bay linebackers earn seven Pro Bowl berths in his six seasons.

Barry's second season in Tampa Bay saw his linebacker unit help the club to its first Super Bowl in franchise history as well as LB Derrick Brooks being named the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.

In 2000, Barry got his start in the NFL as defensive quality control coach for the San Francisco 49ers. Prior to his NFL coaching career, Barry was on the defensive coaching staff at UNLV (1999) and Northern Arizona (1996-98).

Barry began his coaching career at his alma mater, USC, serving as the Trojans' graduate assistant/defensive line coach for the 1995 season. Following that season, DE Israel Ifeanyi was a second-round draft pick.

Barry was a linebacker at Michigan for two seasons, before transferring to USC for his final three seasons from 1991-93.

Barry and his wife, Chris, are the parents of four children – daughters, Camryn and Lauren and sons, Nick and Sam. Camryn is a member of the Penn State swimming team.

The Rams have developed a reputation for delivering the unexpected in the kicking game, and special teams coordinator John Fassel is at the helm of the trickery that has helped the Rams become one of the NFL's best when it comes to special teams.

In 2017, the special teams unit played an integral part in the Rams success and was rewarded with a total of four special teamers being named to the Pro Bowl in PR/KR Pharoh Cooper, P Johnny Hekker, LS Jake McQuaide and K Greg Zuerlein. Zuerlein led the league in scoring (158 points), despite playing in only 14 games before being placed on season-ending injured reserved.

The Rams special teams unit was a top-10 finisher in 18 of the 22 statistical categories in the 2017 special-teams rankings.

There were only 11 punts blocked league-wide on the season, and the Rams had three of them. LB Cory Littleton was the only player in the NFL to block two punts. In total, the Rams blocked a total of five kicks in 2017.

The 2016 season was another record-breaking year for Fassel's special teams unit. Hekker earned his third trip to the Pro Bowl after setting an NFL record for punts downed inside the 20 (51). Hekker also established a new NFL record for single-season net punting average (46.0), breaking the previous record that Hekker himself set in 2013. Hekker also moved into second place in Rams history, with 434 career punts. Zuerlein moved into eighth-place in Rams history in points scored, passing WR Torry Holt. McQuaide became the first long snapper in franchise history to earn a Pro Bowl berth.

From 2013-17, KR Benny Cunningham averaged 27.1-yards per kickoff return (95-2,575), which is the franchise record in the category.

In addition to his special teams duties, Fassel served as Interim Head Coach for the final three games of the 2016 season.

Fassel's special teams unit returned in 2015 to deliver another compelling season. Hekker produced one of the best punting seasons in NFL history, to earn his second Pro Bowl honor. The fourth-year pro led the NFL in punts (96), gross average (47.9), net average (43.7) and punts downed inside the 20-yard line (41). He's the first player to lead the league in all three categories since the NFL began tracking punts inside the 20 in 1976.

Hekker also completed a 20-yard pass to S Cody Davis on a fake punt play against the Packers. Under Fassel's guidance, Hekker has completed seven passes for 103 yards off trick plays since 2012.

The Rams return game was ignited by Cunningham and WR Tavon Austin. Cunningham finished fourth in the NFL in kickoff return average, highlighted by a 102 yard return in Week 15. Austin led a punt return team that saw opponents net 38.8 yards per punt, the 10th lowest in the NFL this season.

In Fassel's 2014 campaign, his units finished among the league's best in several categories. As a team, St. Louis was fifth in net punt average (41.8) and second in punt return average (13.0). The team's net punting average was the third highest ever by a Rams special teams unit.

Individually, WR Tavon Austin finished fifth in punt return average (11.2) and was an alternate to the Pro Bowl, while Cunningham led the NFC and was fifth in the NFL in kick return average (27.5).

In the Rams' win over the then defending Super Bowl champion Seahawks, Fassel's men scored on a trick punt return and executed a fake punt in the final minutes to help St. Louis narrowly escape with a victory.

On the punt return, Austin pretended to track a punt down the left sideline while the Rams return team raced towards Austin in attempt to set up a return. In actuality, Seattle had punted the ball to the St. Louis right. WR Stedman Bailey fielded the punt over his shoulder, turned and raced 90 yards for a touchdown. The play was the longest punt return in the NFL last season and is tied for the third longest in Rams history.

The fake punt came with 2:55 remaining in the game and was daringly called from the Rams own 18-yard line. On fourth-and-3, Cunningham slipped out of the backfield and caught a Hekker pass for an 18-yard gain that allowed the Rams to run out the clock and preserve a 28-26 win.

Hekker also completed a pass on a fake punt in Week 12 that helped keep a potential go-ahead drive alive in the fourth quarter of a game at San Diego, and the Rams scored two points on a fake PAT when Hekker, the holder on kicks, rolled out and hit TE Cory Harkey in the end zone.

The 2013 campaign was also a good one for Fassel's crew. He oversaw a punt team that, led by Hekker, set a new single-season NFL record for net punting average (44.2). Hekker was named First-Team All-Pro and made his first trip to the Pro Bowl at the conclusion of the season.

Despite having one of the NFL's youngest units for a second season in a row, St. Louis enjoyed success in every area of the kicking game. Rams opponents averaged just 2.6 yards per punt return, which was the lowest in the NFL. In addition, K Greg Zuerlein was 26-of-28 on field goals. In Fassel's first two seasons, the Rams did not allow a special teams touchdown.

In 2012, a total of 18 rookies or first year players contributed to the Rams special teams, including Zuerlein, Hekker and leading tackler S Rodney McLeod. Despite their youth, the Rams were one of just two teams in the NFL that did not allow a return touchdown nor a blocked kick. Zuerlein connected on his first 15 field goal attempts of his career and set a new team record with eight field goals from 50 yards or more. Hekker's 45.8 gross average and 39.9 net average were both the fourth highest single-season totals in team history.

Fassel joined the Rams after spending the past three years in the same capacity with the Oakland Raiders. The Raiders saw much success under Fassel's leadership, garnering some of the league's top special teams accomplishments. His units led the NFL in special teams takeaways, turnover differential and points scored in 2009 and 2010. Fassel also oversaw the advancement of returner Jacoby Ford, leading to a breakout rookie season with three kickoff returns for touchdowns in 2010 and one in 2011.

Under Fassel's tutelage, P Shane Lechler earned a Pro Bowl spot in three consecutive years. In 2009, he led the NFL with a Raider record 51.1-yard average per attempt. His net average of 43.9 yards per punt also set an all-time NFL record and surpassed his own record set in 2008. In addition, K Sebastian Janikowski achieved a career single-season high 89.7 field goal percentage, missing only three attempts (47, 57 and 66 yards) in 2011. Janikowski also converted on the third-longest field goal in NFL history, a Raiders team record 61-yarder at Cleveland in December 2009, and tied an NFL record with a 63-yarder in 2011. Under Fassel's direction, LS Jon Condo earned two Pro Bowl berths as a "need" player.

