



## RAMS POSSESS SEVEN PICKS IN 2020 NFL DRAFT



Los Angeles owns seven picks in 2020 draft, including three in the top-100



### First Round Trades Under Snead



The 2020 NFL Draft marks the seventh time the Snead administration executed a trade in or out of the first round. Here is a look back at the previous first-round moves since Snead took over as the Rams General Manager in 2012.

#### 2012 NFL Draft

The Rams held the No. 2 overall selection and traded it to the Washington Redskins. In that trade, the Rams acquired Washington's sixth and 39th overall selections in 2012, as well as their first round picks in 2013 (DT Michael Brockers via Dallas) and 2014 (T Greg Robinson).

#### 2013 NFL Draft

On the first day of the draft, the Rams executed two trades in the first round. The Rams held the No. 16 overall selection and traded up to No. 8 with the Buffalo Bills to select WR Tavon Austin, and picked up the Bills' 71st selection. In exchange, the Bills received the Rams No. 16, 46, 78 and 222 selections.

Also in the first round of the 2013 draft, the Rams held the No. 22 overall selection (via the 2012 trade with the Redskins) and traded back with Atlanta at No. 30 to select LB Alec Ogletree. The Falcons also received the Rams seventh-round pick (from New England). In exchange, the Rams, received the No. 30, 92 and 198 selections.

#### 2016 NFL Draft

The Rams negotiated a trade with the Titans to receive the No. 1 overall pick, as well as their 2016 fourth-round (No. 113) and sixth-round (No. 177) selections. Tennessee received the Rams' first-round selection (No. 15), two second-round picks (Nos. 43, 45), and a third-round pick (No. 76) in 2016. In the 2017 draft, the Titans received the Rams' first and third-round selections.

#### 2018 NFL Draft

L.A. didn't wait around until draft night to acquire offensive fire power, as the team agreed to terms to acquire WR Brandin Cooks from the New England Patriots on April 3. The Rams received Cooks and New England's No. 136 overall pick in the fourth round in exchange for the Rams' No. 23 overall pick and No. 198 overall in the sixth round in the 2018 NFL Draft.

#### 2019 NFL Draft

On the opening night of the 2019 NFL Draft, Snead made a trade with the Atlanta Falcons, sending L.A.'s first and sixth-round selections to Atlanta in exchange for the Falcons' second and third-round picks. L.A. eventually sent the second-round pick to New England, but used Atlanta's third-round choice to draft CB David Long Jr. out of Michigan.

#### 2020 NFL Draft

In a blockbuster move during the 2019 campaign, Snead acquired Pro Bowl CB Jalen Ramsey from the Jacksonville Jaguars in exchange for L.A.'s 2020 and 2021 first-round selections, along with a 2021 fourth-round selection.

### Rams, you're on the clock!

The Los Angeles Rams hold five selections entering the 2020 NFL Draft, the 84th draft in franchise history and the 54th time drafting as the Los Angeles Rams.

General Manager Les Snead is entering his ninth draft guiding the Rams franchise. He has seven selections including No 52 overall, marking the fourth consecutive season L.A. will not pick in the first round of the draft.

Despite not retaining its first round selection in 2019, L.A. still drafted a handful of players who went on to become key components to the 2019 roster.

L.A.'s first selection came at No. 61, taking S Taylor Rapp out of Washington. Rapp went on to be an integral part of L.A.'s defense, finishing his rookie season with the third-most tackles by any player in their first professional campaign.

Of L.A.'s ensuing selections, T David Edwards and T Bobby Evans saw the most time in 2019, with each rookie stepping in to a starting role on the offensive line during the season. Both Edwards and Evans were key pieces on an offensive line that allowed the fewest sacks in the league during the 2019 campaign.

### Rams Draft Day Media Portal



In an effort to disseminate information in an efficient as possible manner, the Rams Communications team, in partnership with 1st Round Media Group have launched a draft portal on the team's media website.

In lieu of hosting media at the Rams facility, all documents that have typically been distributed in person, will be uploaded as soon as possible to the media portal. This includes, draft pick bios, a link to archived zoom availability with the draft pick and other relevant information to help your digital coverage of the NFL Draft.

Additionally, an invite only zoom press conference room has been set up for each day of the draft. The room will open at the beginning of each day of the draft, once a selection has been made, media can log into the corresponding draft day Zoom chat. The communications department will look to secure drafted players within 15 minutes of being picked. Likewise, media should log into Zoom immediately following the conclusion of each draft day for Snead and McVay's end-of-day news conferences.

Please remember to create and use a zoom account with your name to avoid being removed from a press conference, as it's an invite only media availability.

## Rams Roster By College Conference

## Rams' Rookie Honor Roll



## No first, and 10

A total of six Rams players have been awarded either the NFL's Offensive or Defensive Rookie of the Year award and each of the Rams' recipients were drafted in the first round.

