



LOS ANGELES RAMS POSTGAME NOTES RAMS 20, BROWNS 13 **WEEK 3 · SEPTEMBER 22, 2019**



RAMS OFFENSIVE NOTES

WR Cooper Kupp recorded 11 receptions on the night – including 2 TD catches – besting his previous single-game high of nine catches (Wk 4 vs. MIN, 2018).

QB Jared Goff threw 2 TD passes to Kupp, which included Kupp's first TD since suffering a season-ending injury in 2018 and marked his second career game with multiple TDs. Goff has now thrown a total of 13 TD passes to Kupp, the most of any Rams receiver. WR Robert Woods is second with 11 TD rec. from Goff.

Both **Kupp** and WR **Brandin Cooks** finished the night with 100+ yards receiving for the 15th and fifth times, respectively, in their careers. It was the first time L.A. had two receivers with 100+ yards in a game since Week 4 vs. Minnesota in 2018.

RAMS DEFENSIVE NOTES

LB Clay Matthews has earned at least 1.0 sack in each of his first three games as a member of the Rams. The 11year pro amassed 3.0 sacks tonight, the first multi-sack game of his career since 2017 (3.0 sacks - 12/3 vs. TB). Matthews has 88.5 career sacks.

DT Aaron Donald added to the team's sack total, earning his first sack of the season in the fourth quarter.

With 3 tackles, CB Marcus Peters eclipsed the 200-mark for career tackles, according to SportRadar.

S John Johnson III recorded his second interception of the season to close out the game. It is the second time in Johnson's career he has interceptions in consecutive games, previously accomplishing the feat in Weeks 6 and 7 of the 2018 season. Johnson also led L.A. with 9 tackles tonight.

ADDITIONAL NOTES



- With a 53-yard field goal, K **Greg Zuerlein** extended his streak of games with points scored to 16 games, dating back to Week 7 of the 2018 season (including postseason). The kick was his 30th field goal made from 50+ yards. Entering the game, Zuerlein has converted 29-of-49 field goals of 50+ yards.
- RB Todd Gurley passed Elroy Hirsch for ninth-most yards from scrimmage in team history after recording 43 scrimmage yards tonight.
- With a 9-yard reception in the second quarter, WR Robert Woods passed Kenny Britt and Robert Delpin (152 rec) and moved into the Top 30 of the Rams' all-time receptions list. Woods finished the game with 3 rec (155 total with LA). With 58 scrimmage yards, Woods also passed Charles White (2,309 yds) and into 42nd place on the Rams all-time scrimmage leaders list.
- TE **Johnny Mundt** was active for his first game of the 2019 season, and OL **Coleman Shelton** was active for his first career NFL game.
- Tonight, **Jamil Demby** started at right guard, marking the first time he started an NFL game in his career. TE **Gerald Everett** started his first game of the season (third start in his career) and surpassed 600 career receiving yds. on 2 rec. for 15 yds. in tonight's matchup.
- Rams QB **Jared Goff** extended his winning streak over fellow quarterbacks drafted No. 1 overall to six games after defeating the Cleveland Browns. Goff was taken with the No. 1 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft and Browns QB Baker Mayfield was the top player selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Since entering the league, Goff has faced fellow first-overall selections seven times, with a 6-1 record. His lone loss came in the final week of his rookie season to the Arizona Cardinals (Carson Palmer, 2003 No. 1 pick).
- L.A. has now defeated Cleveland in three consecutive meetings, giving the Rams a 13-11 edge in their all-time series (including postseason). Los Angeles remains a perfect 9-0 in regular season games against AFC opponents under Head Coach **Sean McVay**. Since McVay took over as head coach, the Rams have generated a 15-3 record in regular season games on the road.
- The Rams have played in Sunday Night Football games a total of 23 times, and with tonight's victory now have nine SNF wins. Tonight's game marked the first of five primetime games for L.A. in the 2019 season.