In 2008, Fassel helped tutor one of the top units in the NFL as the Raiders ranked ninth in the league in kickoff returns (receiving team) with an average start of 28.8 and 10th in the league in kickoff coverage (kicking team) with a 26.4 average start for opponents. As for the punt return unit, he helped guide the Raiders to the second-best punt return average in the NFL

at 13 yards per return. In addition, Fassel's unit contributed five touchdowns on returns and included Lechler, who led the NFL with a 41.2 net punting average and earned a Pro Bowl berth. From 2005-07, Fassel was Baltimore's assistant special teams coach. He helped the Ravens to top-10 finishes in punt and kickoff return average in 2006 and 2007 and his units returned five kicks for touchdowns in two seasons.

From 2003-04, he was the head coach and assistant athletic director at New Mexico Highlands University. Fassel also served six months as the school's interim athletic director and taught undergraduate and graduate courses.

He earned a master's degree in athletic administration at Idaho State University, where he was a graduate assistant and sports science instructor from 2000-01. In 1999 and 2001, Fassel coached wide receivers and recruited for Bucknell. In Spring 2000, Fassel was the strength and conditioning and wide receivers coach for the Amsterdam Admirals of NFL Europe.

Fassel played wide receiver at Weber State, graduating in 1999 with a degree in Exercise Science. He was signed as a rookie free agent wide receiver with the Indianapolis Colts.

Fassel is the son of former NFL coach Jim Fassel, a longtime NFL coach who guided the New York Giants to the Super Bowl during the 2000 season. John is a triathlete who has finished three Ironman distance triathlons. He and his wife, Elizabeth, have two daughters: Lilah and Avery.

Coen was the signal caller for Maine for two years under Joe Harasymiak and was instrumental in quarterback Dan Collin's emergence in 2016, as well as the growth of freshman quarterback Chris Ferguson in 2017.

Under Coen in 2017, the Black Bears had the fourth-best scoring offense in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), which was spearheaded by RB Josh Mack who led the FCS in rush yards. Daniels joins Rams Special Teams Coordinator John Fassel, who held the same position during Daniels' playing career with the Rams.

In addition to the Rams, Daniels spent time on the Jacksonville Jaguars practice squad, as well as time with the San Diego Chargers primarily as a practice squad player.

The Fayetteville, Ga., native played in seven NFL games, six with the Rams and one with the Chargers.

Collegiately, Daniels earned First-Team All-ACC and Second-Team All-America honors as a senior after leading Duke in tackles with 126. In his final season as a Blue Devil, he finished third in the balloting for ACC Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

Daniels played in 46 career games and compiled totals of 324 tackles, 13.0 tackles for loss, four interceptions, seven caused fumbles, three fumble recoveries and 27 pass breakups. He was named a team captain for the 2011 season.

Daniels broke into the coaching ranks as a defensive graduate assistant at the University of Colorado during the 2017 season.

As a prep, Daniel was a three-time all-region pick and two-time all-county choice in high school. Additionally, he was named Fayette County's Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year as both a junior and senior, setting the Fayetteville High School single-game rushing record with 348 yards.

Daniels also participated in track and field in H.S. and was honored with the Watkins Award, an honor presented annually to the top African-American high school student-athlete in the country.

Daniels holds a degree in public policy studies from Duke. He is married to Tiffany Daniels.

Andy Dickerson enters his seventh season as the Rams' assistant offensive line coach in 2018. He came to the Rams after serving in similar roles with the Cleveland Browns and New York Jets.

With the assistance of Dickerson, the Rams offensive line paved the way for one of the biggest offensive turnarounds in NFL history, helping the team improve from the 32nd-ranked scoring offense in 2016 to the league's top-scoring team in 2017.

During the 2017 campaign, the offensive line provided time for QB Jared Goff to have a break-out campaign and allowed RB Todd Gurley II to lead the league in total touchdowns (19) and scrimmage yards (2,093) en route to earning AP Offensive Player of the Year accolades.

Dickerson helped coach an offensive line that protected QB Case Keenum, who set career-highs in attempts, completions, completion percentage, passing yards and passing touchdowns in 2016.

For the third-consecutive year, the Rams boasted one of the NFL's top rookie runners in 2015. The Rams' offensive line blocked for Offensive Rookie of the Year and rookie Pro Bowler Todd Gurley to rush for 1,106 yards, which placed him third in the NFL in rushing yards. The Rams finished seventh in the NFL in rushing offense and allowed the fewest sacks in the league (18).

With the help of the St. Louis offensive line, RB Tre Mason finished second among all rookies and led the Rams with 765 rushing yards in 2015. As a team, St. Louis averaged 102.2 rushing yards per game, giving them at least 100 yards per game in each of Dickerson's three seasons with the Rams.

In 2013, St. Louis averaged 21.8 points per game, the club's highest point total since 2006, and the team's offensive line had a great impact on the team's play. RB Zac Stacy rushed for 973 yards, third most by a rookie in team history. Over the last 11 games, only six NFL backs rushed for more yards than Stacy. In the passing game, the Rams allowed 36 sacks in 2014, the eighth lowest total in the NFL.

In his first season with the Rams, Dickerson helped guide an offensive line that allowed just 35 sacks after giving up 55 the previous year. St. Louis' offensive line was forced to deal with its share of adversity as nine different linemen started at least one game. The unit led the league in sacks allowed after seeing significant action from five rookies.

Dickerson spent the 2011 season with the Jets as a coaches' assistant. He first broke into coaching as a member of their staff from 2006-08, with coaches' assistant and defensive quality control responsibilities. He also spent two years with the Cleveland Browns, serving as assistant offensive line coach in 2010 and defensive quality control in 2009.

Before joining the Jets staff, Dickerson worked in the operations department of the New England Patriots, first as an intern in 2004 and then on a full-time basis the following year. He began his NFL career with the Washington Redskins as a training camp intern in 2003 before spending that season as a graduate assistant on the offensive staff at Tufts University.

Dickerson played collegiate football at Tufts from 1999-2002. He also performed in the shot put, discus and hammer throw on the school's track and field squad. Before that, he was a three-sport captain in football, wrestling, and track and field at Tower Hill School in his hometown of Wilmington, Del.

Ejiro Evero (pronounced e-JEE-row EV-uh-row) is entering his second season with the Los Angeles Rams coaching safeties in 2018.

Evero coached a safety group that helped contribute to the Rams defense ranking fifth in the NFL with 28 total takeaways. Under Evero's guidance, Lamarcus Joyner played his first professional season at the safety position, while rookie John Johnson III thrived in a starting role in his first NFL season.

Before joining the Rams, Evero spent the 2016 season as the Green Bay Packers' defensive quality control coach after spending five years on the San Francisco 49ers' coaching staff.