In 1971, LB Isiah Robertson became the first Rams rookie in franchise history to win Defensive Rookie of the Year, and the fifth NFL player overall. Los Angeles' ensuing three winners came on the offensive side of the ball and featured Hall of Fame running backs Eric Dickerson (1983) and Jerome Bettis (1993).

With the 13th overall pick in 2014 and the 10th overall pick in 2015, the Rams secured back-to-back Rookie of the Year winners in DT Aaron Donald and RB Todd Gurley, respectively. Los Angeles is the first NFL team to garner consecutive Rookie of the Years since the Carolina Panthers did so in 2011-12 (QB Cam Newton, 2011 OROY and LB Luke Kuechly, 2012 DROY).

The 2020 NFL Draft marks the 84th draft for the Rams franchise dating back to the second-ever NFL draft in 1937. The team has not had a first-round selection in only 10 of those drafts, the last time the team selected in the first round was in 2016.

The season following a draft in which the team didn't make a selection in the first round, the Rams went on to win at least 10 games on six different occasions (1967, 1968, 1973, 1984, 2017, 2018), including four seasons where the Rams claimed the NFC West title (1967, 1973, 2017, 2018).

Additionally, five of the franchise's 21 ties have come the season following a draft that the Rams didn't make a first-round selection, including two ties during the 1967 season, one of three seasons that featured two games ending in a draw.

In total, the Rams are 94-48-5 (.636) all-time the season after not selecting in the first round of that year's draft.



## Rams' Draft Picks By School



Since 1937, the Rams have drafted players from 296 different schools. The Rams have selected 15 or more players from 22 different schools, with Pac-12 schools UCLA, Washington and USC leading the way. UCLA ranks first among Rams' draft choices, providing the team with 44 selections all-time. After two draft picks a season ago from Washington, the Huskies are second on the list with 40 picks.

## Draft Day in LA



After relocating from Cleveland to L.A. and from St. Louis to L.A., the 1946 NFL Draft and the 2016 NFL Draft each proved to be memorable ones.

The Rams made major moves in each of their two drafts following the franchise relocating to the City of Angels.

The 1946 NFL Draft included historical milestone selections of halfback Kenny Washington and end Woody Strode, the first African-American players in the modern NFL, one year before Jackie Robinson broke the baseball color barrier with the Brooklyn Dodgers.

In the 2016 NFL Draft, the Rams made a blockbuster trade to acquire the No. 1 overall pick to select QB Jared Goff, who went on to earn consecutive Pro Bowls following the 2017 and 2018 seasons.

The Rams' draft classes boast nine Hall of Famers in QB Norm Van Brocklin (1949), DE Andy Robustelli (1951), LB Les Richter (1954), DE Deacon Jones (1961), DT Merlin Olsen (1962), G Tom Mack (1966), DE Jack Youngblood (1971), T Jackie Slater (1976), RB Eric Dickerson (1983) and T Orlando Pace (1997).

## Under the Radar

An undrafted free agent (UDFA) is a player that is eligible for the NFL Draft but was not selected. Following the completion of the NFL Draft, these players can negotiate and sign with any team. There are currently 11 players on Los Angeles' roster that joined the franchise as UDFA, 10 of which signed with GM Les Snead orchestrating the Rams personnel decisions.

Two Rams in P Johnny Hekker and LS Jake McQuaide that originally joined the franchise as UDFA were rewarded for their efforts and were named to the 2017 and 2018 NFL Pro Bowls. It was Hekker's fourth time participating in the Pro Bowl, while McQuaide made his second-straight appearance following the 2018 season.

## 2020 NFL Draft



The NFL announced that the 2020 NFL Draft will serve as a three-day virtual fundraiser benefitting six charities – selected by the NFL Foundation – that are battling the spread of COVID-19 and delivering relief to millions in need.

Funds will help support six national nonprofits and their respective COVID-19 relief efforts including: American Red Cross, CDC Foundation's All of Us, Feeding America's COVID-19 Response Fund, Meals on Wheels COVID-19 Response Fund, Salvation Army, and United Way's COVID-19 Community Response and Recovery Fund.

"As we face this global health crisis together, we are filled with gratitude for the extraordinary work of first responders, healthcare workers and many others who are helping those in need," said NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell. "The Draft-A-Thon will deliver much-needed funding to many who are suffering as well as those on the front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic. Conducting this event virtually, and taking all necessary precautions while doing so, underscores the importance of staying home and staying strong during this unprecedented moment in our history."

Fans and other supporters can donate through one central fund throughout the three days, which will add to the more than \$43 million already donated by the collective NFL family. More details about the Draft-A-Thon and how to donate will be announced in the coming days.