While at Green Bay, Evero worked closely with defensive coordinator Dom Capers and was responsible for breaking down opponent game film and analyzing their offensive tendencies, playbook development, compiling team and player reports, and coordinating the opponent scout teams the starting defense will face at practice. In 2016, Evero was a part of a Green Bay team that finished the year on a six-game winning streak, earning them a playoff in the NFC Wild Card game. It marked the team's longest winning streak to end the season since a nine-game streak in 1941. Defensively, Evero helped contribute to the team's top-10 league rankings in interceptions (fourth, tied), sacks (sixth, tied) and rush defense (eighth).

After joining San Francisco as a quality control coach (2011), Evero spent two seasons as an offensive assistant (2012-13). During this span, Evero was part of an offensive rushing attack that ranked fourth in 2012 (155.7 ypg) and third in 2013 (137.6 ypg) in the NFL in rushing yards per game. In 2012, the offensive unit ranked fifth in touchdown/interception ratio (2.88) and fourth in passer rating (101.2). Evero capped off his time with San Francisco serving as defensive assistant (2014-15), where he spent time assisting the linebacker position. Evero helped direct a defensive unit that finished fifth in both total defense

(321.4 ypg) and pass defense (220.7 ypg) and ranked first in interceptions (23) in 2014.

Prior to his time with San Francisco, he spent the 2010 season at the University of Redlands as the special teams coordinator and safeties coach.

Evero broke into the NFL in Tampa Bay, where he served as the defensive quality control coach for three seasons (2007-09). In his first year with the Buccaneers, Evero was part of a staff that helped the defense rank second in the NFL in total defense (278.4 ypg) and first in pass defense (170.5 ypg). In 2008, he helped the defense finish in the top 10 in total defense for a second consecutive season, ranking ninth in the NFL (306.1 ypg).

Evero's first job in the collegiate ranks came as an assistant coach (2005-06) at the University of California-Davis, where he helped lead the Aggies to the Great West Conference championship in 2005. Evero interned for the football program in 2004, while also serving as an assistant coach for the Davis High School junior varsity squad.

As a player, Evero lettered all four years as a safety at UC-Davis. A two-time captain for the Aggies, he was twice named a Division II All-American (2002-03). Evero signed with the Oakland Raiders as an undrafted free agent following his college career in 2004.

Born Jan. 6, 1981, in Colchester, England, and raised in Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., Evero was a three-sport standout at Alta Loma High School in Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. In addition to playing basketball his freshman year, Evero lined up at running back and linebacker while also running track all four years. He and his wife, Natalie, have one son and reside in Los Angeles, Calif.

Jedd Fisch was hired as senior offensive assistant for the Los Angeles Rams in January 2018. Fisch joins the Rams after a one year stint at UCLA where he was hired as the offensive coordinator in January 2017. He finished the 2017 campaign as the team's interim head coach leading the Bruins to a 1-1 record in their final two games.

At UCLA, the fast-paced offense flourished under Fisch as the Bruins posted the nation's fourth-best passing offense and ranked eighth in plays per minute, averaging 2.83 plays per minute of game play. During the 2017 campaign, the Bruins threw for 4,478 yards and averaged 344.5 passing yards per game, both of which are program records. The UCLA offense improved from the 96th overall scoring offense and 91st in total offense in 2016, to the 36th ranked and 22nd ranked offense respectively in 2017, with Fisch calling the plays.

In his lone season at UCLA, Fisch was instrumental in the development of QB Josh Rosen, who had his best collegiate season with Fisch calling the plays. Considered a top prospect in the 2018 NFL Draft, Rosen completed 283-of-452 passing attempts (62.6 percent) for a program-record 3,756 yards with 26 touchdowns and 10 interceptions. Against Texas A&M, UCLA found itself down 34 points in the third quarter and completed the largest comeback win in school history, Rosen finished the contest with 491 yards passing and four touchdowns. Rosen threw for over 350 yards passing in six games during the 2017 season, an accomplishment no other Bruin passer has achieved.

Fisch arrived in Westwood, Calif. after spending two seasons as the passing game coordinator and quarterbacks/wide receivers coach at the University of Michigan. Fisch has nearly two decades of coaching experience, working alongside collegiate and NFL head coaches alike, including Steve Spurrier, Dom Capers, Brian Billick, Mike Shanahan, Pete Carroll, Gus Bradley and Jim Harbaugh, among others.

The Michigan offense flourished in year two of the Fisch tenure in 2016. The Wolverines led the Big Ten in scoring and red zone offense and ranked second in pass efficiency. Record-setting Mackey Award winning tight end Jake Butt earned consensus All-America honors while 10 offensive players earned All-Big Ten honors, including wide receiver Amara Darboh and quarterback Wilton Speight. Wide receiver Jehu Chesson garnered honorable mention Big Ten accolades.

Under his guidance in 2015, Wolverines quarterback Jake Rudock became the second quarterback in school history to pass for 3,000 yards (3,017) and Jake Butt, Jehu Chesson and Amara Darboh became the first trio of receivers in school history to eclipse the 50-reception and 500-yard receiving mark in a season. The offense surpassed 3,000 passing yards for the sixth time in school history, as the 3,090 yards lists fifth all-time at Michigan. U-M threw for over 250 yards in five straight games to finish the season and in six total games.

Before heading to Michigan, Fisch served as the offensive coordinator for the Jacksonville Jaguars. Fisch mentored rookie

quarterback Blake Bortles in 2014, helping him to a 58.9 completion percentage and nearly 3,000 yards of passing in 13 starts. Bortles led all NFL QBs with a 7.48 average per rush, and under Fisch's tutelage, cut down his interceptions to three over the last six games of the season after throwing 14 in his first eight games. Bortles also completed 37 passes of 25-plus yards, second-most among rookie quarterbacks. Fisch developed two rookie receivers in 2014 that did something no one else had done in NFL history: Allen Hurns (51-677, six touchdowns) and Allen Robinson (48-548, two touchdowns) became the first rookie duo in NFL history with at least 48 receptions each.

In his first season with the Jaguars, Fisch guided the offense to improvements in nearly every category from the first eight games to the final eight games, including 31st to eighth in red zone offense and doubling its points per game total.

Fisch spent the two prior seasons (2011-12) at the University of Miami as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. In 2012, the Hurricanes scored more than 40 points on six occasions and averaged 31.4 points and 440.2 yards per game. Under Fisch's direction in 2012, quarterback Stephen Morris threw for a career-high 3,345 passing yards and set a single-season total offense record with 3,415 yards as a first-year starter. In his first season, Fisch tutored quarterback Jacory Harris, who solidified himself as one of the best signal-callers in Miami and ACC history. Harris finished with a single-season school record 65.0 completion percentage while throwing for 20 touchdowns and only nine interceptions. Miami's offense averaged 26.5 points per game and amassed 4,533 yards of total offense in 2011.

Prior to joining Miami, Fisch served as quarterbacks coach for the Seattle Seahawks in 2010 and worked with three-time Pro Bowler Matt Hasselbeck. Fisch joined the Seahawks after serving the 2009 season as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at the University of Minnesota, where he helped the team earn a spot in the Insight Bowl.

In 2008, Fisch was the wide receivers coach at Denver under Mike Shanahan where he tutored Pro Bowl wideout Brandon Marshall to a then career-high 104 receptions for 1,265 yards and six touchdowns. Prior to joining the Broncos, Fisch spent four seasons in Baltimore (2004-07). He was the Ravens' assistant quarterbacks coach in 2007 after serving as the assistant quarterbacks/wide receivers coach from 2005-06 and offensive assistant in 2004. In 2006, the Ravens posted a 13-3 record and won the AFC North. Steve McNair received Pro Bowl honors after setting a franchise record for completion percentage (64.0).

Fisch began his NFL coaching career with the Houston Texans where he served three seasons (2001-03) as an assistant to head coach Dom Capers. Fisch served two seasons (1999-2000) as a graduate assistant under Steve Spurrier at the University of Florida while obtaining a master's degree in sports management. During those two seasons, the Gators advanced to the Citrus (1999) and Sugar (2000) bowls in addition to winning the SEC championship in 2000.

A native of Livingston, N.J., Fisch earned a degree in criminology from Florida in 1998. From 1997-98, Fisch was the defensive coordinator for P.K. Yonge High School in Gainesville, and he then spent one year (1998) with the New Jersey Red Devils of the Arena Football League as a wide receivers/quality control coach.

Fisch and his wife Amber have three daughters: Zaylee, Ashlee and Kendall.

In Johnson's first season overseeing the Rams defensive line, DT Aaron Donald was named The Associated Press Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the first player in franchise history to be honored with that award and the first DT to be named DPOY since 1999. On the season, Donald tallied 11.0 sacks in addition to 91 QB pressures which was 12 more than any edge rusher and 21 more than any other defensive lineman.

Johnson's eight years in charge of the Saints' defensive line saw numerous achievements and records set in New Orleans. In 2015, DE Cameron Jordan became the ninth player in team history to record multiple seasons with double-digit sacks. In addition, under Johnson's guidance, Jordan earned two Pro Bowl appearances. In his third NFL season in 2012, Jordan finished fifth in the NFL with 12.5 sacks.

In Johnson's debut season with the Saints in 2009, DE Will Smith finished the year fifth in the NFL with a career-high 13.0 sacks en route to a Super Bowl XLIV victory.

In his stop before New Orleans, Johnson spent the 2007-08 seasons as the defensive line coach with the Denver Broncos. In 2007, DE Elvis Dumervil's 12.5 sacks ranked sixth in the NFL.

Johnson had a six-year stint in Atlanta as defensive line coach of the Falcons. In two of his six seasons with the Falcons, Johnson's defensive lines helped the defense rank in the top-10 in fewest yards allowed and fewest yards per rush. Johnson also tutored Patrick Kerney and Rod Coleman to Pro Bowl

appearances. Coleman led all NFL defensive tackles in sacks from 2004-06 and Kerney had 53.0 sacks from 2004-06.

The Falcons made an appearance in the 2004 NFC Championship Game after Johnson's defensive line led the NFL in sacks during the 2004 regular season.

Before entering the NFL ranks, Johnson spent one season as the defensive line coach at Arkansas – his second stint with the Razorbacks.

Prior to his time in Fayetteville, Johnson was the defensive line coach at Texas A&M from 1992-99. In his eight seasons at Texas A&M, Johnson had nine defensive linemen selected in the NFL Draft.

Johnson was the defensive line coach for two years during his first stint at Arkansas from 1990-91 after working at Louisiana Tech from 1988-89.

During the 1987 season, Johnson worked under College Football Hall of Fame coach Jimmy Johnson at the University of Miami as a graduate assistant. He worked on the Hurricanes' team that would go on to be crowned 1987 National Champions.

Johnson spent two years on the defensive coaching staff at McNeese State, first as the defensive line coach, followed by a year guiding the team's outside linebackers.

Northwestern State, Johnson's alma mater, gave him his first start in coaching in 1980 as a graduate assistant. He would then be elevated to defensive ends/outside linebackers coach from 1982-84.

At Northwestern State, Johnson was a two-year starter at center and was on the team from 1976-79.

Aaron Kromer begins his second season with the Los Angeles Rams, his first season serving as the team's run game coordinator.

In his first season with the Rams, Kromer served as the offensive line coach overseeing the most stable offensive line unit in the NFL during the 2017 season. With the help of Kromer and the offensive coaching staff, the Rams improved from the 32nd ranked scoring team in 2016 to the league's top-scoring team in 2017.

Under Kromer's guidance, the offensive line blocked for RB Todd Gurley II, who was named The Associated Press Offensive Player of the Year after leading the league in scrimmage yards (2,093) and total touchdowns (19).

A veteran of more than 17 years as an offensive line coach, Kromer came to Los Angeles prior to the 2017 season after serving the past two seasons in the same capacity with the Buffalo Bills. In his 18 years as an NFL offensive line coach or coordinator, Kromer has helped 16 players earn a total of 23 Pro Bowl appearances.

The Bills offensive line helped to pave the way for the club to have the top-ranked rush offense in both of Kromer's years in Buffalo. In 2016, the Bills rushed for 164.4 yards per game the season after having an offense that averaged 152.0 yards per game in 2015. Also for the second consecutive year in 2016, the Bills had three players rush for 500 or more yards – LeSean McCoy (1,267), Tyrod Taylor (580) and Mike Gillislee (577). When the Bills accomplished the feat in 2015, it had not happened since 1962.

Before his two seasons in Buffalo, Kromer served as the offensive coordinator of the Chicago Bears from 2013-14 as well as the offensive coordinator/offensive line coach his first season in Chicago in 2013. G Kyle Long was named to the Pro Bowl in both of the seasons he played for Kromer in Chicago. Long

was the first Bears offensive lineman to earn a Pro Bowl berth in seven seasons.

Kromer's longest stop in the NFL came in New Orleans, where he was the offensive line coach/running game coordinator from 2008-12. In his five seasons with the Saints, Kromer helped five offensive linemen earn 10 Pro Bowl nods.

New Orleans' high-powered offense was bolstered by Kromer's offensive line allowing the fewest number of sacks during his time in charge of the unit. In his first season with the Saints, Kromer coached an offensive line that helped to block for the NFL's No. 1-ranked offense in total yards and scoring en route to a Super Bowl XLIV victory.

Prior to his time with the Saints, Kromer spent three seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, joining the club as a senior assistant in 2005 before being named senior assistant/offensive line coach for his final two seasons. In his first two seasons, Kromer helped two Buccaneer offensive linemen to All-Rookie honors.

Kromer got his start in the NFL in Oakland, first as the assistant offensive line coach in 2001 before being elevated to offensive line coach from 2002-04. Kromer helped two Raiders offensive linemen earn three Pro Bowl berths as well as helping Oakland represent the AFC in Super Bowl XXXVII.

Before making the jump to the NFL, Kromer was the offensive line coach at Northwestern University from 1999-00. After his four seasons as an offensive tackle at Miami (Ohio), Kromer began his coaching career spending nine seasons at his alma mater in a variety of positions, starting as a graduate assistant in 1990.

Kromer and his wife, Dawn, have two children – a son, Zak and a daughter, Brooke.

Skip Peete, a veteran of 19 seasons as an NFL assistant, coaches the Rams' running backs. Peete's group is led by Todd Gurley II, who has compiled 3,296 rushing yards and 1,303 receiving yards in 44 games.

During the 2017 campaign, Peete worked directly with Gurley, who was an MVP candidate and brought home *Associated Press* Offensive Player of the Year accolades after a career-year in his third NFL season. Gurley became the first Ram to win Offensive Player of the Year since Marshall Faulk won the award in 2001.

In 2017, Gurley led the NFL in touchdowns (19), points scored among non-kickers (114) and scrimmage yards (2,093), in addition to finishing second in rushing yards (1,305). The former Georgia Bulldog was among the best receiving backs in the NFL, finishing second in the league in receiving yards by a running back (788) and posting the best reception average among running backs (12.3 yards per reception). On the season, Gurley averaged 6.1 yards per touch.

Prior to his arrival in Los Angeles, Peete spent two seasons as the running backs coach for the Chicago Bears. In his two years with the Bears (2013-14), Matt Forte led the NFL in yards from scrimmage (3,779) and was fourth in the league in rushing yards (2,377). Forte's 22 total touchdowns during those two seasons ranked 10th in the NFL. Peete also worked with Forte in his receiving game, as his 176 receptions during those two seasons were eighth-most in the NFL overall and top amongst running backs. Forte's 1,402 receiving yards during those two seasons were also best among NFL running backs.

In 2014, Peete helped Forte set an NFL single-season record for receptions by a running back with 102. Under Peete's tutelage, Forte added 1,038 rushing yards in 2014 to become one-of-two players in NFL history with 1,000 rushing yards and 100 receptions in a single season along with LaDainian Tomlinson (Chargers, 2003).

In 2013, with the aid of Peete's coaching, Forte was named to his second-career Pro Bowl after finishing second in the NFL with 1,339 rushing yards and third with 1,933 yards from scrimmage. Both were career-bests for Forte ranking ninth and fifth, respectively, in single-season franchise history and most among players other than Hall of Famer Walter Payton. With Peete's guidance, Forte added a career-best nine rushing touchdowns in 2013, which were tied for the sixth most in the NFL and his 12 overall touchdowns also tied a career-high.

Peete joined the Bears after a six-year stint as running backs coach with the Dallas Cowboys (2007-12). During his tenure in Dallas, the Cowboys rushing attack set a franchise single-season record in 2009 with a 4.8 yards per carry average (2,103 yards on 436 attempts), which ranked second in the NFL that season. Dallas' 131.4 rushing yards per game was seventh

in the league in 2009. His 2011 squad finished with the ninth-highest rushing average in franchise history at 4.4 yards per attempt (1,807 yards on 408 carries).

In 2009, under Peete's guidance, RB Felix Jones established a single-season franchise mark averaging 5.9 yards per carry (685 yards on 116 attempts). His rushing average led the league in 2009 and is 10th highest in NFL single-season annals among running backs since the 1970 merger. RB DeMarco Murray's 5.5 rushing average (897 yards on 164 attempts) in 2011 is third-highest in single-season franchise history and was third-highest in the NFL that season (second amongst running backs). It is the seventh highest rushing average by a rookie since 1970 and fifth highest during that time among rookie running backs.

In his first season with the club in 2007, Peete helped Marion Barber earn his first career Pro Bowl nod as Barber rushed for a career-high 975 rushing yards to go along with 10 touchdowns.

Prior to his time in Dallas, Peete spent nine seasons (1998-2006) coaching running backs with the Oakland Raiders. During that time, Peete directed Tyrone Wheatley (1,046 in 2000) and LaMont Jordan (1,025 in 2005) to career highs in rushing yards. The 1,000-yard rushing seasons are two of 14 such occurrences in franchise history and rank 10th and 11th, respectively in Raiders annals. Oakland led the league in rushing in 2000 averaging 154.4 yards per game, ninth best in franchise history.

During the Raiders 2002 AFC Championship season, Charlie Garner had 941 receiving yards on 91 receptions, fourth and fifth most all-time in NFL single-season history among running backs.

Before coming to the NFL, Peete spent 10 seasons (1988-1997) in the collegiate coaching ranks. He began his career at the University of Pittsburgh as a graduate assistant in 1988 before coaching the wide receivers for two seasons. He was the Panthers running backs coach for his final two seasons at Pittsburgh, coaching future NFL Hall of Famer Curtis Martin. Peete went on to coach the wide receivers at Michigan State (1993-94) and Rutgers (1995) before coaching the running backs at UCLA for two seasons (1996-97).

Collegiately, Peete played two seasons at Arizona (1981-82) before transferring to Kansas. During his time at Kansas, Peete was an All-Big Eight wide receiver (1985) and was voted team captain in his senior year of 1986. He played wide receiver and special teams for one season in the NFL with the New York Jets.

Peete's father, Willie, is a longtime college and NFL coach. His brother, Rodney, is a former NFL quarterback, who played 16 seasons. A Phoenix native, Peete and his wife, Rebeca, have twins, a son, Reeco and a daughter, Gisele.

Aubrey Pleasant is in his second season with the Los Angeles Rams as the cornerbacks coach in 2018.

Pleasant played an integral role in implementing defensive coordinator Wade Phillips' scheme. With the guidance of Pleasant, CBs Trumaine Johnson, Nickell Robey-Coleman and Kevin Peterson all recorded two interceptions on the season.

As a unit, the Rams defense forced 28 takeaways, including 18 interceptions, tied for the sixth-highest interception total in 2017. L.A. scored 126 points off of takeaways, which was the second-most points off takeaways a season ago.

Prior to joining the Rams, Pleasant spent four seasons with the Washington Redskins from 2013-2016. He served as an offensive assistant in his first season in Washington in 2013 before transitioning to the defensive side of the ball prior to the 2014 season and working extensively with the team's defensive backs.

In 2015, Pleasant played a pivotal role in assisting Defensive Backs Coach Perry Fewell with a secondary that was besieged by injuries throughout the season. Pleasant aided in the transition of Quinton Dunbar, who joined the Redskins as a college free agent wide receiver before switching to cornerback in the middle of training camp. Dunbar played in 11 games, making one start and intercepting Giants quarterback Eli Manning in a crucial Week 12 victory during the Redskins' NFC East championship season. Pleasant also assisted in the midseason transition of 12-year NFL veteran DeAngelo Hall from cornerback to safety and the rapid development of sixth-round pick Kyshoen Jarrett, a safety who also contributed significantly at nickel after volunteering for the role in camp.

Pleasant transitioned to the defensive side of the ball in 2014 after spending his first season with the Redskins as an offensive assistant. In 2014, he assisted Defensive Backs Coach Raheem Morris and played a significant role in the development of fourth-round pick Bashaud Breeland. With Pleasant's guidance, Breeland started 15 games – third-most by a rookie cornerback in Redskins history behind only Champ Bailey (16 in 1999) and Pro Football Hall of Famer Darrell Green (16 in 1983) – and tied for the NFL rookie lead in passes defended (14).

Pleasant was an offensive staff/head coach intern for the Cleveland Browns before joining the Redskins. Prior to his time in Cleveland, he spent two years with the University of Michigan as a defensive graduate assistant, helping the team appear in back-to-back bowl games. With Pleasant working specifically with the defensive backs in 2011, Michigan allowed 190.5 yards passing per game and 17.4 points per game, ranking No. 16 and sixth in the nation, respectively. Michigan's total defense improved to No. 17 in the nation (322.2 ypg.) after ranking No. 110 (450.8 ypg.) the year prior to Pleasant's arrival. Michigan's defense allowed only 12 touchdown passes, led the Big Ten with 29 takeaways and tied for first in Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) with 20 fumble recoveries.

In 2012, Pleasant was promoted to Assistant Defensive Backs Coach, helping Michigan's total defense (320.0 ypg.) and passing yards allowed (169.5 ypg.) improve to No. 13 and No. 5 in the country, respectively. Following Michigan's 2012 season, Pleasant was one of 30 coaches nationwide invited to the NCAA Future Football Coaches Academy in San Antonio.

Pleasant coached defensive backs at Grand Blanc (Mich.) H.S. in 2010 and was a behavioral specialist/special needs teacher in the Flint Community School District. His duties included working directly with cognitively-impaired and academically-neglected adult students to help educate them within the Flint school district.

Pleasant was a three-year letterman at Wisconsin from 2005-08, appearing in 41 career games with 14 starts at safety. He finished his collegiate career with 80 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, two sacks, one forced fumble and appeared in four consecutive bowl games: Capital One (2005 and 2006), Outback (2007) and Champs Sports (2008). Pleasant received a master's degree in education while coaching at Michigan and earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from Wisconsin in 2009.

Pleasant is a native of Flint, Mich., where he graduated from the city's Montrose H.S., receiving Class B all-state honorable mention honor at safety his senior year. He attended Flint Northern H.S. and earned all-city running back honors as a sophomore.

In his first season leading his own strength and conditioning program, Rath was named the Strength Coach of the year by the Professional Football Strength and Conditioning Coaches Association, an award voted on by strength and conditioning coaches around the NFL.

Rath was an integral part in the Rams sports science program, which helped L.A. finish the 2017 season as the healthiest NFL team based on adjusted games lost, according to Football Outsiders, an innovative statistics website.

Prior to joining the Rams, Rath was named assistant strength and conditioning coach in Miami for the 2016 season. Before his stint with the Dolphins, he spent seven seasons (2009-15) with the Detroit Lions as an assistant strength and conditioning coach. In 2011, the Lions won 11 games, the most the franchise had won in a single season since 1991.

In Detroit, Rath helped start the annual Detroit Lions Strength and Conditioning Clinic in 2011. The event is a forum for providing, sharing and exchanging information in the ever-changing world of strength and conditioning.

Prior to Detroit, Rath was an assistant director of strength and conditioning at his alma mater, Toledo, where he directed the strength and conditioning programs for all 15 of the school's Olympic sports. He also assisted with all phases of football training, including design and implementation of its workouts. Rath spent time at Toledo as a graduate assistant in the strength and conditioning department, focusing on the strength programs for men's basketball, baseball, track, cross country, golf and swimming.

He began his professional career at Crestwood High School (Dearborn Heights, Mich.) where he served as an assistant football coach and directed the school's speed and strength training.

Rath played linebacker at Toledo from 2003-06 and helped the Rockets win the 2004 Mid-American Conference championship. He is certified through the Collegiate Strength and Conditioning Coaches Association (C.S.C.C.A.), has written articles for several industry publications and speaks regularly at conferences and football camps.

Rath married to his wife, Robin. The couple have three children, Brooklyn, Brady and Emerson.

With the help of Shula, LBs Alec Ogletree and Mark Barron each posted over 100 tackles. Barron, a converted safety playing his first season in Defensive Coordinator Wade Phillips' system, posted a career-high and tied for a team-best three interceptions on the season.

Prior to joining the Rams in 2017, Shula spent the previous two seasons as defensive quality control coach with the then San Diego Chargers.

In his capacity with the Chargers, Shula assisted with the defensive line, which saw a breakout season from rookie DE Joey Bosa, who finished the 2016 season tied for sixth in the AFC in sacks, with 10.5.

Shula entered the NFL after spending one season as defensive coordinator at John Carroll University in 2014. In that season, John Carroll reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division III playoffs and finished 10th in Division III in scoring defense.

Prior to his time at John Carroll University, Shula spent three seasons as a graduate assistant, working primarily with defensive backs at Indiana University. Shula entered the coaching ranks as the assistant linebackers coach at Ball State in 2010.

Shula was a linebacker at Miami (Ohio) from 2004-08, where he was a teammate of Rams Head Coach Sean McVay for four seasons.

Shula is the son of David Shula, former head coach of the Cincinnati Bengals from 1992-96, and the grandson of Hall of Fame Head Coach Don Shula. The Shulas are one-of-two three-generation coaching families in NFL history.

Zac Taylor enters his second season with the Los Angeles Rams and his first as quarterbacks coach in 2018 after spending the 2017 season as assistant wide receivers coach.

The Rams finished the regular season with the third-most receiving yards among rookie pass catchers. WR Cooper Kupp (869), TE Gerald Everett (244) and WR Josh Reynolds (104) all contributed to a passing attack that finished the season ranked 10th in the NFL. Kupp, Everett and Reynolds combined for 1,217 of the Rams 4,023 receiving yards.

Coming from the collegiate ranks, he previously served as the offensive coordinator for the University of Cincinnati Bearcats. He also assumed the role of quarterbacks coach after joining the staff in January 2016.

Taylor brought NFL experience to the Bearcats, having spent four seasons with the Miami Dolphins (2012-15), serving as the team's offensive coordinator and primary play-caller for the second half of the 2015 campaign. He spent three-and-a-half years as the team's quarterbacks coach, having been named to that position on January 30, 2013. Taylor originally joined the Dolphin organization as the team's assistant quarterbacks coach on January 30, 2012.

During his time in Miami, Taylor was instrumental in the development of signal caller Ryan Tannehill. Tannehill threw for 3,000 or more yards in each of his first four seasons, the first quarterback in team history to achieve that feat and only the second quarterback to have multiple 3,000 yard passing seasons along with Hall of Famer Dan Marino.

Tannehill's 15,460 passing yards in his first four seasons are the third-most among all quarterbacks in NFL history in their first three seasons according to Pro-Football-Reference.com, trailing Peyton Manning (1998-2001/16,418) and Dan Marino (1983-86/16,177). Tannehill set a career mark in 2015 with 4,208 yards passing, going 363-for-586 with 24 touchdowns and a rating of 88.7.

In 2014, Tannehill threw 27 touchdowns, a career high and the sixth-most in Dolphins history. It was the most since Marino threw 30 in 1994. Tannehill also set career highs with a completion percentage of 66.4 and a passer rating of 92.8. Additionally, Tannehill set a franchise record with his 392 completions, surpassing Marino's 385 in 1994.

In 2013, under Taylor's guidance, Tannehill threw for 3,912 passing yards. His 7,207 passing yards through his first two seasons were the fifth-most by any quarterback over the course of their first two seasons in NFL history.

In 2012, Tannehill set team rookie records in passing yards (3,294), attempts (484), and completions (282) and he became the first quarterback in Dolphins history to start all of the team's games as a rookie.

Taylor joined the Dolphins from Texas A&M University, where he served as the offensive graduate assistant and tight ends coach from 2008-11 under head coach Mike Sherman. The Aggies shared the Big 12 South Championship in 2010 and played in three bowl games during Taylor's time in College Station.

As a player, Taylor spent time with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers after being signed as an undrafted college free agent on April 29, 2007, but was waived prior to the start of training camp. He then joined the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the Canadian Football League in the fall of 2007.

Taylor completed a two-year career at Nebraska, setting nearly every Huskers passing record. He threw for 5,850 yards and 45 touchdowns in his career. In 2017, Taylor was inducted into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame.

The 2006 Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year, Taylor passed for more than 3,100 yards as a senior, leading the Cornhuskers to a 9-3 record, an appearance in the Big 12 Championship Game and a matchup against the Auburn Tigers in the Cotton Bowl. He earned a bachelor's degree in communication studies from Nebraska in 2006.

Prior to his time at Nebraska, Taylor passed for nearly 3,000 yards and 29 touchdowns at Butler County CC (Kan.) to earn second-team NJCAA All-America honors. He helped lead the Grizzlies to the NJCAA championship game, where they lost to Pearl River JC (Miss.). Taylor began his collegiate career at Wake Forest, redshirting in 2002 and serving as the Demon Deacons' backup quarterback in 2003.

Taylor's father, Sherwood, was a defensive back and captain for Oklahoma. His Brother, Press, is currently the quarterbacks coach for the Philadelphia Eagles.

Zac and his wife, Sarah, are the parents of four children: Brooks, Luke, Emma Claire and Milly.

Waldron is entering his seventh NFL season, second with the Los Angeles Rams and his first season serving as the team's passing game coordinator.

Under Waldron's guidance in 2017, the tight end duo of Tyler Higbee and Gerald Everett combined for 539 yards, three touchdowns and averaged 13.1 yards per reception. Everett recorded a 69-yard reception in his second game as a professional which tied for the second-longest reception by a tight end during the 2017 season.

Previously, Waldron served as the Washington Redskins offensive quality control coach for the 2016 season. That season, Washington's offense broke the franchise record for total net yards in a single season (6,454), surpassing the previous team record set in 1989. That same Redskins team averaged 403.4 yards per game, becoming the first team in franchise history to average 400 yards per game. In the NFL rankings, Washington ranked third in total offense.

Prior to joining the Redskins, Waldron spent four seasons at UMass, serving as the Minutemen's Recruiting Coordinator/Tight Ends Coach from 2012-13 and Offensive Line Coach from 2014-15. Waldron helped guide tight end Rob Branchflower to a seventh-round selection by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the 2014 NFL Draft after Branchflower set the school record for most career receiving yards by a tight end.

In 2011, Waldron served as the offensive coordinator at the Buckingham Browne & Nichols H.S. (Mass.) and also as a Northeast Sports Consultant. A year earlier, he served as Wide Receivers Coach for the Hartford Colonials of the United Football League.

Before his stint in the UFL, Waldron worked with the New England Patriots in various capacities across five seasons with the franchise. Beginning in 2002, Waldron served as an operations intern for two seasons before being promoted to the title of an operations assistant in 2004, when he handled special teams quality control duties in addition to overseeing the completion of weekly game plans. After three years coaching at Notre Dame, Waldron returned to New England in 2008 to serve as an offensive quality control coach and later served as the tight ends coach in 2009.

Waldron spent the 2005-07 seasons as an offensive graduate assistant at Notre Dame. With the Irish, he helped guide two of the most explosive offenses in school history, as both the 2005 and 2006 units averaged at least 31 points per game.

A native of Portland, Ore., Waldron is a 2002 graduate of Tufts University, where he was a three-year letterman as a tight end and long snapper. He is married to Meghan, and they have two daughters, Lainey and Rylee.

Dustin Woods enters his second NFL season and first season with the Los Angeles Rams as an assistant strength and conditioning coach in 2018.

Woods joins the Rams after his second stint as the Chinese Olympic Skating Association's Short Track Head Strength and Conditioning Coach during the 2018 Winter Olympic Games, the same position he held leading up to the 2014 Winter Olympic Games.

During the 2018 Games, China's Wu Dajing set a new world record and won the men's 500m short-track speed skating event. The win marked the first gold medal for China at the Pyeongchang Games and was the first gold medal for China in men's short track at the Olympics. In total, China speed skaters brought home three medals in 2018.

During the 2014 Games, China won two gold medals, three silver medals and one bronze medal, the most combined medals in men's and women's short track.

In between Olympic Games, Woods worked at Xavier University as a strength and conditioning coach, Ignition Performance Group as an international and university performance coordinator, and the Olympic Winter Institute of Australia as a consultant for short track speed skating.

Woods broke into the NFL with the Cincinnati Bengals as a part-time assistant strength and conditioning staff during the 2015 season.

Dustin and his wife, Allyse, have two children, a son, Eli, and a daughter, Zoe.

Los Angeles native Eric Yarber is in his second season with the Los Angeles Rams, serving as the team's wide receivers coach.

During the 2017 season, newly acquired WR Robert Woods recorded a personal-best 781 yards receiving, which ranked third amongst the 2017 free agent wide receiver group. Rookie WR Cooper Kupp finished with a team-best 869 yards receiving, the second-most amongst all rookies and was named to the *Pro Football Writers Association (PFWA) All-Rookie team*.

Prior to joining the Rams in 2017, Yarber spent the previous five seasons with the UCLA Bruins in the same capacity. Previously, he held NFL coaching positions with the Seattle Seahawks, San Francisco 49ers and Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

Yarber joined the Bruins staff as receivers coach in 2012. During his five season tenure, seven of Yarber's wide receivers were selected in the NFL Draft, including three of his Bruin receivers in the 2016 NFL Draft.

The Bruins pass offense ranked 18th in the nation (295.6 yards per game) in 2016. The season saw the emergence of receivers Darren Andrews, Jordan Lasley and Kenneth Walker. Andrews ranked 10th in the Pac-12 in receptions per game and led the team with 55 catches. Lasley came on strong over the course of the season and recorded 41 receptions while leading the team with six touchdowns. Walker caught 22 balls and scored four times.

Jordan Payton was invited to the Senior Bowl and then chosen by Cleveland in the 2016 NFL Draft. Payton became UCLA's all-time receptions leader during the 2015 campaign and became the first Bruin to ever catch 200 career passes. He also moved up to third on the all-time receiving yards list and ranked among the nation's top 25 in receiving yards (1,106) and receiving yards per game (85.1). Thomas Duarte, a Miami Dolphin draft selection, earned second-team all-conference honors after registering 10 touchdown catches which ranks fourth on the all-time school single-season list and was 17th in the NCAA. Devin Fuller, drafted by the Atlanta Falcons, moved up to the top six in career receptions.

In year two at UCLA, Yarber helped senior Shaq Evans, a fourth-round selection of the New York Jets in the 2014 NFL Draft, finish his career ranked tied for 10th on the school's all-time reception list. Evans earned an invite to the Senior Bowl and the NFL Combine after catching nine scoring passes in 2013, tied for ninth on the all-time school list.

In 2011, Yarber worked as Tampa Bay's wide receivers coach for a promising young unit that included the development of second-round pick Arrelious Benn and fourth-round pick Mike Williams. Williams turned in one of the top seasons by a receiver in Buccaneers history, recording 65 receptions for 964 yards and 11 touchdowns. He led all rookie receivers in each of these categories, earning *The Sporting News* and *PFW/PFWA All-Rookie Team* selection while finishing second in voting for the *Associated Press Offensive Rookie of the Year Award*. Yarber also oversaw the emergence of Benn, who was becoming an

important part of the Tampa Bay offense prior to a season-ending knee injury in Week 13.

Yarber came to Tampa Bay after spending three seasons (2007-09) on the collegiate level as the wide receivers coach at Arizona State. While at ASU in 2009, Yarber coached two standout wide receivers in Kyle Williams and Chris McGaha. Williams finished the 2009 campaign with 815 receiving yards on 57 catches and eight scores before being invited to the Senior Bowl and becoming a sixth-round draft pick of the San Francisco 49ers in the 2010 NFL Draft. McGaha racked up 56 catches for 673 yards and four touchdowns on his way to second-team All-Pac 10 honors.

Prior to his work with the Sun Devils, Yarber coached wide receivers for two seasons (2005-06) under Tyrone Willingham at the University of Washington. With Yarber's assistance, two receivers, Sonny Shackelford and Anthony Russo, turned in strong performances, with Russo finishing third in the Pacific-10 Conference with a 17.3 yards-per-catch average and Shackelford finishing fourth in touchdown catches (seven) and eighth in receptions (50) and receiving yards (666).

During the 2003-04 seasons, Yarber coached the San Francisco 49ers' wide receivers, and in his first year guided Pro Bowler Terrell Owens to a 1,000-yard season. During this time, Yarber was also instrumental in the development of wide receivers Cedrick Wilson and Brandon Lloyd, as the duo ranked first and second among 49ers' receivers in yards after the catch with a 13.6 and 13.1 average (min. 10 receptions) respectively in 2004.

From 1999-2002, Yarber coached at Oregon State, where he worked with running backs for one season (1999) before switching to wide receivers (2000-2002). His work with receivers Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh led to the two being selected in the second and seventh rounds, respectively, by the Cincinnati Bengals in the 2001 NFL Draft. Johnson also earned a Senior Bowl invitation.

Yarber coached his first year in the NFL in 1998, working as an offensive quality control coach with the Seattle Seahawks, after spending the 1997 season coaching receivers at UNLV. His coaching career began in 1996 when he took a secondary coaching position at his alma mater, Idaho.

Yarber was selected by the Washington Redskins as a 12th-round pick in the 1986 NFL Draft and spent three seasons as a wide receiver and punt returner. He was part of the Washington squad that defeated the Denver Broncos to win Super Bowl XXII in 1988, leading that team with 37 punt returns. At Idaho, Yarber was a Kodak All-American and the Big Sky Conference's Most Valuable Player during his senior year, catching 75 passes for 1,103 yards. As a junior, he finished 10th in the nation in punt returns and third in the conference with 817 receiving yards on 54 catches. He attended Crenshaw High School in Los Angeles.

Yarber earned a Bachelor's in General Studies from the University of Idaho in 1995. He is married to Estevanica, and has one son, Kameryon.

Billy Nayas enters his second season with the Los Angeles Rams. He is responsible for coordinating the team schedule and manages all communication between Head Coach Sean McVay and football operations.

Before joining the Rams, Nayas spent 2015-16 with the San Francisco 49ers in a similar role where he worked alongside Head Coach Jim Tomsula (2015) and Head Coach Chip Kelly (2016). This marked his second stint with the club. He previously held the same position with the 49ers from 2009-12, where he served under both Jim Harbaugh and Mike Singletary.

Nayas spent two years (2013-14) at North Carolina State as the program's director of football operations under Head Coach Dave Doeren. In that role, he was responsible for budgeting, team travel, camps, operational schedules and team bowl trips. He also served as a liaison between football and various departments and supervised office personnel.

Prior to his stint with San Francisco, Nayas served as assistant athletic director/director of football operations at his alma mater, the University of Wisconsin from 2006-09 for Head Coach Bret Bielema.

Before his time at Wisconsin, Nayas served as football operations coordinator/team travel with the Seattle Seahawks under then head coach Mike Holmgren from 1999-06. During his seven years in Seattle, he was responsible for all aspects of the team's travel, including the budget, team charters, hotel accommodations, meal arrangements and ground transportation. Nayas also organized the Seahawks' training camp and mini-camps as well as the team's operational schedules.

Nayas was originally hired full time by the Packers in 1997 after serving as a training camp intern during the summers of 1995 and 1996. He worked under Holmgren as an administrative assistant/football operations until 1999.

During his years of working in football operations, which initially began at his alma mater as a student football manager for Head Coach Barry Alvarez before moving into a football operations assistant role upon graduation. Nayas has been a part of seven college bowl games, five international games, 10 NFL postseasons and four Super Bowls.

Nayas graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Wisconsin, in 1994. He and his wife, Paige, have a daughter, Natalia, and a son, Joe.
